at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

ARTICLE I .- The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Parish of Crowborough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and

eleven.
