ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST JULY 1911.)

East Sussex and Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The East Sussex and Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 2) (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order") is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement into or within Scheduled District No. II for Immediate Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from Scheduled District No. III to a slaughterhouse in Scheduled District No. II, or may be moved within Scheduled District No. II to a slaughterhouse within such District, with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, if the animal is, before the movement is commenced, marked by and at the expense of the owner in the manner described in Article 7 (1.) of the principal Order.

Movement within Scheduled District No. III for certain purposes.

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient—

(i.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved within Scheduled District No. III for dipping purposes; or

(ii.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved within Scheduled District No. III as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in Scheduled District No. III;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under the preceding paragraph (ii.) shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same with the words "Occupation Licence." Such a Licence shall be retained by the person to whom it is granted, and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of August, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title, &c.

5. This Order may be cited as the East Sussex and Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Order mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.
