TOLLS.

Lock Tolls for Pleasure Boats and Passenger Steamers.

18. (1) Persons in charge of pleasure boats and passenger steamers passing through by or over any of the locks on the Thames shall pay to the Lock Keepers or other persons authorised to receive tolls the following sums that is to say:—

The above charges to be in respect of one and the same pleasure boat or passenger steamer as the case may be passing once through by or over a lock and returning on the same day.

(2) Every vessel carried in or upon another vessel through by or over any lock will be charged as if separately navigated through by or over such lock to the extent of one-third of the above tolls.

(3) (a) In lieu of the above tolls row-boats steam-launches and passenger steamers shall on payment to the Conservators of the under-mentioned annual sums and in consideration of such payment be entitled to pass the several locks free of such tolls until the 31st day of December next following the date of such payment:—

(b) On payment to the Conservators of the above-mentioned annual sums payable in respect of any pleasure boat or passenger steamer as the case may be there shall be appropriated to such vessel a number to be called the lock toll pass number and such number shall be entered in the register and there shall be furnished to the person making such payment a plate (which shall remain the property of the Conservators) bearing the registered lock toll pass number such plate to be made in accordance with a pattern approved by the Conservators and such plate shall be fastened in a conspicuous place upon the vessel in respect of which the same is issued and shall not be transferred therefrom to any other vessel.

Tolls for Ferries.

19. The following sums shall be paid to the Ferry-men or other authorised persons for the use of the Conservators' Ferry Boats above Teddington Lock for every time of passing namely:—

For every motor car (in addition to the toll on the occupants thereof) ...	6 <i>d.</i>

PENALTIES.

Penalty for breach of Bye-laws.

20. Any person who shall offend against any of these Bye-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount which said penalties shall be recoverable enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Act of 1894.
