THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-  
MENT ACT, 1907.

CITY AND COUNTY OF KINGSTON UPON HULL.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Local  
Government Board have by Order made  
the 23rd day of August, 1911 (which said  
Order will come into operation on the 9th day

of October, 1911), declared, specified and  
directed:—

(1.) That on and after the day on which the  
said Order comes into operation, section 28,  
comprised in Part II; sections 36, 39, 40, 41,  
42, 49 and 51, comprised in Part III; sections  
62, 65, 66, 67 and 68, comprised in Part IV;  
and section 73, comprised in Part V of the  
Act above mentioned, shall be in force in the  
District of the city and county of Kingston  
upon Hull.

(2.) That section 73 aforesaid shall be in  
force in the District subject to the following  
condition or adaptation, that is to say:—

“As soon as practicable after the date of  
the Order of the Local Government Board by  
which this section is declared to be in force,  
and at a time not less than one month before  
the commencement of this section, the Local  
Authority shall give notice of the commence-  
ment of this section to the keeper of every  
lodging-house in their district.”

(3.) That on and after the day on which the  
said Order comes into operation, section 72 of  
the Kingston upon Hull Corporation Act,  
1903, and sections 85 and 94 of the same Act,  
so far as the sections relate to any subject-  
matter of section 66 of the above mentioned  
Act of 1907, shall be no longer in force in the  
District.

(4.) That where an enactment in a local Act,  
other than an enactment specified in the pre-  
ceding paragraph (3), contains provisions  
which alter, amend, apply or otherwise relate  
to an enactment so specified, those provisions  
shall, to the extent to which they are inconsis-  
tent with any section mentioned in the fore-  
going paragraph (1), be no longer in force in  
the city of Hull.—Dated this 2nd day of Sep-  
tember, 1911.
