MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX AND BOROUGH OF RICHMOND.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas Richmond Bridge is situate partly within the Urban District of Twickenham, in the county of Middlesex, and partly within the Borough of Richmond;

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex and the Council of the Borough of Richmond have made applications to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising Richmond Bridge and the approaches thereto (including Bridge Street, Richmond).

And whereas notice of the said applications and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 13th day of June, 1911, in the Richmond Herald and the Richmond and Twickenham Times of the 10th day of June, 1911, and in the Surrey Comet, of the 17th day of June, 1911;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further enquiry should be made in the matter of the said applications:

Notice is hereby given that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Richmond, on Friday, the thirteenth day of October, 1911, at three o'clock in the afternoon, to hold a local inquiry into the subject matter of the said applications.

And notice is hereby further given that any persons interested may attend at such inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said applications.
