TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of Boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of Paper, Cardboard, Chip, or similar material, have given notice as required by section 4 (2) of the above Act, that they "Propose to fix"—

Minimum Time Rates for the trade of making Boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of Paper, Cardboard, Chip or similar material as follows:

- (a) For female workers in a factory or workshop not being a domestic factory or workshop, 3d. an hour.
- (b) For female homeworkers, including workers in a domestic factory or workshop, 3d. an hour.

The above rates are to apply to all female workers (excepting all female learners as defined by the Trade Board) who are wholly, mainly or substantially employed in the making of boxes or parts thereof as aforesaid or in any branch or process thereof, but shall not apply to any female workers who are merely employed in work incidental or ancillary thereto.

The above Trade Board have also given similar notice that they propose to fix the following minimum time-rates for female learners (as defined by them):

During the first six months of employment, 4s. per week.

During the second six months of employment, 5s. per week.

For the third six months of employment, 6s. per week.

During the fourth six months of employment, Ss. per week.

During the fifth six months of employment, 9s. per week.

During the sixth six months of employment, 10s. 6d. per week.

The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent in any week by the learner in the factory or workshop is less or more than 52.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above rates which may be lodged with them within three months from the fourth day of September, 1911. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Paper Box Trade Board, Trafalgar Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London W.C.

REGULATIONS for the control of the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar, as defined by Order in Council of 22nd March, 1911.

The following shall be substituted for the Regulations dated 13th May, 1910:—

The limits of the Admiralty waters are as follows:—

All the water area lying between the Admiralty Harbour Works, the North Mole, and the shore, together with the water area extending from the outer edge of low water for a width of 200 yards outside the same from Rosia Mole on the south to the south end of the West Arm of the North Mole—including the Northern Entrance—and for a width of 50 yards outside the faced wall of the North Mole.

The term King's Harbour Master used in these regulations includes any person for the time being performing the duties of Harbour Master under the direction of the Senior Naval Officer.

- 1. No merchant or other private vessel shall enter, anchor, moor, or afterwards shift berth within the Admiralty waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master, and no vessel having received such permission shall enter or move within the enclosed Harbour without obtaining the services of a qualified pilot or other authorized person.
- 2. To prevent chance of collisions with H.M. Ships in either entrance the following regulations will be observed:—

When any of H.M. Ships are about to enter or leave Admiralty waters the following signals will be displayed at the Dockyard Tower by direction of the Senior Naval Officer, and repeated at the lighthouses at the north end of the South Mole and at the south end of the North Mole:—

By day: A square Red flag.

By night: A Red light and a green light vertical, 6 feet apart.

When these signals are displayed, no merchant or other private vessel shall attempt to enter, leave, or move within Admiralty waters until such time as the signals are hauled down.

- 3. Moorings for H.M. Ships, mark buoys or other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations, shall be placed by the King's Harbour Master, as from time to time the requirements of H.M. Service may demand.
- 4. Moorings for private vessels may be laid with the permission, in writing, of the King's Harbour Master, and in such positions as he shall deem fit, but such moorings shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.
- 5. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master or other person in charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.
- 6. No merchant or other private vessel or boat shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the Government quays; wharves, buoys, piles, or mark buoys without permission, in writing, from the King's Harbour Master.
- 7. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ash, rubbish, dust, sewage matter, nor filth of any description, and no refuse from any quarry, mine or pit, nor any other material, shall, except in such places and subject to such conditions as may be approved by the Kiug's Harbour Master, be unladen, cast or allowed to fall or to be washed into the Admiralty waters.
- 8. The steam syren shall not be used within Admiralty waters except to prevent collision or in case of fog.
- 9. All merchant or other private vessels within Admiralty waters shall carry out such instructions as they may receive from time to time from the King's Harbour Master or other officer acting on his behalf, with respect to putting out fires or lights, or other precautions deemed necessary for the prevention of fire.
- 10. No fire-arms or air guns shall be discharged on any ship or other vessel or boat within Admiralty waters.
- 11. No ship's gun on board any merchant or other private vessel shall be kept loaded nor discharged, except as a signal of distress, within Admiralty waters.
- 12. No trawling nor fishing by nets, whether drift nets or set nets, shall be at any time carried on in the Admiralty waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.
- 13. All seagoing vessels, when within the limits of the Admiralty waters, shall carry such lights as are prescribed by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Imperial Merchant Shipping Acts, and all vessels of every description shall also observe the steering and sailing rules set forth in such regulations.
- 14. The master of every merchant or other private vessel, or person in charge of any boat

to which these regulations apply, shall observe, and cause to be observed, these regulations as far as they apply to his vessel or boat; and if any master, or other person, acts in any respect in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to observe or cause to be observed in any respect any of these regulations, he will be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, in accordance with Clause 14 of the said Order in Council.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Salford Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with

regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

- (2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.
- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of sub-division (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
