The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 18th August, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health held on the 15th August:—

1. Ships going from one contaminated port on the Sea of Marmara (Constantinople included) to another contaminated port on the same sea will be liable only to a medical visit on departure and on arrival. But if destined for a "clean" port on that sea, they will be subject to medical visit and disinfection, the delay not to exceed 24 hours; these measures may be undergone either at the Touzla or at the Kavak lazaret. When such ships are destined for ports on the Black Sea or the Mediterranean, they will be subject to the same measures in one of the lazarets of those seas (Sinope, Kavak, Clazomene, Beirut, or Tripoli): but, in view of the absence of a lazaret on the European coasts of the Aegean, ships destined for ports on that coast may undergo their measures at the Kavak lazaret. The object of the above decisions is to relieve as much as possible the small lazaret of Touzla.

2. Bills of health of ships leaving Constantinople will now be annotated as follows:

"The town of Constantinople is infected with cholera."

3. The measures in force against Smyrna (medical visit and disinfection, the delay not to exceed 24 hours) extended to the whole Gulf of Smyrna, from Karabournou to New Phocia.

4. A medical visit reimposed against Alexandria, where a fresh case of plague has occurred.
