concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any two or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any two or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any two or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any two or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the twenty-second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the second year of Our Reign.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1911.

Dated 26th August, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of East Sussex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Lapwing, Plover, Redshank and other Sand Pipers, Snipe, Wild Swan, Mallard, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Sussex to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Blue-throat, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Snow Bunting, Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow CornCommon Buzzard, Bustard, Hammer), Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Honey Crake Rail), Spotted Crake, Golden-eyed (Land Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (both species), Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Glossy Ibis, Kestrel, Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redstart, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.
