WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of August, 1911, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas in the regulations for the entry of Officers in Your Majesty's Naval Service it is provided that Officers required for the performance of Engineering duties shall in future be selected from Lieutenants who will form part of the Military Branch of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the allowances to be granted to Officers so selected for Engineering duties.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of the following allowances to Officers who in future qualify in Engineering when actually
