

Pringle Street for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn.

"II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Higher Audley, Blackburn, upon the west by the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, crosses the middle of Pringle Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Pringle Street for a distance of fifteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Queen's Park Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Queen's Park Road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Higher Audley, Blackburn.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, crosses the middle of Queen's Park Road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Queen's Park Road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Queen's Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Queen's Road for a distance of five chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where such road crosses the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn.

"THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, and to be annexed to the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the south-west by the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, crosses the middle of Pringle Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Pringle Street, for a distance of fifteen yards or thereabouts, to its junction with Queen's Park Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Queen's Park Road

for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent or have offered no objection thereto.

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has now elapsed since drafts of the said scheme or representation were transmitted to the said patrons and incumbents.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Coppull, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.
