

was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Batley.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Thomas, Batley, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Batley.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield, and to be restored to the parish of Batley, in the same county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Paul, Hanging Heaton, in the said county and diocese, upon the south, upon the west, and upon the north by the said parish of Batley, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Batley from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, at the junction of Wellington Street with Field Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Field Lane for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Talbot Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Talbot Street for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Taylor Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Taylor Street for a distance of four chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point

opposite to the wall forming the western boundary of the Methodist New Connection Chapel, and extending thence first northward to the said boundary wall and then first northward along such wall and then eastward along the wall forming the northern boundary of the said chapel for a distance in all of two chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall meets the wall at the western end of Queen Street, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Queen Street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Bradford Road, and continuing thence south-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of four chains and one-quarter or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Batley, from the said new parish of Saint Paul, Hanging Heaton."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively either signified their assent or offered no objection thereto.

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since a draft of the said scheme or representation was transmitted to the said patrons and incumbents.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
