## TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M.  
Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will  
be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the  
Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 8th instant,  
at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued

under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic.,  
cap. 6, to the amount of £3,600,000 in replace-  
ment of Bills falling due on the 11th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000,  
£5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the  
11th August, 1911, and will be payable at six  
months after date, viz.:—on the 11th Feb-  
ruary, 1912.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount  
per cent. which will be given for the amounts  
applied for, and the Tenders of private indi-  
viduals must be made through a London  
Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the  
Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted  
will be informed of the same on Wednesday,  
the 9th instant, and payment in full of the  
amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made  
to the Bank of England not later than three  
o'clock on Friday, the 11th August, 1911.

Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any  
Tenders.
