

the eastern boundary of Sir David's Park, and extending thence first southward to and then south-eastward along the said fence for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Romilly Road, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Romilly Road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Radnor Road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Radnor Road for a distance of sixteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Cowbridge Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Cowbridge Road for a distance of sixteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with York Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of York Street for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lansdowne Road, and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction as the southern portion of York Street and in a straight line for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to the middle of the level crossing where the footpath or roadway leading from Grosvenor Street to the Cardiff Sanatorium crosses such line of railway, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath or roadway (thereby passing under the Penarth Harbour and Dock Branch Line of the Taff Vale Railway) for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the entrance gate to the said Cardiff Sanatorium, and extending thence first north-eastward to the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the said Cardiff Sanatorium, and then first south-eastward and then south-westward, then again south-eastward and then again south-westward along the fences forming the north-eastern, the eastern and the south-eastern boundaries of the said Cardiff Sanatorium for a distance of twenty-eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the south-western end of the said fence forming the said south-eastern boundary, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the reën running into the Ely River, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said reën for a distance of one chain and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with the said River Ely upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Canton, from the said parish of Caerau.

"II. And also all that portion of the said parish of Llandaff which is bounded upon the south-west by the said parish of Caerau, upon the south-east and upon the east by the above described portion of the said new parish of Saint John, Canton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Canton, from the said parish of Llandaff, at the junction of Conybeare Road with Pensisli Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Pensisli Road for a distance of forty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ely Road, and extending thence first south-westward and

then south-eastward along the middle of Ely Road for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cowbridge Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Cowbridge Road for a distance of thirteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of Ely Bridge which carries Cowbridge Road across the Ely River upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llandaff from the said parish of Caerau."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.
