

within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of East Sussex having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate within the Urban District of Uckfield, in the county of East Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of the roads within the said Urban District which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

#### SCHEDULE.

So much of High Street as extends from a point opposite the entrance gates of Manor

House to a point in the road situate 50 yards south of its junction with Framfield Road;

So much of Church Street as extends from its junction with High Street to a point 55 yards west of the back entrance to the premises known as "Belmont"; and

So much of Framfield Road as extends from its junction with High Street at the Railway Tavern to Meadow Place.
