TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 11th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £3,000,000, of which £2,400,000 will be in replacement of Bills falling due on the 17th instant, and £600,000 will replace the balance of the Bills paid off temporarily on 4th and 28th April last.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 16th September, 1911, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 16th

March, 1912.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London banker.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 2nd September, from His Majesty's Consul at Christiania, transmitting the following translation of a Circular, dated the 1st September, issued by the Norwegian Government, and relating to places infected with cholera and plague:

The following places are to be regarded as infected with chclera until further notice: The town of Marseilles, the Russian Government of Kherson with the towns of Odessa and Nicolaieff, and the following Italian towns and provinces: the province and town of Genoa, the town of Leghorn, the province of Rome with the towns of Rome and Civita Vecchia, the provinces of Catanzaro, Chieti, and Venice,

and the following ports in Sicily: Catania, Girgenti, Messina, Syracuse, and Trapani.

The towns of Trieste and Tunis are struck off

the List of places infected with cholera.

By notices previously issued the following places are to be regarded as infected with cholera:—The Italian provinces of Naples, Caserta, Salerno, and Palermo with the towns of Naples and Palermo, the town of Constantinople, the Russian Governments of Astrachan and Samara, the towns of Novorossisk and Baku in Russia, and the towns of Smyrna and Samsoon in Turkey in Asia:

And with plague:—The town of Odessa and the Government of Astrachan in Russia, Arabia, the town of Bagdad in Mesopotamia, Persia, India, Burmah, Siam and Tonquin, Manilla, Formosa, the town of Sourabaya in Java, with surrounding district, China, Japan, Manchuria, Egypt, Madagascar, the Islands of Réunion and Mauritius, the town of Cape Coast Castle and the other towns on the Gold Coast of Africa, the ports in Brazil and in Chili, Uruguay and Peru, the town of Guayaquil in Equator in South America, the towns of Brisbane, Maryborough, Perth, Fremantle, Geraldton, and Sydney in Australia.

Vessels with cholera or plague patients on board and bound to Norwegian ports should be directed by the pilots to the Quarantine Station on Odderöen, near Christiansand.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and calling at ports in Nordland, Tromsö, and Finmarken Prefectures, or using the inner channel between Honningsvaag and Lödingen, are to be directed to the provisional cholera lazaret in Tromsö. But vessels arriving at Hammerfest, Vardö, or Vadsö with single cases of cholera on board may, until further notice, expect that such patients will be received for treatment on shore under the further regulations of the local Health Authorities.

SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

Revocation of provisions requiring Carting in certain cases.

1. So much of Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 as requires conveyance in a float, cart, or van, of swine which are being moved with a licence (Form D) is hereby revoked, and any other Order of the Board which incorporates such provision shall be modified accordingly.

Extension of duration of Movement Licences.

2. Any Order of the Board relating to swine-fever which provides that movement licences granted under the Order shall be available for six days, including the day of the date thereof, shall be read as if "eight" were substituted for "six."

Modification of Forms.

3. Forms prescribed by any Order of the Board relating to swine-fever shall be modified in accordance with the preceding Articles.

Keeping of Registers by Pig Dealers, Castrators, and Owners of Boars.

4.—(1.) Every pig dealer shall keep a register in which there shall be correctly entered the following particulars, so far as they are known to the dealer, that is to say:—

(i.) the date of each purchase of swine;

(ii.) the name and address of the persons from whom the swine were purchased;

(iii.) the number and description thereof;

(iv.) the date of the delivery of the swine to the dealer or to some person by his direction;

(v.) the date of each sale of swine;

(vi.) the name and address of the person to whom the swine were sold;

(vii.) the number and description thereof; (viii.) the date of the delivery thereof to the purchaser or to some person by his direc-

tion; and

- (ix.) particulars of the death, or slaughter, or disposal by the dealer otherwise than by sale, of any swine in the possession of the dealer.
- (2.) Every castrator of swine shall keep a register in which there shall be correctly entered the following particulars, that is to say:—

(i.) the date of each castration;

(ii.) the name and address of the owner, or person in charge, of the swine; and

or person in charge, of the swine; and (iii.) the number and description of swine castrated.

(3.) Every owner of a boar used for the service of sows other than his own shall keep a register in which there shall be correctly entered the following particulars as regards each service, so far as the particulars are known to him, that is to say:—

(i.) the date of each service;

(ii.) the description of the sow served; and (iii.) the name and address of the owner of the sow.

- (4.) Every entry in a register shall be made in ink or indelible pencil within forty-eight hours after the purchase, delivery, sale, death, slaughter, disposal, castration, or service, as the case may be.
- (5.) Every register required by this Order to be kept by any person shall be produced by him for inspection at all reasonable times to any Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or of a Local Authority who so requires, and the Inspector shall be entitled to make copies of any entries therein.
- (6.) A Local Authority may supply registers for the purposes of this Order to any pig dealer, castrator, or owner of a boar who applies for the same and resides or carries on his business in the District of the Local Authority.

Cleansing and Disinfection by Castrators of Swine.

- 5.—(1.) Any instrument used by a castrator of swine for the purpose of castrating swine shall forthwith after being used for such purpose and before being again so used for the purpose of castrating swine on other premises be thoroughly washed with soap and water and shall then be disinfected with a solution of carbolic acid or other suitable disinfectant.
- (2.) Every castrator upon leaving any premises upon which he has castrated swine shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water, and his boots with a solution of carbolic acid or other suitable disinfectant.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles, Crates, &c., used for conveyance of Swine.

- 6.—(1.) The floor of any van, cart, or other vehicle used in connection with the conveyance of swine along any highway or thoroughfare to a market-place, fairground, or saleyard, and all other parts of any such vehicle with which any pig or its droppings have come in contact, and any crate, box, hamper, net, rope, or other thing used for such conveyance shall be cleansed and disinfected by the Local Authority of the District wherein the market-place, fairground, or saleyard is situate immediately after the removal of the swine from the vehicle and before it is moved from the market-place, fairground, or saleyard.
- (2.) The floor of any van, cart, or other vehicle used in connection with the conveyance of swine along any highway or thoroughfare to any place other than a market-place, fairground or saleyard, and all other parts of any such vehicle with which any pig or its droppings have come in contact, and any crate, box, hamper, net, rope, or other thing used for such conveyance shall forthwith be cleansed and disinfected, by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose, upon the receipt of a notice in writing served by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or of a Local Authority requiring such cleansing and disinfection.
- (3.) The cleansing and disinfection required by this Article or by a notice served thereunder shall be carried out in the manner prescribed by Article 13 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908.

(4.) Articles 11 and 12 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908 shall cease to apply where the conveyance is along a highway or thoroughfare to a market-place, fairground or saleyard.

Straying of Swine from Infected Place.

7. Swine in a swine-fever infected place shall not be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray thereout.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If any person fail to keep a register as required by this Order or makes any false entry therein he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect anything required by this Order to be cleansed and disinfected by him he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If an owner or person in charge of a pig in a swine-fever infected place allows it to stray thereout he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
 - "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;
 - "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector;
 - "Pig Dealer" means a person habitually engaged in the trade or business of selling swine (other than swine bred by him), but does not include a person who as auctioneer sells swine which are the property of another person.
 - "Castrator" means a person who castrates for reward.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

- 11.—(1.) Article 16 (Regulations of Local Authorities as to Keeping of Registers by Owners of Boars and by Pig Dealers) of the Swine-Fever Order of 1908 is hereby revoked.
- (2.) All Regulations made or continued in force under the Swine-Fever Order of 1908, except Regulations as to entry of swine into markets, sales, &c., made under Article 15 of that Order, are hereby revoked.

Extent.

SWINE-FEVER (SPECIAL AREAS) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and any Order amending that Order, shall apply to each of the Scheduled Areas described in the First Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifica-tions hereinafter contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of any such Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Restriction of Movement Facilities in certain Cases.

2.—(1.) A licence (Form A) authorising movement to premises in a Scheduled Area

described in the First Schedule hereto from premises not in any Area therein described shall be granted only in the case of swine which in the opinion of the Local Authority of the place of destination are required for breeding stock, and any licence so granted shall be granted by the Clerk of the Local Authority instead of being granted by an Inspector as provided by the principal Order.

(2.) No such licence shall be granted for movement to a market, fairground or saleyard.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.

- 3.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market, fairground or saleyard in a Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.
- (2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A), the provisions of Article 4 of the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine:
- 3.) But if the market or saleyard is specially . authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of swine from the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of Article 5 of the principal Order, except that the swine shall not be required to be conveyed in a float, cart
- (4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following conditions : -
 - (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is
 - (ii.) If the place of destination is outside the Scheduled Area it must be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse.
 - (iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.
 - (iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
 - (v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.

4. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in a Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District under this Order (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant), or is specially authorised

under the principal Order or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904.

Effect of Licences granted under this Order.

5. No licence shall be required under the principal Order for the movement into a Scheduled Area, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Order.

Forms.

6. The Forms referred to in this Order are the Forms set forth in the First Schedule to the principal Order.

Saving of certain existing Local Orders.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of any existing local Order not hereby revoked which modifies the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 in relation to movement of swine in a float, cart or van, in any part of a Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

Revocation. .

8. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto, to the extent described in that Schedule, are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.
