His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Mrs. McFall, the widow of the late William McFall, an engine-driver on the Canadian-Pacific Railway, under the following circumstances:—

On the 14th of April, 1911, a passenger train from Ottawa was approaching North Wakefield when the driver McFall suddenly perceived a

gap in the track between 50 and 100 feet wide and over 20 feet deep caused by thaws and rain. The fireman jumped off the engine, but McFall put on the emergency brakes and sticking to his engine managed to bring the train to a standstill. The engine, however, fell into the gap; and McFall received terrible injuries, from which he died. There were forty passengers in the train, and had it not been for McFall's heroic devotion to his duty serious loss of life would probably have occurred.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Walter Cullen and Thomas Macfarlane, miners working at the Loanend Colliery, under the following circumstances:—

On the 21st of April, 1911, Mr. Robert Edgar, the under manager of the Loanend Colliery, Cambuslang, went up a highly inclined road to tear down a screen so as to disperse an accumulation of firedamp, and was overcome suddenly by firedamp. Macfarlane at once went to his assistance, but was in turn overcome and rolled down the road. Cullen, who is 60 years of age, then made two attempts to rescue the under manager, and on both occasions was helped back by Macfarlane, who had recovered, though still suffering from the effects of firedamp. The under manager's body was not recovered until three and a half hours afterwards.

On the 21st December, 1910, a terrible explosion occurred at the No. 3 Bank Pit at the Hulton Colliery, near Allerton, by which a portion of the casting of the upcast shaft was wrecked. Various miners were shut off from escape by the fall of earth, and suffered from the effects of poisonous gases. Many miners used their utmost endeavours to rescue their fellow workmen under circumstances of great danger, and the above showed specially conspicuous courage.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Mr. Charles Samuel Vassar Cudbird, Station Master at George Lane, South Woodford.

On the 30th June, 1911, as the 9.30 train from Epping was about to enter the station at George Lane, Miss Tremlett, now Mrs.

Wells, accidentally fell on the line about 70 yards in front of the train, which usually enters the station at 30 or 40 miles an hour, and Mr. Cudbird jumped down and pulled her clear on to the 6-foot way. Had not the driver seen what was happening and applied the brakes, both would certainly have been cut to pieces, and the risk involved in Mr. Cudbird's action was very great.

Regulations under Section 8.

COUNTY OF THE SOKE OF PETERBOROUGH.

Parish of Wansford.

To the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough;
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on parts of certain highways situate within the parish of Wansford, in the county of the Soke of Peterborough, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour on the part of a highway described in Schedule A hereto.

ARTICLE II.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding five miles per

hour on the parts of highways described in Schedule B hereto.

ARTICLE III.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
