The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 19th July, from His Majesty's Representative on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the

following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Board of Health held on the 18th July:—

1. The measures in force against Zunguldak (medical visit and disinfection, the delay to the ship not to exceed 24 hours) are extended to Kozlou and Kelimli, which immediately adjoin Zunguldak.

2. A medical visit is imposed against Otchakof, where cholera is reported to have appeared.

3. The measures in force against Basra are reduced to 24 hours' observation and disinfection.

4. A medical visit is reimposed against Adalia, where another case of suspected plague is reported.

5. The measures in force against Samsoun are reduced to medical visit. Only one fresh case of cholera occurred here last week.

6. Five days' quarantine (the days of the voyage included) and disinfection are imposed on arrivals from Palermo and Salerno, in both of which cholera is epidemic.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 21st July, from His Majesty's Representative on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Board of Health, held on the 20th July:—

1. In view of the considerable increase in the number of cholera cases in Constantinople in the last few days, the measures in force against this port are raised to medical visit and disinfection, the delay to the ship not to exceed 24 hours. Ships leaving for the Marmara will do these measures at Touzla, those for the Black Sea at Kavak or Sinope.

2. Some further cases of cholera having occurred at Samsoun, arrivals from that port are again subjected to a quarantine of 24 hours with disinfection, in addition to a medical visit at departure from Samsoun.

3. A medical visit is imposed against Nicolaieff, where the presence of cholera is reported.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

Order of the Board of Trade under
Section 5 (2).

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, it is amongst other things provided as follows:—

(1) Trade Boards shall, subject to the provisions of this Section, fix minimum rates of wages for time-work for their trades (in this Act referred to as minimum time-rates) and may also fix general minimum rates of wages for piece-work for their trades (in this Act referred to as general minimum piece-rates) and those rates of wages (whether time or piece-rates) may be fixed so as to apply universally to the trade, or so as to apply to any special process in the work of the trade, or to any special class of workers in the trade, or to any special area.

(2) Before fixing any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate, the Trade Board shall give notice of the rate which they propose to fix and consider any objections to the rate which may be lodged with them within three months.

(3) The Trade Board shall give notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them.

AND WHEREAS by Section 5 of the said Act it is amongst other things provided:—

(1) Until a minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by a Trade Board has been made obligatory by order of the Board of Trade under this Section, the operation of the rate shall be limited as in this Act provided.

(2) Upon the expiration of six months from the date on which a Trade Board have given notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them, the Board of Trade shall make an order (in this Act referred to as an obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory in cases in which it is applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed, unless they are of opinion that the circumstances are such as to

make it premature or otherwise undesirable to make an obligatory order, and in that case they shall make an order suspending the obligatory operation of the rate (in this Act referred to as an order of suspension).

1. The provisions of the Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 (Nos. 3, 4, 5, and 6), dated the tenth, fourteenth, twentieth, and twenty-fifth days of July, nineteen hundred and eleven, respec-

tively, shall cease to operate with respect to the Scheduled Districts Nos. II and III.

Commencement.

CARDIFF (LECKWITH ROAD) ALLOT-
MENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER)
ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the city of Cardiff to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said city and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

*Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to
Premises to which this Order applies.*

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a float, cart or van to a slaughter-house situate in the city of Cardiff, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that city, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down

the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

*Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for
Conveyance of Swine.*

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the float, cart or van as follows:

(i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

*Movement of Swine to Premises to which this
Order applies.*

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Cardiff, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Swine may also be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if such movement is authorised by a licence (Form A) granted under and in accordance with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

(3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(4.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(5.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(7.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of August, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the **CARDIFF (LECKWITH ROAD) ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1911.**

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Kingsbury (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority") have, in pursuance of section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain sections of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the Urban District of Kingsbury (hereinafter referred to as "the District");

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement:

NOW, THEREFORE, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation,—

Sections 15, 16, 17, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, and 33, comprised in Part II;

Sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, and 49, comprised in Part III;

Sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, and 67, comprised in Part IV; and

Section 95, comprised in Part X of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the District.

(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order is one of the sections by subdivision (1) of this Article described as comprised in Part II or Part III and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the District subject to the following conditions and adaptations, that is to say,—

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct, the said section, in its application to the District and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that

section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

ARTICLE II.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, the Local Act cited in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule, be no longer in force in that District.

(2) Where an enactment in a Local Act, other than the enactment specified in the Second Schedule to this Order, contains provisions which alter, amend, apply, or otherwise relate to the enactment so specified, those provisions shall, to the extent to which they are inconsistent with any section to which Article I of this Order applies, be no longer in force in the District.

ARTICLE III.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the District, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE IV.—This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Section Thirty-eight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

THAMES CONSERVANCY.

PROPOSED BYE-LAWS for registering and licensing vessels on the River Thames and appointing lock tolls and for other purposes.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-Laws:—

BYE-LAWS for Registering and Licensing Vessels on the River Thames and appointing Lock Tolls and for other purposes made by the Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Act 1894 the Port of London Act 1908 and the Thames Conservancy (Appointments and Tolls) Provisional Order Act 1910:—

Short Title and Commencement of Operation of Bye-laws.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Thames Conservancy (Registration and Tolls) Bye-laws 1911" and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Board of Trade.

Repeal.

2. Bye-laws 83 to 97 (both inclusive) of the Thames Bye-laws 1898 are hereby repealed.

PRELIMINARY.

Interpretation Clause.

3. In these Bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction viz.:—

The expression "the Act of 1894" means the Thames Conservancy Act 1894.

The expression "the Order of 1910" means the Thames Conservancy (Appointments and Tolls) Order 1910 confirmed by the Thames Conservancy (Appointments and Tolls) Provisional Order Act 1910.

The expression "the Conservators" means the Conservators of the River Thames.

The expression "the Thames" or "the river" means and includes so much of the Rivers Thames and Isis respectively as are between the town of Cricklade in the county of Wilts and an imaginary straight line drawn from high-water mark on the bank of the River Thames at the boundary line between the parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the county of Middlesex to high-water mark on the Surrey bank of the river immediately opposite the last hereinbefore

mentioned point and so much of the River Kennet as is between the common landing-place at Reading in the county of Berks and the River Thames and all locks cuts and works within the said portions of rivers Provided that no dock lock canal or cut existing at the passing of the Act of 1894 and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority and no bridge over the River Thames or the River Kennet belonging to or vested in any County Council or municipal authority or to or in any railway company or to or in any other company body or person other than the Conservators shall be deemed to form part of the Thames.

The word "person" includes a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

The word "horse" includes all draught animals.

The word "vessel" includes any ship lighter keel barge launch houseboat pleasure or other boat randan wherry skiff dingey shallop punt canoe yacht raft float of timber or craft whatever however navigated.

The expression "steam launch" includes any vessel propelled by steam electricity or other mechanical power not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and not being certified by the Board of Trade as a passenger steamer to carry two hundred or more passengers.

The expression "petrol motor launch" means a "steam launch" in which motive power is supplied by petroleum to which the Petroleum Acts 1871-1879 apply whether such petroleum is used in an internal combustion engine or for the generation of steam or otherwise.

The expression "houseboat" includes any pleasure boat on the Thames above Teddington Lock not being a steam launch and which is decked or otherwise structurally covered in and which is or is capable of being used as a place of habitation (whether by day and night or the one or the other) or as a place for accommodating or receiving persons for purposes of shelter recreation entertainment or refreshment or of witnessing regattas or other events or as club premises or as offices or as a kitchen pantry or store place.

The expression "dismantled houseboat" means a houseboat not fitted or furnished with furniture or other articles or things usual necessary or proper for the user thereof as a houseboat and not being so used.

The expression "pleasure boat" includes any ship launch houseboat boat randan wherry skiff dingey shallop punt canoe or yacht however navigated not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and not being certified by the Board of Trade as a passenger steamer to carry two hundred or more passengers.

The expression "pleasure boat for hire" means any pleasure boat usually let for hire or used for any purpose of profit except such pleasure boats as are let for hire for a period of not less than four weeks continuously to one and the same person.

The expression "private pleasure boat" means any pleasure boat other than a pleasure boat for hire.

The expression "permission of the Con-

servators" or "consent of the Conservators" means permission or consent of the Conservators in writing signed by the Secretary.

The words "in writing" applied to any document include documents wholly printed or wholly written or partly printed and partly written and printed includes any mechanical mode of reproduction.

The expression "the Secretary" means the person for the time being acting as Secretary to the Conservators.

The word "officer" means any officer of the Conservators or any person employed by them to carry out the provisions of these Bye-laws.

The words "the register" mean the register kept by the Conservators in pursuance of Sections 138 139 and 140 of the Act of 1894.

The word "registered" when used in relation to any name number or other like particulars means such name number or other like particulars appearing for the time being in the register and not cancelled.

The expression "the offices of the Conservators" means the premises 2 and 3 Norfolk Street Strand London W.C. or other the head offices for the time being of the Conservators.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females and words in the singular shall include the plural and words in the plural shall include the singular.

REGISTRATION.

Pleasure Boats not to be used unless registered and marked.

4. (1) Every pleasure boat (save as herein-after mentioned) used or intended to be used upon the Thames above Teddington Lock shall be registered and marked as in these Bye-laws provided.

(2) No person shall use or assist or be concerned in using or cause or suffer to be used upon the river above Teddington Lock any such pleasure boat unless a houseboat certificate or a boat certificate as the case may be relating to such pleasure boat be then in force nor unless such boat shall be marked as in these Bye-laws provided.

(3) No person shall hire or let for hire or hold out or offer for hiring or suffer or permit to be let for hire any such pleasure boat to be used upon the river above Teddington Lock or ply for hire with any such pleasure boat upon the river above the said Lock unless a houseboat certificate or a boat certificate as the case may be relating to such pleasure boat be then in force nor unless such boat shall be marked as in these Bye-laws provided.

(4) This Bye-law shall not apply to steam launches required to be registered under the Act of 1894 nor to any vessel required to be registered under the Thames Fishery Bye-laws 1893.

Registration of Houseboats.

5. (1) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of a houseboat shall deliver to the Conservators in writing according to the form contained in Schedule A hereto the particulars following that is to say:—

(a) The name of such houseboat.

(b) The length and dimensions of such houseboat.

(c) Whether such houseboat is intended to be used for ordinary purposes or as a dis-

mantled houseboat or to be kept stationary throughout the year and used only for a dressing place or store room for boats gear or otherwise in connection with boating and where the same is stationed and can be inspected by an officer.

(d) The method of disposal of the sewage and other refuse in such houseboat.

(e) The name and address of the owner of such houseboat.

(2) At the time of applying for such registration and thereafter on the 1st day of January in every year the owner of the houseboat shall pay to the Conservators at their offices the sums specified in the third part of the Schedule to the order of 1910 that is to say:—

For every houseboat (other than a dismantled houseboat):—

	Per annum.
Not exceeding 30 feet in length	£5
Exceeding 30 feet in length but not exceeding 35 feet	£6
Exceeding 35 feet	£6
and in addition thereto	£1 for every 5 feet or fraction of 5 feet by which the same shall exceed the length of 35 feet.
For every dismantled houseboat	£1 ls.

Provided that in the case of every houseboat kept stationary throughout the year and used only for a dressing place or store room for boats gear or otherwise in connection with boating the annual sum payable for the registration thereof shall be such reduced payment not being less than one guinea as the Conservators may in their discretion in each case determine.

Provided also that if in any year the owner of a dismantled houseboat or of a houseboat kept stationary throughout the year and used for the purposes hereinbefore specified in respect of which there shall have been duly paid to the Conservators in that year the sum of one guinea or the reduced sum due under these Bye-laws in respect thereof as the case may be shall thereafter in the same year become liable to pay the full fee in respect thereof as a houseboat the owner shall be entitled to deduct from the amount of such full fee the said sum so paid as aforesaid.

(3) The Conservators may if they shall think fit before complying with any application for registration of a houseboat require such houseboat to be measured by an officer and the owner thereof shall afford such officer all reasonable facilities for making such measurement.

(4) Upon registration a number shall be assigned by the Conservators to each houseboat and such number together with the said particulars hereinbefore mentioned shall be entered in the register.

(5) Upon registration of a houseboat and upon the renewal of every houseboat certificate the Conservators shall grant to the owner of such houseboat a certificate of registration (in these Bye-laws referred to as a houseboat certificate) containing the name of such houseboat and the name and address of the owner the registered number and such other particulars as the Conservators shall think fit.

(6) Every houseboat certificate shall expire on the 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(7) Every houseboat used upon the Thames above Teddington Lock shall have legibly and conspicuously painted upon each side thereof either the registered number or the registered

name thereof subject to such conditions as the Conservators may require.

(8) The Conservators may decline to register two or more houseboats in the same name or in one which is likely to deceive and in case of any dispute as to which houseboat shall bear the name the houseboat which has longest borne the name shall be the houseboat to be registered in such name and registration of the other houseboat shall be deferred until the owner thereof shall have furnished a name for it which can be properly registered.

Registration of Private Pleasure Boats.

6. (1) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of a private pleasure boat (other than a houseboat or steam launch) shall deliver to the Conservators in writing according to the form contained in Schedule B hereto the particulars following that is to say—

(a) The name and address of the owner thereof.

(b) The class to which such private pleasure boat belongs as for example skiff or sculling boat pair-oar four-oar eight-oar canoe punt gondola shallop or sailing boat or otherwise as the case may be.

(2) At the time of applying for such registration or for the renewal of a boat certificate in respect of any such private pleasure boat the owner of the boat shall pay to the Conservators the sum of five shillings for every such boat.

(3) Upon registration a number shall be assigned by the Conservators to each boat and such number together with the said particulars hereinbefore mentioned shall be entered in the register.

(4) (a) Upon registration of every such private pleasure boat and upon the renewal of every boat certificate in respect of any such boat the Conservators shall grant to the owner of such boat a certificate of registration (in these Bye-laws referred to as a boat certificate) containing the name and address of the owner the registered number and such other particulars as the Conservators shall think fit.

(b) Upon registration of every such boat the Conservators shall also provide the owner thereof with a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) bearing the registered number of such boat such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and the owner of such boat shall place affix or keep such plate in a conspicuous position inside such boat and shall not place affix or keep such plate in or about any other boat than that in respect of which such plate shall have been provided.

(5.) The boat certificate in respect of every such private pleasure boat shall expire on the third 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

Registration of Pleasure Boats for Hire.

7. (1) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of a pleasure boat for hire (other than a houseboat or steam launch) shall deliver to the Conservators in writing according to the form contained in Schedule C hereto the particulars following that is to say:—

(a) The name and address of the owner thereof.

(b) The class to which such boat belongs as for example skiff or sculling boat pair-oar

four-oar eight-oar canoe punt gondola shallop or sailing boat or otherwise as the case may be.

(2) At the time of applying for such registration or for the renewal of a boat certificate in respect of any such pleasure boat for hire the owner of the boat shall pay to the Conservator the sum of two shillings and sixpence for every such boat.

(3) Upon registration a number (to be called the owner's number) shall be assigned by the Conservators to the owner of every such boat and a further number (to be called the boat's number) shall be assigned to every such boat and the same owner's number shall be assigned in respect of every such boat belonging to the same owner and the owner's number the boat's number and the said particulars hereinbefore mentioned shall be entered in the register.

(4) (a) Upon registration of every such pleasure boat for hire and upon the renewal of every boat certificate in respect of any such boat the Conservators shall grant to the owner of such boat a certificate of registration (in these bye-laws referred to as a boat certificate) containing the name and address of the owner the owner's number the boat's number and such other particulars as the Conservators think fit.

(b) Upon registration of every such boat the Conservators shall also provide the owner thereof with a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) bearing the owner's number and the boat's number of such boat such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and the owner of such boat shall place affix or keep or cause to be placed affixed or kept such plate in a conspicuous position inside such boat and shall not place affix or keep such plate in or about any other boat than that in respect of which such plate shall have been provided.

(5) The boat certificate in respect of every such pleasure boat for hire shall expire on the third 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(6) The owner of every pleasure boat for hire (other than a houseboat or steam launch) shall on the same being let for hire for a period of not less than four weeks continuously to one and the same person forthwith give to the Conservators notice thereof in writing together with the registered number of the boat and the full name and address of the person to whom and the period in respect of which the boat shall have been so let.

(7) Within one month after the expiration of a boat certificate unless the same shall have been renewed the owner of the boat shall on demand by the Conservators return to the Conservators at their offices any plate provided by them under these bye-laws in respect of such boat.

Registration of Club Colours.

8. (1) The members of any rowing club punting club or canoe club may apply to the Conservators to register the club colours badge or mark as the distinctive mark of row-boats punts or canoes owned by such club or by the members thereof and by these Bye-laws required to be registered.

(2) Every such application shall be in writ-

ing and signed by the Secretary of such club or other authorised person and shall specify the particulars following that is to say:—

(a) The name and headquarters of the Club.

(b) The name and address of every member of the Club.

(c) The name and description of every row boat punt or canoe used upon the Thames and at the time of such application owned by the Club or by any member thereof together with the full name and address of the owner of such row-boat punt or canoe.

(d) The colours badge or mark used by the Club and where proposed to be painted or placed on the row-boats punts or canoes or on the oars sculls poles or paddles thereof.

(3) The Conservators may in their absolute discretion refuse any such application whether in respect of any particular club colours badge or mark or in respect of any club generally or they may register the same subject to such conditions as they may think fit.

(4) The Conservators may at any time if they shall think fit to do so cancel any such registration.

(5) Every such registration shall if not previously cancelled expire on the third 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(7) The owner of every such row-boat punt or canoe used upon the Thames by such club or by any member thereof shall cause such row-boat punt or canoe as the case may be to be registered under these Bye-laws as a private pleasure boat and shall pay the fee of 5s. in respect thereof and in the event of such owner desiring to have painted or placed the registered colours badge or mark of the club he shall (in lieu of other requirements of these Bye-laws in respect of marking private pleasure boats) comply with the following requirements that is to say:—Such row-boat punt or canoe shall have painted or placed thereon in a manner approved by the Conservators and also if required by the Conservators on the oars sculls poles or paddles thereof the registered colours badge or mark of the club and there shall also be fixed in a conspicuous place inside or outside such row-boat punt or canoe a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and to be furnished by the Conservators to the secretary of such club or to any member thereof as the case may be on payment of the additional sum of 1s. in respect of every such plate. Provided always that if and whenever any such row-boat punt or canoe shall cease to be owned by such club or any member thereof the secretary of such club or such member thereof as the case may be shall forthwith return such plate to the Conservators at their offices and shall also remove from such row-boat punt or canoe and from the oars sculls poles or paddles thereof the registered colours badge or mark of the club and such row-boat punt or canoe shall thereupon be marked in accordance with such of the provisions of these Bye-laws as may be applicable thereto.

Registration of Club Burgee.

10. (1) The members of any sailing club may apply to the Conservators to register a

burgee or sailing club ensign as the distinctive mark of sailing boats owned by such club or by the members thereof and by these Bye-laws required to be registered.

(2) Every such application shall be in writing and signed by the secretary of such club or other authorised person and shall specify the particulars following that is to say:—

(a) The name and headquarters of the club.

(b) The name and address of every member of the club.

(c) The name and description of every sailing boat used upon the Thames and at the time of such application owned by the club or by any member thereof together with the full name and address of the owner of every such sailing boat.

(d) The burgee or sailing club ensign used by the club.

(3) The Conservators may in their absolute discretion refuse any such application whether in respect of any particular burgee or sailing club ensign or in respect of any club generally or they may register the same subject to such conditions as they may think fit.

(4) The Conservators may at any time if they shall think fit to do so cancel any such registration.

(5) Every such registration shall if not previously cancelled expire on the third 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(6) The owner of every such sailing boat used upon the Thames by such club or by any member thereof shall cause such sailing boat to be registered under these Bye-laws as a private pleasure boat and shall pay the fee of 5s. in respect thereof and in the event of such owner desiring to have such sailing boat distinguished by flying the registered burgee or sailing club ensign of the club he shall (in lieu of other requirements of these Bye-laws in respect of marking private pleasure boats) comply with the following requirements that is to say:—Such sailing boat shall be distinguished by flying the registered burgee or sailing club ensign of the club and there shall also be fixed in a conspicuous place inside or outside such sailing boat a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and to be furnished by the Conservators to the secretary of such club or to any member thereof as the case may be on payment of the additional sum of 1s. in respect of every such plate. Provided always that if and whenever any such sailing boat shall cease to be owned by such club or by any member thereof the secretary of such club or such member as the case may be shall forthwith return such plate to the Conservators at their offices and the owner of such sailing boat shall not thereafter fly the registered burgee or sailing club ensign of the club but such sailing boat shall thereupon be marked in accordance with such of the provisions of these Bye-laws as may be applicable thereto.

Licences for Ferry Boats.

11. (1) No person shall use any boat punt or other vessel on the Thames above Teddington Lock as a Ferry for hire for the convey-

ance of a greater number of persons at any one time than the number which such vessel is licensed to carry under this Bye-law.

(2) Every person applying to the Conservators for a license in respect of a vessel to be used as a Ferry shall deliver to the Conservators in writing according to the form contained in Schedule D hereto the particulars following that is to say:—

(a) The length and extreme breadth of such vessel.

(b) The place where the vessel is proposed to be used as a Ferry and where the same may be inspected as hereinafter provided.

(c) The name and address of the owner of such vessel.

(d) The maximum number of persons proposed to be conveyed upon such vessel at any one time.

(3) The Conservators may grant to the person applying for the same a license and such license shall state the number of persons which such vessel is licensed to carry at any one time together with the name and address of the owner thereof and the place where such vessel is to be used as a Ferry.

(4) The Conservators shall retain a duplicate of such license to be entered in a book kept by them for that purpose and every person shall be entitled during office hours to inspect such book free of charge.

(5) The owner of such vessel shall cause to be kept in a conspicuous place in or about the same a plate which shall be furnished by and shall remain the property of the Conservators bearing a number to be called the owner's number and also a number being the number of persons which such vessel is licensed to carry at any one time such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and such plate shall be returned to the Conservators at their offices by such owner within one month after the expiration of the license unless the same shall have been renewed.

(6) A license granted under this Bye-law shall expire on the 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(7) The Conservators may if they shall think fit before complying with any application for a license under this Bye-law require such vessel to be inspected by an officer and the owner of such vessel shall afford such officer all reasonable facilities for making such inspection.

Renewal of Registration.

12. The owner of any pleasure boat (other than a steam launch) or the members of any rowing club punting club canoe club or sailing club or the owner of any vessel used as a ferry applying to the Conservators for renewal of a houseboat certificate or boat certificate or for renewal of the registration of club colours or club burgee or sailing club ensign or for renewal of a license for a ferry boat shall furnish the same information and make the same payments as are hereinbefore prescribed with reference to the first registration or certificate for a pleasure boat or to the first registration of club colours or club burgee or to the first granting of a license for a ferry boat as the

case may be and every such renewed registration and certificate for a pleasure boat and renewed registration of club colours or club burgee and renewed license for a ferry boat as the case may be shall if not previously cancelled have effect for such period as may be in accordance with the provisions of these Bye-laws and no longer but may again be renewed in like manner.

Ownership and Transfer of Ownership.

13. (1) From and after the date of the original registration of any pleasure boat other than a steam launch in respect of which a houseboat certificate or boat certificate is in force the registered owner of such pleasure boat shall (subject as hereafter in this Bye-law provided) for all purposes of the Act of 1894 the Order of 1910 and of these Bye-laws and of all other Bye-laws of the Conservators for the time being in force be deemed to be the owner of such pleasure boat.

(2) (a) Upon every transfer of the ownership of a pleasure boat registered under these Bye-laws in respect of which a houseboat certificate or a boat certificate as the case may be is in force the transferor shall and the transferee may forthwith give to the Conservators notice in writing of such transfer and the Conservators shall in either case thereupon without charge (except the payment of the balance of any registration fee payable in consequence of such transfer) grant to such transferee a fresh certificate for the period for which the existing certificate shall be unexpired and shall cause his name and address to be inserted in the register in the place of those of the transferor and until such notice shall have been given the transferor shall be deemed to be the owner of such pleasure boat.

(b) If and whenever a pleasure boat for hire (other than a steam launch or houseboat) shall become a private pleasure boat or if and whenever a private pleasure boat (other than a steam launch or houseboat) shall become a pleasure boat for hire there shall be deemed to be a transfer of ownership within the meaning of this Bye-law.

(3) Upon every such transfer of ownership the transferor shall return to the Conservators at their offices the certificate for the time being in force in respect of such pleasure boat and in addition, in the case of such transfer of ownership as is mentioned in paragraph (2) (b) hereof, the plate issued in respect of such pleasure boat.

(4) Immediately upon the granting of a fresh certificate the certificate previously in force in respect of the same pleasure boat shall become void.

(5) From and after the granting of a fresh certificate the person to whom the same is granted shall have the pleasure boat in respect of which the same is granted marked in accordance with such of the provisions of these Bye-laws as may be applicable thereto.

Alternate Marking.

14. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the Conservators may if in the case of any particular pleasure boat they shall think fit by writing under the hand of their Secretary sanction the marking of any such

boat in some manner different from that required under the foregoing Bye-laws and in such case such boat shall be marked accordingly.

Duplicate Certificates, etc.

15. The Conservators may on application made to them in that behalf furnish to the registered owner of any pleasure boat a duplicate certificate and/or a duplicate plate in the place of a lost certificate and/or plate as the case may be on his giving to the Conservators such indemnity in writing in that behalf as they may deem necessary and on his paying to them the sum of 1s. in respect of each such duplicate certificate and/or plate.

Marks to be Visible.

16. (1) All names numbers or other distinctive marks or things by these Bye-laws required to be placed or kept in upon or about any pleasure boat shall be placed in a conspicuous position and if outside the boat above the water line and shall be kept and maintained by the respective owners of every such boat in a cleanly and plainly distinguishable condition and to the satisfaction of the Conservators or their officers.

(2) No person shall knowingly conceal or cause or suffer to be concealed any name number or other distinctive mark or thing by these Bye-laws required to be kept in upon or about any pleasure boat.

(3) No person shall display or cause or suffer to be displayed upon or about any pleasure boat by these Bye-laws required to be marked any number club colours badge mark club burgee or ensign whether by way of advertisement advertising notice or otherwise other than is required by these Bye-laws.

(4) The owner of every pleasure boat in respect of which a certificate of registration is in force and the owner of every licensed ferry boat shall on demand in the case of a pleasure boat either produce the certificate or show the registration plate or owner's or vessel's number club colours burgee ensign badge mark or name as the case may be and in the case of a ferry boat produce the licence to any officer of the Conservators to any Proctor of the University of Oxford any Marshal or officer acting under such Proctor any officer or constable of the Metropolitan Police and to any police officer or constable acting for any of the counties of Surrey Berks Wilts Gloucester Oxon Buckingham or Middlesex or the City of Oxford or any Borough the police jurisdiction of which extends to any place upon the river.

Power to Inspect Boat Yards, etc.

17. Any officer on producing if required so to do a certificate of his personal authority signed by the Secretary may at all reasonable hours enter any yards sheds or other like premises adjoining or near to the river for the purpose of inspecting any pleasure boat in order to ascertain whether the same is or ought to be registered and if so the class or description of any such pleasure boat and for measuring the same and for the like purpose may board and inspect any houseboat lying in the river and no person shall obstruct or hinder any

such officer in the exercise of the powers conferred by this Bye-law.

TOLLS.

Lock Tolls for Pleasure Boats and Passenger Steamers.

18. (1) Persons in charge of pleasure boats and passenger steamers passing through by or over any of the locks on the Thames shall pay to the Lock Keepers or other persons authorised to receive tolls the following sums that is to say:—

(2) Every vessel carried in or upon another vessel through by or over any lock will be charged as if separately navigated through by or over such lock to the extent of one-third of the above tolls.

(3) (a) In lieu of the above tolls row-boats steam-launches and passenger steamers shall on payment to the Conservators of the under-mentioned annual sums and in consideration of such payment be entitled to pass the several locks free of such tolls until the 31st day of December next following the date of such payment:—

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(b) On payment to the Conservators of the above-mentioned annual sums payable in respect of any pleasure boat or passenger steamer as the case may be there shall be appropriated to such vessel a number to be called the lock toll pass number and such number shall be entered in the register and there shall be furnished to the person making such payment a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) bearing the registered lock toll pass number such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and such plate shall be fastened in a conspicuous place upon the vessel in respect of which the same is issued and shall not be transferred therefrom to any other vessel.

Tolls for Ferries.

19. The following sums shall be paid to the Ferry-men or other authorised persons for the use of the Conservators' Ferry Boats above Teddington Lock for every time of passing namely:—

For every motor car (in addition to the toll on the occupants thereof) ...	6 <i>d.</i>
For every horse not engaged in towing taken across by ferry boat ...	3 <i>d.</i>

PENALTIES.

Penalty for breach of Bye-laws.

20. Any person who shall offend against any of these Bye-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount which said penalties shall be recoverable enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Act of 1894.
