The Mall, Admiralty Arch, Charing Cross, Whitehall, Parliament Street, Broad Sanctuary to the West entrance, Westminster Abbey.

The Peers, Dowager Peeresses, and Peeresses in their Robes of Estate, and others who had been invited by His Majesty's Command to be present at the Solemnity of the Coronation, were conducted to the places assigned to them in Westminster Abbey, previously to the arrival of Their Majesties: the Lords Spiritual on the North side of the Area or Sacrarium; the Lords Temporal in the South Transept; and the Peeresses in the North Transept.

The Great Officers of State, the Lords appointed to carry the Regalia all in their Robes of Estate, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, and the Bishops who supported Their Majesties, as well as those who carried the Bible, the Paten, and the Chalice, vested in Copes, assembled in the Vestibule at the West Door before half-past nine o'clock, where the Regalia, having been previously laid on the Table, were delivered by the Lord Chamberlain of the Household to the Lord High Constable, by him to the Lord Great Chamberlain, and by His Lordship to the Noblemen, by whom the same were borne in the following order, viz.:—

DISPOSITION OF PROCESSION DURING THE CEREMONY.

The Chaplains passed to the Seats provided for them.

The Prebendaries entering the Choir, ascended the Theatre, and passed over it to their Station on the South side of the Altar, beyond the King's Chair.

The Pursuivants of Scotland and Ireland stood near the North-West Pillar

throughout the ceremony.

The Officers of the Orders of Knighthood passed to the Seats provided for them. The Treasurer of His Majesty's Household passed to his Station on the South side of the Altar.

The Comptroller of His Majesty's Household passed to his Seat as a Peer.

The Standards were handed to the Barons of the Cinque Ports at the entrance

The Bearers of the Royal Standard, the Standards of the Union, Wales, India, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa, passed to their Seats, as

The Bearers of the Standards of England, Scotland, and Ireland passed to their Seats.

The Vice-Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household passed to his Seat.

The Knights of the Garter appointed to hold the Canopy passed to Seats provided for them.

The Lord Steward of the Household passed to his Seat as a Peer.

The Prime Minister together with the Lord Chancellor of Ireland and his Purse-Bearer passed to the Seats provided for them.

The Purse-Bearer to the Lord High Chancellor passed to a Seat provided for him. The Archbishop of York ascended the Theatre and passed to his Seat on the North side of the Area.

The Heralds of Scotland and Ireland stood near the South West Pillars

throughout the ceremony.

The Ladies of the Bedchamber, the Women of the Bedchamber, and the Maids

of Honour, passed to the Seats provided for them.

The Vice-Chamberlain to the Queen passed to his Seat as a Peer. Treasurer, the Private Secretary, and the Equerry to the Queen passed to their Seats. Lyon King of Arms, Ulster King of Arms, the Gentleman Usher to the Black

Rod and the Lord Mayor of London stood near the South-East Pillar throughout the Ceremony.

The High Constables of Scotland and Ireland passed to their Seats as Peers.

The Great Steward of Scotland and the Lord High Steward of Ireland passed to their Seats as Peers.

The Master of the Horse and the Gold Stick in Waiting passed to their Seats as

The Vice-Admiral of the United Kingdom passed to his Seat.

The Captain-General of the Royal Archer Guard of Scotland passed to his Seat as

The Admiral in Waiting, General the Right Hon. Sir N. G. Lyttelton, and General Sir E. G. Barrow passed to their Seats.

The Captain of the Honourable Corps of Gentlemen-at-Arms, and the Captain of the Yeomen of the Guard passed to their Seats as Peers.

The Lord in Waiting passed to his Seat as a Peer. The Keeper of His Majesty's Privy Purse passed to his Seat.

The Private Secretaries to the King passed in the one case to his Seat as a Peer

and in the other to the Seat provided for him.

The Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Department, the Crown Equerry, the Groom in Waiting, the Equerries to the King, and the Silver Stick in Waiting, passed to their Seats.

The Officers of the Yeomen of the Guard and the Exons stood within and near to the Choir door, and the Yeomen of the Guard in the Nave on the outside of the entrance to the Choir.

The Serjeants-at-Arms went to their places near the Theatre. The Gentlemen-at-Arms, who guarded Their Majesties, remained at the foot of the steps ascending to the Theatre

The Pages of those Peers not bearing the Regalia or not having duties to perform, upon ascending the Theatre, delivered the Coronets which they had carried to the respective Peers and went to the Seats provided for them, where they remained until the final procession.

The Pages of the other Peers also went to the special Seats provided for them, and just before the Crowning went into the Sacrarium and there delivering the Coronets

they had carried to the respective Peers, returned at once to their Seats.

THE QUEEN'S CHAIR OF STATE.

The Queen preceded by Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and the Lords bearing Her Regalia, and attended as before mentioned, ascended the Theatre and passed on the North side of Her Throne to the Chair of State and Faldstool provided for Her Majesty on the South side of the Altar, making her humble adoration, and stood by Her Chair until His Majesty's arrival.

The Mistress of the Robes and the Ladies who had borne the Queen's train stood behind Her Majesty's Chair, and supported Her Majesty's Train during the

Ceremony.

The Queen's Lord Chamberlain, the Lords who bore Her Majesty's Regalia, Her Supporters, Train Bearer, and Assistants, stood near Her Majesty; Her Lord Chamberlain on the right hand.

THE KING'S CHAIR OF STATE.

The Dean of Westminster, Garter King of Arms, the Great Officers of State, viz.: the Lord High Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Lord High Constable, the Earl Marshal, with the Archbishop of Canterbury (after his devotions at his Seat on the North Side of the Altar), ascended

the Theatre, and stood near the Great South-East Pillar thereof.

The King, ascended the Theatre, and passed on the South side of His Throne, to His Chair of State, on the South side of the Altar, making his humble adoration, and Their Majesties, after their private devotion (kneeling at their Faldstools), took Their respective Seats, the Bishops, Their supporters, stood on each side; the Lords who bore the Four Swords on His Majesty's right hand, the Sword of State being nearest to the Royal Person; the Lords who bore the Regalia, stood about the King's Chair. The Bishops who bore the Bible, the Paten, and the Chalice, stood near the Pulpit, and the Train Bearers, the Lord Chamberlain of the Household, the Groom of the Robes, and the Keeper of the Jewel House behind His Majesty.

THE RECOGNITION.

Upon the conclusion of the Anthem, the Archbishop of Canterbury advanced from his station at the South East Pillar, and, together with the Lord High Chancellor, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Lord High Constable, and the Earl Marshal, preceded by Garter King of Arms, turned to the East side of the Theatre, where the Archbishop made the Presentation thus: "Sirs, I here present unto you King GEORGE the undoubted King of this Realm: wherefore, all you who are come this day to do your homage and service, are you willing to do the same?" and repeated the same at the South, West and North sides of the Theatre; during which time His Majesty stood up by His Chair, and turned towards the People on the side at which the Recognition was made; the People replying to each demand with loud and repeated acclamations of "God Save King George"; the Trumpets sounding at the last Recognition. The bearers of the Regalia during the Recognition remained standing about His Majesty.

His Majesty then resumed His Seat; and the Bishops who had borne them; having carried to and placed upon the Altar, the Bible, the Paten and the Chalice,

went back to their seats.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then proceeded to the Altar.

The Regalia, except the Swords, were delivered, by the several Lords who had borne the same, to the Archbishop, and by His Grace to the Dean of Westminster, who laid them on the Altar; the Great Officers of State (with the exception of the Lord Great Chamberlain), and the Lords who had borne the Regalia deposited on the Altar, went to the respective places appointed for them on the South side of the Altar, where they remained until the Inthronization. The Bishop of Durham stood on the right of His Majesty, with the Lords, carrying the Swords, on his right. The Lord Great Chamberlain stood on His Majesty's left; the Bishop of Peterborough on Her Majesty's left.

The Lords bearing the Swords (except the Sword of State) continued to stand

on the South side of the Area until the Inthronization.

THE LITANY

was then sung by the Bishop of Bath and Wells and the Bishop of Oxford, vested in Copes, kneeling at a Faldstool above the steps of the Theatre, in the centre of the East side thereof, the Choir singing the Responses. At the conclusion of the Litany, during which the King remained uncovered, the Bishops who had sung the Litany went back to their places.

THE COMMUNION SERVICE.

The Archbishop commenced the Communion Service, the Bishop of Winchester reading the Epistle, and the Bishop of London the Gospel.

THE SERMON

was then preached by the Archbishop of York. During the Sermon, His Majesty wore His Cap of State of Crimson Velvet turned up with Ermine, and continued to sit in His Chair on the South side of the Area, opposite the Pulpit; supported on His right hand by the Bishop of Durham, and, beyond him, on the same side stood the Lords carrying the Swords. On His Majesty's left stood the Bishop of Bath and Wells, and near him the Lord Great Chamberlain. Her Majesty was supported by the Bishops of Oxford and Peterborough, standing on either side, and Her Majesty's Train Bearer and Assistants constantly attending Her Majesty during the whole Solemnity. The Archbishop of Canterbury took his Seat in a Purple Velvet Chair, on the North side of the Altar, Garter stood near him, the other Bishops along the North side of the wall betwixt him and the Pulpit. The Dean of Westminster, the rest of the Bishops who bore any part in the Service, and the Prebendaries of Westminster, stood on the South side of the Area, East of the King's Chair, and near the Altar.

THE OATH.

When the Sermon was ended (His Majesty having, on Monday, the sixth day of February, 1911, in the presence of the two Houses of Parliament, made and signed the Declaration prescribed), the Archbishop of Canterbury, advancing towards the King and standing before Him, ministered the questions contained in the Order of Service. These questions having been answered by His Majesty, the King arose from His Chair, and, attended by His Supporters and the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Sword of State alone being borne before His Majesty, went to the Altar, where, kneeling upon the cushion placed on the Steps, and laying His Right Hand on the Holy Gospels in the Great Bible (which had been carried in the Procession), tendered to His Majesty by the Archbishop, took the Coronation Oath, kissed the Book, and to a transcript of the Oath set His Royal Sign Manual, the Lord Chamberlain of the Household holding for that purpose a Silver Standish, delivered to him by the Keeper of the Jewel House.

The King thereupon returned to His Chair, and both Their Majesties knelt at Their Faldstools. The Hymn "Veni, Creator Spiritus," was sung by the Choir, the Archbishop beginning the first line.

THE ANOINTING.

Upon the conclusion of the Hymn, the Archbishop said the Prayer preparatory to the Anointing, "O Lord, Holy Father, who by anointing with Oil didst of old make and consecrate kings, priests, and prophets," &c. At the conclusion of the Prayer, the Choir sang the Anthem, "Zadok the Priest and Nathan the Prophet," &c. During the Anthem the King, rising from his devotions, was disrobed of His Crimson Robe by the Lord Great Chamberlain, who delivered it to the Master of the Robes, and His Majesty taking off His Cap of State, the Lord Great Chamberlain delivered the same to the Lord Chamberlain of the Household. The Robe and Cap were immediately carried into St. Edward's Chapel, by the Groom of the Robes.

The King then went before the Altar supported and attended as before, and sate in King Edward's Chair, covered with Cloth of Gold, and with a Faldstool before it, placed in front of the Altar. Four Knights of the Garter, the Earl Cadogan (P.C.), the Earl of Rosebery, K.T. (P.C.), the Earl of Crewe (P.C.), the Earl of Minto, G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E. (P.C.) (summoned by Garter), held over the King's Head a Rich Canopy of Cloth of Gold, delivered to them by the Lord Chamberlain, who had received the same from the Groom of the Robes. The Dean of Westminster took from the Altar the Ampulla containing the consecrated Oil, and poured some into the Anointing Spoon, wherewith the Archbishop anointed His Majesty in the form of a cross on the crown of the head saying, "Be thy Head anointed," on the breast saying, "Be thy Breast anointed," &c., and on the palms of both hands saying, "Be thy Hands," &c.

The Dean of Westminster thereupon replaced the Ampulla and Spoon on the

Altar.

The Archbishop, standing in front of the Altar, pronounced the Blessing after the Anointing, the King kneeling at His Faldstool, whereupon His Majesty resumed His Seat in King Edward's Chair. The Knights of the Garter gave back to the Lord Chamberlain the Canopy (which was by him delivered to the Groom of the Robes), and went back to their seats.

THE COLOBIUM SINDONIS AND SUPERTUNICA.

The King having arisen, the Dean of Westminster invested His Majesty with the Colobium Sindonis and the Supertunica or Close Pall of Cloth of Gold together with a Girdle of the same.

THE GOLDEN SPURS.

The Dean then took from the Altar the Spurs and delivered them to the Lord Great Chamberlain, who, kneeling down, touched His Majesty's heels therewith and gave them back to the Dean, by whom they were laid upon the Altar.

THE SWORD.

The Lord who carried the Sword of State delivered it to the Lord Chamberlain and, in lieu thereof, received from him another Sword in a Scabbard of Purple Velvet, delivered to the Lord Chamberlain by the Keeper of the Jewel House. The Sword of State was taken charge of by the Keeper of the Jewel House who deposited it in the Traverse of St. Edward's Chapel. The Sword, in the Scabbard of Purple Velvet, was delivered by the bearer thereof to the Archbishop, who laid it on the Altar, saying the Prayer, "Hear our prayers, O Lord, we beseech Thee, and so direct and support Thy Servant, King George," &c.

The Archbishop then took the Sword from off the Altar, and, assisted by the Archbishop of York, the Bishops of London and Winchester and other Bishops, delivered it into the King's Right Hand saving "Receive this Kingly Sword." &c.

delivered it into the King's Right Hand, saying, "Receive this Kingly Sword," &c.

The King, having stood up, the Sword was girt about Him by the Lord Great
Chamberlain, and the King having sate down, the Archbishop said, "With this Sword
do justice," &c.

OFFERING OF THE SWORD.

The King, having risen up, and ungirded his Sword, went to the Altar, where His Majesty offered the Sword, and then returned to and sate down in King Edward's

Chair. The Sword was then redeemed for One Hundred Shillings by the Lord who had first received it, and he receiving it again from the Dean carried it during the remainder of the Solemnity, first drawing it out of the Scabbard, and delivering the latter to the Groom of the Robes. The Bishops, who had assisted during the Offering, went back to their places.

THE INVESTING WITH THE ARMILL AND ROYAL ROBE.

The Master of the Robes then delivered the Armill and the Royal Robe or Pall of Cloth of Gold to the Dean of Westminster, who, the King having arisen, invested His Majesty therewith, the Lord Great Chamberlain fastening the Clasps.

THE ORB.

The King thereupon sate down, and the Archbishop, having received the Orb from the Dean, delivered it into the King's Right Hand, saying: "Receive this Imperial Robe and Orb," &c. His Majesty returned the Orb to the Dean, who laid it on the Altar.

THE RING.

The Keeper of the Jewel House delivered the Ruby Ring to the Archbishop, who put it on the fourth finger of the King's Right Hand, saying: "Receive this Ring," &c.

THE SCEPTRES.

The Dean of Westminster brought from the Altar the Sceptre with the Cross, and the Sceptre with the Dove, and delivered them to the Archbishop.

The Glove presented by the Lord of the Manor of Worksop* was put on and the Archbishop delivered the Sceptre with the Cross into His Majesty's Right Hand, saying: "Receive the Royal Sceptre," &c., and the Sceptre with the Dove into His Left Hand, saying: "Receive the Rod of equity," &c. The Lord of the Manor of Worksop supported His Majesty's Right Arm.

THE CROWNING.

The Archbishop, standing before the Altar, and having St. Edward's Crown before him, took the same into his hands, and laid it down again saying, "O God the crown of the faithful," &c.

Then the Archbishop, with the Archbishop of York and the other Bishops, came from the Altar; and the Archbishop, having received the Crown from the Dean of Westminster, reverently placed it on His Majesty's Head; when the people with loud and repeated shouts, cried: "God save the King"; the Peers put on their Coronets, and the Kings of Arms their Crowns; the Trumpets sounded, the Drums beat, and, at a signal given, the Great Guns of the Tower and the Guns in the Park were shot off.

The acclamation having ceased, the Archbishop pronounced the prayer: "God crown you with a crown of glory," &c., and the choir sang the following: "Be strong and play the man," &c.

THE HOLY BIBLE.

The Dean, taking the Holy Bible from the Altar, delivered it to the Archbishop who, attended and assisted by the Archbishop of York and the Bishops, presented it to the King, first saying: "Our Gracious King," &c.

The King then gave back the Bible to the Archbishop, who gave it to the Dean, who replaced it on the Altar, the Archbishop of York and Bishops going back to their Seats.

THE BENEDICTION.

The Archbishop then pronounced the Benediction, and turning to the people, said: "And the same Lord God Almighty grant," &c. The Archbishop of York,

the Bishops and the Peers followed every part of the Benediction with a loud and hearty Amen.

THE INTHRONIZATION.

The King ascended the Theatre, accompanied by the two Bishops His Supporters, the Great Officers of State, the Lords carrying the Swords, and the Lords who had borne the Regalia, and was Inthroned by the Archbishops, Bishops, and the Peers around His Majesty; and being so Inthroned, all the Great Officers of State, the Lords bearing the Swords, and the Lords who had borne the other Regalia, stood around about the steps of the Throne. The Archbishop, stood before the King, and pronounced the Exhortation, "Stand firm, and hold fast," &c.

THE HOMAGE.

The Exhortation being ended, His Majesty delivered the Sceptre with the Cross to the Lord who had first borne it, who held the same on His right, and the Sceptre with the Dove to the Lord who had first borne it, who held the same on His left during the Homage.

The Archbishop knelt before the King, and for himself and the other Lords Spiritual, viz. :—

At the conclusion of the Homage the King received the two Sceptres from the bearers thereof. The Bishops that supported the King in His Procession also eased Him by supporting His Crown as there was occasion.

While the Homage was being done, the Choir sang the Anthem "Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous," &c.

At the conclusion of the Homage, the Drums beat, the Trumpets sounded, and all the people shouted, crying out:—

God save King George, Long live King George, May the King live for ever.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then went to the Altar.

Anointing, Crowning, and Inthroning the Queen.

The Queen having been seated in Her Chair on the South side of the Altar during the Coronation and Inthronization of His Majesty, arose, and as soon as the Anthem was ended went to the steps of the Altar, supported as before, and attended by Her Train-bearer and Ladies Assistants, and there knelt whilst the Archbishop said the Prayer, "Almighty God, the Fountain of all goodness," &c., which was of old said over the Queen at her first entrance at the West Door of the Church. Her Majesty then rose and went to the Faldstool (placed before the Altar between the Steps and King Edward's Chair) at which she was to be Anointed and Crowned.

The Queen there knelt down, and four Peeresses appointed for that Service, the Duchess of Hamilton, the Duchess of Montrose, the Duchess of Portland and the Duchess of Sutherland (summoned by Garter), held a rich Canopy of Cloth of Gold over Her Majesty. The Archbishop poured the Consecrated Oil upon Her Head, saying, "In the name of the Father," &c.

Then the Archbishop received from the Keeper of the Jewel House the Queen's Ring, and put the same on the fourth finger of Her Majesty's Right Hand, saying "Receive this Ring," &c.

The Archbishop thereupon took the Crown from the Altar and reverently set it on the Queen's Head, saying, "Receive the Crown," &c.

Her Majesty having been crowned, the Princesses and Peeresses put on their Coronets, which they continued to wear until they left the Abbey. The Archbishop placed the Sceptre with the Cross in Her Majesty's Right Hand and the Ivory Rod with the Dove in Her Left, and said the Prayer, "O Lord, the Giver of all perfection," &c.

The Queen then rose, and, supported as before, ascended the Theatre (reverently bowing to His Majesty as she passed the Throne) and was conducted to Her Own Throne on the left of that of the King.

THE COMMUNION.

The Choir sang the Offertory, "O hearken Thou unto the voice of my calling."

At the commencement of the Offertory the Bishops who had read the Epistle and the Gospel, received from the Altar, by the hands of the Archbishop, the Paten and the Chalice, which they carried into St. Edward's Chapel, and brought from thence the Bread upon the Paten and the Wine in the Chalice. Their Majesties delivered Their Sceptres to the Lords who had previously borne them, and descended from Their Thrones, the Sword of State being borne before Them, and went to the Altar, where Their Majesties took off Their Crowns, and delivered the same to the Lord Great Chamberlain and His Majesty's Lord Chamberlain; and then knelt down. Then the Bishops delivered the Paten and Chalice into the King's hands; and His Majesty delivered them to the Archbishop, who reverently placed the same upon the Altar, and

having said the Prayer, "Bless, O Lord, we beseech Thee," &c., covered them with a fair linen cloth. The King, still kneeling, made his

offering a Pall or Altar Cloth (which the Groom of the Robes delivered to the Lord Great Chamberlain, and he kneeling to His Majesty, from whom the Archbishop received it) and an Ingot of Gold of a pound weight (which the Treasurer of the Household delivered to the Lord Great Chamberlain, and he to His Majesty, from whom the Archbishop received it) and placed them upon the Altar. The Queen also made Her Oblation of a Pall or Altar Cloth and a mark weight of Gold in like manner as the King.

The Archbishop then proceeded with the Office of Holy Communion. When the Archbishop and the Dean of Westminster, with the Bishops Assistants, namely, the Preacher and those who had read the Litany, and the Epistle and Gospel, had communicated, the Archbishop administered to Their Majesties the Bread, and the Dean of Westminster the Cup.

The King and Queen then received Their Crowns from the Lord Great Chamberlain and the Lord Chamberlain of the Household, put them on, and repaired to Their Thrones; receiving again the Sceptres in Their hands, and being supported and attended as before.

The Archbishop then went on to the Post-Communion, at the end of which the Choir sang "Glory be to God on high," &c., and, the same having been concluded, the Archbishop pronounced the Blessing.

Thereupon the Choir sang the "Te Deum."

In the meantime, the Service having been concluded, His Majesty, attended as before, the four Swords being carried before Him, and the Lords who had carried the Regalia (then lying upon the Altar) descended into the Area, and passed through the door on the South side into St. Edward's Chapel; the Lords who had carried the Regalia received them from the Dean of Westminster as they passed by the Altar into the Chapel.

The Queen at the same time descended from Her Throne, and went into the same Chapel at the door on the North side of the Altar.

Their Majesties being in the Chapel, the King stood before the Altar and delivered the Sceptre with the Dove, which His Majesty had borne in His Left Hand, to the Archbishop, who laid it upon the Altar there.

His Majesty was disrobed of His Royal Robe of State, and arrayed in His Robe of Purple Velvet, by the Lord Great Chamberlain, and received His Crown of State; the Archbishop placing the Orb in His Majesty's Left Hand.

The Lords who had carried the Golden Spurs, and St. Edward's Staff, delivered the same to the Dean of Westminster, who deposited the same on the Altar in the Chapel.

Whilst Their Majesties were in St. Edward's Chapel, the Officers of Arms arranged the Procession for the Return, so that all were ready to move at the moment when the King and Queen left the Chapel.

Their Majesties proceeded out of the Choir, and to the West Door of the Abbey, Their Majesties wearing Their Crowns, the King bearing in His Right Hand the Sceptre with the Cross, and in His Left the Orb, and the Queen bearing in Her Right Hand Her Sceptre with the Cross, and in Her Left the Ivory Rod with the Dove. Their Royal Highnesses the Princes and Princesses wore their Coronets. The Four Swords were borne before the King, in the same order as before. The Dean and Prebendaries of Westminster, and the Bishops who had carried the Bible, the Paten and the Chalice, remained in the Choir. The Lords who had severally carried the Crowns, the Orb, the Sceptre with the Dove, the Golden Spurs, and St. Edward's Staff, walked in the same places as before; those who had Staves and Batons carried the same; Peers wore their Coronets and Kings of Arms their Crowns.

The Swords and the Regalia were received, near the West Door, by the Keeper of the Jewel House.

Their Majesties wearing Their Crowns, the King bearing in His Right Hand the Sceptre with the Cross, and in His Left the Orb, and the Queen bearing in Her Right

Hand Her Sceptre with the Cross, and in Her Left the Ivory Rod with the Dove, as before, and the Princes and Princesses of the Blood Royal and the Royal Guests returned to the Royal Palace with the same State as in their Proceeding to the Abbey, in the following order:—The Procession of Their Majesties the King and Queen, the Procession of the Royal Family, and the Procession of the Royal Guests. The route in returning was by Parliament Street, Whitehall, Cockspur Street, Pall Mall, St. James's Street, Piccadilly, Hyde Park Corner and Constitution Hill.
