The Board of Trade have received a copy of a Despatch, dated the 26th September, from His Majesty's Consul at Rouen, stating that, in accordance with instructions received by the Health Authorities at the port of Rouen, all vessels from Tunis must stop at the port of Havre, and there be subjected to quarantine inspection before proceeding to Rouen.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 16th September, from His Majesty's Representative on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Board held on that date:—

(1) The medical visit in force against Beirut and Kerássonde suppressed.

(2) Ships from Salonica (which are subject to 24 hours' quarantine and disinfection) will be allowed to transit the Straits *en contumace*, after a favourable medical visit at the Dardanelles, and to go to the Kavak lazaret, where, however, they will have to wait their turn with the mass of other ships arriving there from the Black Sea, the Board assuming no responsibility for the loss of time thus caused. If a case of cholera is found on board at the Dardanelles, the ship will be repulsed to Clazomene.
