WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Denbigh) Order, 1911.

Dated 28th August, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Denbigh, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Denbigh) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Partial Extension of Close Time.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Denbigh so far as concerns the undermentioned birds so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Dotterel, Dunlin, Fulmar, Gannet, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Hoopoe, Loon, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, or Night Hawk), Oriole, Oxbird, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Ploverspage, Puffin, Purre, American Quail, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Smew, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew (Thick Knee), Stonehatch, Summer-snipe, Tarrock, Tern, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Willock, Woodpecker.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Denbigh to the following species of Wild

Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Yellow Bunting, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, Raven, Redstart, Robin Redbreast, Red-backed Shrike, Starling, Thrush, Treecreeper, Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Wheatear, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Denbigh:—

Common Buzzard, Goldfinch, Heron, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet (brown and green), Owl, Siskin.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 20th December, 1904, is hereby repealed.
