

Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Longtailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck.

All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned areas of the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

(a) Such portion of the River Mersey, between the City of Liverpool and the County Borough of Warrington as is within the district of the Administrative County of Lancaster. This area is shown in pink on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 1st September, 1911.

(b) That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the road leading from Birkdale Railway Station to Birkdale Palace Railway Station, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line. This area is shown in blue on the map referred to above.

Sunday and Christmas Day Protection.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster except in the township of Poulton-with-Fearnhead.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

Buzzard (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Merlin, Owl (all species), Raven, Woodpecker (all species).

Eggs.

All Eggs Protected in a certain Area.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the undermentioned area, which is shown in blue on the map referred to in Clause IV.:—

That portion of the Hundred of West Derby bounded on the west by the Irish Sea, on the east by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway running between Southport and Liverpool, on the north by the road leading from Birkdale Railway Station to Birkdale Palace Railway

Station, and thence to low water in a straight line, and on the south by the road leading from Formby Station to the Formby Lifeboat Station, and thence to low water in a straight line.

Certain Eggs Protected throughout the County.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

Bittern, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Sheld Duck, Tufted Duck, Wild Duck (Mallard), Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Linnet, Merlin, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Pochard, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Snipe, Stonechat, Teal, Tern (all species), Long-tailed Tit, Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wigeon, Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wren, Wryneck; and (after April 20th in each year) Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 4th March, 1908, is hereby repealed.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manufacture and decoration of pottery (that is to say, china, earthenware, tiles, or other articles made from clay, with or without the addition of other material); the making of lithographic transfers, frits, or glazes for use in the manufacture and decoration of pottery; and processes incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories and workshops in which such pro-
