The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 16th September, from His Majesty's Representative on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Board held on that date:—

(1) The medical visit in force against Beirut and Kerassonde suppressed.

(2) Ships from Salonica (which are subject to 24 hours' quarantine and disinfection) will be allowed to transit the Straits *en contumace*, after a favourable medical visit at the Dardanelles, and to go to the Kavak lazaret, where, however, they will have to wait their turn with the mass of other ships arriving there from the Black Sea, the Board assuming no responsibility for the loss of time thus caused. If a case of cholera is found on board at the Dardanelles, the ship will be repulsed to Clazomene.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH SEPTEMBER 1911.)

#### THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests

Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of the Order.*

1. This Order shall apply to Great Britain.

*Definitions.*

2. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"The Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry and currant bushes which is known as *Sphaerotheca mors-uvae* or American Gooseberry Mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:

"Garden" includes a plantation or field and a part of a garden, plantation or field:

"Bush" means a gooseberry bush or currant bush and includes a cutting, stock or seedling, and any part of a bush except the fruit:

"Landing" includes introduction through the post:

"Article" means Article of this Order.

*Notification of Disease.*

3. The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is, or appears to be, diseased shall forthwith notify the fact by post or otherwise to the Board, or to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease shall accompany the notice.

*Precaution to be Adopted in case of an Outbreak or Supposed Outbreak of Disease.*

4. No bush shall be moved from any garden in which disease exists or appears to exist until after the investigation required by the next Article.

*Investigation by Local Authority.*

5.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or apparent existence of disease shall forthwith take such steps as may be necessary to determine in what gardens the disease exists, and shall cause notice of such determination to be served on the occupier of each of such gardens which shall thereupon become "infected premises" and continue to be infected premises until the notice is withdrawn in accordance with Article 10, but the limits of the infected premises may be extended by a notice served by the Local Authority on the occupier of the infected premises.

(2.) The notice shall as far as practicable include in the infected premises only those parts of the garden in which there are or recently have been diseased bushes.

*Action to be taken by Local Authority after Preliminary Investigation.*

6.—(1.) The Local Authority may at any time and from time to time by a notice served on an occupier of infected premises require him to adopt such measures for prevention of

the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article and specified in the notice.

(2.) A notice under this Article may require the occupier of the premises as regards all or any of the bushes on the premises to adopt any one or more of the following measures:—

(a) to destroy on the infected premises the diseased fruit (if any) on each bush;

(b) to prune the bushes in such manner as may be directed by an Inspector of the Local Authority and to his satisfaction;

(c) at such time or times as may be specified, to spray the bushes thoroughly with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water), or with Bordeaux mixture, or with a solution of sulphate of copper, as may be directed by the notice;

(d) to spray in like manner the ground beneath each diseased bush and the site of each bush which has been destroyed on account of disease.

(3.) Nothing in this Order shall prevent the destruction by the owner thereof, by fire or other effective method, of any bush provided that such destruction takes place on the infected premises, and in such manner and with such precautions as may be prescribed in a notice served under this Article.

(4.) Where a Local Authority have consented to pay compensation for the destruction of bushes directed by notice served by them, the Local Authority may by a notice under this Article require the occupier of infected premises to destroy by burning or other effective method all or any of the bushes on the premises, and the Local Authority shall pay compensation for such destruction subject and according to the provisions in that behalf of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907.

(5.) All clippings arising from any pruning under this Article shall be forthwith destroyed on the infected premises by the occupier by burning or other effective method and in accordance with the directions (if any) given by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(6.) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

*Power to Require Adoption of Precautions on Premises in Vicinity of Infected Premises.*

7. The Local Authority may by a notice served on the occupier of any garden in which there are bushes to which the disease is likely to spread from infected premises in the vicinity, require such occupier, on or before such date as therein specified, to spray thoroughly all the bushes on such garden with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water).

*Precautions against Spread of Disease by Fruit Picking.*

8. Where the Local Authority are satisfied that the extent of the disease in any garden is such that the picking of any gooseberry, currant, or other fruit crop in the garden would be likely to spread the disease to other premises, the Local Authority may by a notice served on the occupier of the garden prohibit

the picking of fruit except upon such conditions as they think necessary for the prevention of the spread of disease.

*Precautions against Spread of Disease by Bushes.*

9.—(1) No bush shall be removed from infected premises except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) inserted in, a licence granted by the Board, or an officer of the Board; but this restriction shall not apply to the temporary removal of yearling bushes for the purpose of pruning and replanting them in the infected premises.

(2.) An Inspector of the Local Authority may within the district of the Local Authority, and an Inspector of the Board may anywhere in Great Britain, by a notice served on the owner or person in charge of any diseased bushes which are being moved or exposed for sale or of any bushes which have been moved in contravention of this Order, or on any person to whom any such bushes have been consigned for sale, prohibit the sale or exposure for sale of such bushes, and require the same either to be destroyed or returned to the premises from which they have been moved in contravention of this Order.

*Withdrawal of Notices of Infected Premises.*

10. A notice constituting any premises infected premises may be withdrawn by a notice signed by an officer of the Board. Unless there are special circumstances, a notice of withdrawal shall not be issued as regards any premises until the expiration of the year following that in which the disease has last been seen on the premises, unless the premises are before that date cleared of bushes.

*Destruction of Diseased Fruit.*

11. The Local Authority may, by a notice served on any person who has in his possession or under his charge any diseased fruit, require him to destroy the diseased fruit forthwith.

*Copies of Notices and Returns of Proceedings to be sent to the Board.*

12.—(1.) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by the Inspector by whom the notice is signed.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, in a form to be provided by the Board, notify the Board of any outbreak of disease.

*Information to be given as to Diseased Bushes or Fruit.*

13. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any diseased bush or fruit, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such bush or fruit shall, if so required in writing by the Board, or the Local Authority, or an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, give the Board, or the Local Authority, or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge it is or has been; Provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

*Powers of Entry.*

14. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, may for the purpose of enforcing this Order, enter any premises and examine any bush thereon.

*Prohibition of Importation of Bushes.*

15.—(1.) The landing in Great Britain of any bush brought from any place out of Great Britain (except the Channel Islands) is prohibited except as hereinafter provided.

(2.) This Article shall not apply to the landing of any currant bush under the authority of a licence authorising such landing previously obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

*Notification of Order.*

16. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Board.

*Powers of the Board and their Inspectors.*

17. The powers conferred by this Order on a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be exercised by the Board or an Inspector of the Board respectively and any notice served by a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be altered or revoked by a notice under this Order served by the Board or an Inspector of the Board.

*Offences.*

18. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—

- (1.) fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 3; or
- (2.) fails to prune or spray in manner prescribed by this Order or by any notice served on him under this Order any bush or other thing required under the Order or notice to be pruned or sprayed by him; or
- (3.) moves any bush in contravention of this Order; or
- (4.) fails to comply with the conditions inserted in a licence granted under this Order; or
- (5.) fails duly to destroy any fruit or clippings required under this Order or a notice thereunder to be destroyed by him; or
- (6.) fails to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in a notice served on him under Article 6; or
- (7.) picks or permits to be picked any crop or part of a crop in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 8, or fails to comply with the conditions of any such notice; or
- (8.) sells or exposes for sale any bushes in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 9, or fails either to destroy or return any bushes as required by any such notice; or
- (9.) without the written consent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, in Great Britain sells, or exposes for sale, or plants any bush which has been landed in contravention of this Order, knowing the same to have been so landed.
- (10.) refuses or fails to give any information

required under Article 13, or gives false information.

(1.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

#### *Execution of the Order.*

19.—(1.) Each Local Authority shall carry into effect this Order within their District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.

(2.) Any duty or power imposed or conferred on a Local Authority by this Order may be performed or exercised by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under and in accordance with any directions in that behalf given by the Local Authority.

(3.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by the clerk or an Inspector of a Local Authority or an Inspector of the Board shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority or the Board.

#### *Revocation of Order.*

20.—(1.) The American Gooseberry Mildew Order of 1909 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not—

- (i.) affect the previous operation of that Order or anything duly done or suffered under that Order; or
- (ii.) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under that Order; or

(iii.) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against that Order; or

(iv.) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

(2.) Every notice served, or licence granted, under the Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it were a notice or licence under this Order.

#### *Commencement.*

21. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

#### *Short Title.*

22. This Order may be cited as the AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDew ORDER of 1911.

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

URBAN DISTRICT OF BRAMPTON AND WALTON.

By Article 1 of the Order, sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, and 33, comprised in Part II; Part III; and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, and 67, comprised in Part IV of the said Act of 1907, shall be in force in the said District subject to the conditions and adaptations specified in the schedule to the Order and hereinafter referred to.

By Article 2 it is provided that the Order shall be published in one or more newspapers circulating in the District, and a statement of the effect of the Order in the London Gazette.

By Article 3 it is provided that the Order shall come into operation on the 30th day of October, 1911.

The schedule to the Order specifies certain conditions and stipulations to the under-mentioned sections:—Part II, sections 25, 27, and 30; Part III, sections 35 and 38; Part IV, section 59.

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF HAWORTH.

### NOTICE.

THE Local Government Board, having by an Order, dated the 15th day of September, 1911, declared certain parts and sections of the above Act to be in force within the above named Urban District, Notice is hereby given, that the effect of the said Order is, subject to the conditions and adaptations hereinafter mentioned, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—(1.) On and after the day on which the Order comes into operation sections 15 to 18 (inclusive), sections 20 to 33 (inclusive), comprised in Part II; sections 34 to 49 (inclusive), comprised in Part III; sections 52 to 60 (inclusive), 62 to 66 (inclusive), and 68, comprised in Part IV; Part V; and section 95, comprised in Part X of the said Act, shall be in force in the District.

(2.) Certain conditions and adaptations mentioned in the Schedules of the Order are to apply until further notice.

ARTICLE 2.—(1.) Contains directions with regard to Bye-laws made by the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the height of chimneys of buildings, and the Local Act cited in the first column of the Second Schedule of the Order shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule, be no longer in force in the District.

(2.) States where an enactment in a Local Act, other than the enactment specified in the Second Schedule of the Order, contains provisions which alter, amend, apply or otherwise relate to the enactment so specified, those provisions, to the extent to which they are inconsistent with any section or Part to which Article 1 of this Order applies, shall not be in force in the District on and after the day upon which that enactment in pursuance of sub-division (1) of this Article ceases to be in force in the District.

ARTICLE 3 contains directions as to advertising the Order.

ARTICLE 4 states that the Order shall come into operation on the 3rd day of November, 1911.

The Order is issued subject to the following conditions and adaptations:—

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Section Twenty-four.	" Nothing in any Local Act shall affect the making or confirmation of any bye-law under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to any subject matter specified in this section."

" The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connexion with dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exerciseable."
Section Twenty-seven.	" (7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."
Section Thirty.	" Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or other structure in so far as the same is used either for the support of any street or public footpath, or for the protection of any street or public footpath from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after the street or footpath became a highway repair-

able by the inhabitants at large by or at the expense of a person other than the highway authority responsible for the repair of the street or footpath."

#### PART III.

##### Section Thirty-five.

" This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875."

" Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not, in relation to any subject matter of this section, be of any force or effect within the district."

##### Section Thirty-eight.

" Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier or premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

#### PART IV.

Section Fifty-nine. " (6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

#### Part V.

Section Seventy-five. " (3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the local authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."

Section Twenty-five. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connexion with dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exerciseable."

Section Twenty-seven. "(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

Section Thirty. "Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or other structure in so far as the same is used either for the support of any street or public footpath, or for the protection of any street or public footpath from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after

"Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

PART IV.

Section Fifty-nine. "(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

PART V.

Section Seventy-five.

"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the Local Authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."
