DOCKYARD PORTS REGULATION ACT,

. 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council adding a Clause to the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 29th June, 1888, respecting the Dockyard Port of Chatham and Sheerness.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Lancaster) Order, 1911.

Dated 1st September, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Lancaster, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of Lancaster) Order,

#### BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Wild Duck, Snipe, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Lancaster to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard (all species), Chiffchaff, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Harrier (all species), Hedge Sparrow, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Longtailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck.

### All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned areas of the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

(a) Such portion of the River Mersey, between the City of Liverpool and the County Borough of Warrington as is within the district of the Administrative County of Lancaster. This area is shown in pink on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State,

and dated the 1st September, 1911.

(b) That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the road leading from Birkdale Railway Station to Birkdale Palace Railway Station, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line. This area is shown in blue on the map referred to above.

#### Sunday and Christmas Day Protection.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster except in the township of Poulton-with Fearnhead:

### Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster:

Buzzard (all species), Peregrine Falcon,

Buzzard (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Merlin, Owl (all species),

Raven, Woodpecker (all species).

#### Eccs.

#### All Eggs Protected in a certain Area.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the undermentioned area, which is shown in blue on the map referred to in Clause IV.:—

That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the road leading from Birkdale Railway Station to Birkdale Palace Railway

Station, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line.

Certain Eggs Protected throughout the County.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

Bittern, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Sheld Duck, Tufted Duck, Wild Duck (Mallard), Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Linnet, Merlin, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Pochard, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Snipe, Stonechat, Teal, Tern (all species), Long-tailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wigeon, Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wren, Wryneck; and (after April 20th in each year) Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover.

#### Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 4th March, 1908, is hereby repealed.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manufacture and decoration of pottery (that is to say, china, earthenware, tiles, or other articles made from clay, with or without the addition of other material); the making of lithographic transfers, frits, or glazes for use in the manufacture and decoration of pottery; and processes incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories and workshops in which such pro-

cesses (excepting the manufacture of unglazed or salt-glazed coarse ware in a factory in which no other pottery is made, the manufacture of sanitary or drain pipes, and the manufacture of bricks) are carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office,

London.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within 40 days from the date of this notice.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 18th August, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health held on the 15th August:—

1. Ships going from one contaminated port on the Sea of Marmara (Constantinople included) to another contaminated port on the same sea will be liable only to a medical visit on departure and on arrival. But if destined for a "clean" port on that sea, they will be subject to medical visit and disinfection, the delay not to exceed 24 hours; these measures may be undergone either at the Touzla or at the Kavak lazaret. When such ships are destined for ports on the Black Sea or the Mediterranean, they will be subject to the same measures in one of the lazarets of those seas (Sinope, Kavak, Clazomene, Beirut, or Tripoli): but, in view of the absence of a lazaret on the European coasts of the Aegean, ships destined for ports on that coast may undergo their measures at the Kavak lazaret. The object of the above decisions is to relieve as much as possible the small lazaret of Touzla.

2. Bills of health of ships leaving Constantinople will now be annotated as follows:

"The town of Constantinople is infected with cholera."

- 3. The measures in force against Smyrna (medical visit and disinfection, the delay not to exceed 24 hours) extended to the whole Gulf of Smyrna, from Karabournou to New Phocia.
- A medical visit reimposed against Alexandria, where a fresh case of plague has occurred.

HEALTH (FOREIGN PUBLIC MEAT) AMENDING REGULATIONS,

WE, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD, in pursuance of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, hereby give notice that, for the purposes of those Regulations, the Official Certificate of which the details are set forth in the representation or design in the schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice is, subject to the instructions given therein, hereby declared to be admissible, in the case of the Commonwealth of Australia, from the date of the publication of this Notice, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which any foreign meat is derived has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been sertified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed with the needful observance of all requirements for preventing danger to public health from using the meat as an article of food:

AND FURTHER, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every Official Certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, hereby prescribe as follows, that is to say :-

(i) An Official Certificate used in relation to fóreign meat, or in relation to a box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the meat is derived from a pig.

(ii) An Official Certificate in the form of a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so affixed or attached has not, in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.


(iii) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, has the same meaning as in those Regulations.

AND FURTHER, We hereby declare that the Official Certificates hitherto admitted in the case of the States of Queensland, Victoria, and New South Wales, shall, from the date of the publication of this Notice, cease to be admissible.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

A label, in the form of a combined certificate and stamp, having on it the subjoined representation or design, but subject to the condition that for the words "New South Wales" may be substituted the name of any other State comprised within the Commonwealth of Australia. MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 30TH AUGUST 1911.)

DERBYSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### PART I.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. I.

Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Scheduled District No. I.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. I) or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within that District.

#### PART II.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. II.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. II, and Movement into or within such District.

- 2.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. II).
- (2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. II, except with a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under and in accordance with this Article.
- (3.) A Movement Licence shall be granted only for the movement of an animal to a slaughter-house situate within Scheduled District No. II.
- (4.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement
  - (i.) is necessary or expedient; and
  - (ii.) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. I.
- (5.) An animal shall not be moved with a Movement Licence under this Article unless before the movement is commenced, it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:
  - Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \underbrace
    about six inches long on the left hind
    quarter of each of the cattle and by the
    clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.
  - Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow 

    on the forehead of each of the sheep, 
    and by the painting or stamping of the 
    letter M, about six inches long, on both 
    sides of each of the sheep with the following composition namely:—Rosin, five 
    parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and 
    blue or red ochre, one part; melted and

used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

- Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.
- (6.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be allowed by the person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. II.

#### Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals in Scheduled District No. II.

3. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises situate in Scheduled District No. II.

#### PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. III.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. III, and Movement into or within such District.

- 4.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Third Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. III), except into Scheduled District No. II, and then only in accordance with Part II of this Order.
- (2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. III, except with a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under and in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Order.
- (3.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement
  - (i.) is necessary or expedient; and
  - (ii.) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. I.
- (4.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be allowed by the person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. III.
- Markets, &c., of Animals for Immediate Slaughter in Scheduled District No. III.
- 5.—(1.) A market or sale may be held on any premises situate in Scheduled District No. III if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.
- (2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

Provisions as to Licences in Scheduled District No. III.

- 6.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Licence under Part III of this Order is in respect of movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in Scheduled District No. III., the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.
- (2.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.
- (3.) Where animals are moved with a Movement Licence to a market or sale authorised under this Order, the animals shall be moved therefrom only if accompanied by a further Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or sale is held, and only to a slaughter-house situate in Scheduled Districts No. II or III.
- (4.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article for movement from a market or sale shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughter-house specified in the licence in any case in which the slaughter-house is situate in another District.

#### PART IV.

#### GENERAL.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- 7. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—
  - (i.) movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or
  - (ii.) movement into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place; or
  - (iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board; or
  - (iv.) movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District No. I.

## Provision for Movement through Scheduled Districts by Railway.

8. For the purposes of this Order, animals shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Scheduled District in any case where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary

delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Districts.

9. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the District, and where the farm extends to two Districts, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner District.

Local Authority for the purpose of granting Licences.

10. A Movement Licence under this Order shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate.

#### Licences.

11. A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

12. Animals, while being moved under this Order, shall be accompanied by the Licence authorising the movement and shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

#### Licences after Completion of Movement.

13. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the said movement.

#### Granting Movement Licences.

14. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

#### Saving for Orders and Regulations.

15. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating

to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 16.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Offences.

- 17.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults; be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals is held in contravention of this Order, the person holding the same, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereat of any animal, such lastmentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market, fair, sale, or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

#### 18. In this Order-

- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:
- "Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.
- Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Revocation.

19. The Derbyshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 and 1911 (No. 2) are hereby revoked, except as regards movement under a licence granted on or before the commencement of this Order.

#### Commencement.

20. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and eleven.

#### Short Title.

21. This Order may be cited as the DERBY-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 3).
