

INCOME TAX.

Whereas it has become necessary to renew the list of persons to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners appointed to act in the division of Black Torrington West, in the county of Devon, as Commissioners for general purposes of the Acts of Parliament for granting to His Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices: Now we, two of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in that behalf, do hereby convene a meeting of the Land Tax Commissioners for the county aforesaid being respectively qualified to act as such Commissioners, to be holden at the Tax Room, Court House, Holsworthy, Devon, on Wednesday, the 2nd day of August, 1911, at 11.30 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to be Commissioners to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax for the division of Black Torrington West aforesaid.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 21st July, 1911.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient

(1) that Wickhambrook Sub-District of Risbridge Registration District should be abolished and its constituent civil parishes allotted to the other Sub-Districts of that Registration District in the following manner: (a) Cowlinge, Great Bradley, Great Thurlow, Little Bradley, and Little Thurlow to Haverhill Sub-District; and (b) Denston, Stansfield, Stradishall, and Wickhambrook to Clare Sub-District; and

(2) that Barnardiston and Monks Risbridge civil parishes should be transferred from Haverhill Sub-District to Clare Sub-District;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

DURHAM RURAL DISTRICT.

THE Durham Rural District Council hereby give notice, that the Local Government Board, by an Order dated 3rd July, 1911, declared that on and after the 14th day of August, 1911, (a) sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 44, 45, 46 and 49, comprised in Part III; and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66 and 67, comprised in Part IV of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the several contributory places within the district subject to the conditions and adaptations set out in the Schedule to the Order; and (b) that sections 39, 40, 41 and 42, comprised in Part III of the said Act, shall be in force in the contributory places of Bearpark, Belmont, Brancepeth, Broom, Cassop-cum-Quarrington, Coxhoe, Framwellgate Moor, Nevilles Cross, Saint Oswald, Shadforth, Sherburn, Sherburn Hospital, Shincliffe, and Sunderland Bridge, within the district.
