NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything in the Order of 1909, the Order of 1910, or the Order of 1911, the provisions of the Order of 1909 shall operate and shall have effect until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH JULY 1911.)

EAST SUSSEX AND KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in, or moved into or out of, the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Offences.

3.—(1) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the East SUSSEX AND KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Modification of former Orders.

1. The Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3), as modified by subsequent Order, is hereby further modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement within Scheduled District No. 11. for certain purposes.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal should be permitted to be moved within Scheduled District No. II as

often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms in Scheduled District No. II, the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under the preceding paragraph shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same with the words "Occupation Licence." Such a Licence shall be retained by the person to whom it is granted, and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

Markets, &c., of Animals for Immediate Slaughter in Scheduled District No. III.

3.—(1.) A market or sale may be held on any premises situate in Scheduled District No. III if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and

examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) Movement of animals to a market or sale authorised under this Order shall be lawful subject to the same conditions as under the Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3) regulate move-

ment to a slaughterhouse.

(4.) Animals may be moved from a market or sale authorised under this Order only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or sale is held, and only to a slaughterhouse situate in Scheduled District No. III. Before the movement is commenced the animals shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner in the manner prescribed by Article 5 (2) of the Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).

#### Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, nineteen hundred and eleven.

# Short Title, &c.

5. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 (No. 3) and (No. 4).
