THE LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.
Southend-on-Sea Light Railways (Extensions) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorising the construction of a light railway in the borough of Southend-on-Sea, in the county of Essex, in extension of the light railways authorised by the Southend-on-Sea and District Light Railways Orders, 1899 to 1909, and amending those Orders, and for other purposes.

Any objections to the confirmation of the Order should be addressed to the Assistant Secretary (Railway Department), Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W., and must be lodged with the Board on or before the 14th September next.
