MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF DENBIGH.

Parish of Llansaintffraid.

To the County Council of Denbigh;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Denbigh having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a road situate in the parish of Llansaintffraid, within the county of Denbigh, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the road through the village of Llansaintffraid Glan Conway as extends from a point opposite the Rectory Gates to a point 25 yards south of the Britannia Inn.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
