His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome a communication to the following effect:—

The Italian Government has notified the establishment of an effective blockade from September 29th by Italian Ships of War of the coast of Cyrenaica and Tripoli, from the frontier of Egypt to that of Tunis, between 11° 32′ and 27° 54′ longitude east of Cranwick

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome a telegram stating that the Italian Government have issued a Declaration with respect to articles deemed by them to be Contraband of War during the existing hostilities between Italy and Turkey.

This Declaration, it is stated, specifies cannon, firearms, and sidearms of all descriptions, munitions of war, military tools of all kinds, and generally everything which without manipulation can be put to immediate use in connection with maritime or land warfare.

As soon as the actual text of the Declaration is received by His Majesty's Government it will be published in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the 9th day of September, 1907, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, made certain regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations ''), with respect to cholera, yellow fever, and plague;

And whereas by Article VI of the Regulations it is provided that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming from a foreign port shall, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be an infected ship or a suspected ship within the meaning of the Regulations shall, as required by Article X of the Regulations, moor or anchor the ship; and it is further provided by Article VI that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent; in which case the place so fixed shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within that jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the Rural District Council of Grimsby, being a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Regulations, and herein-after referred to as "the Sanitary Authority," propose, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Grimsby, to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and indicated by a circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship certified as aforesaid may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the

matter:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the said Acts and by the Regulations, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby declare, order and direct as follows:

ARTICLE I .- We consent to the Sanitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Customs Portof Grimsby, the waters included within the circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order as the place where any ship, bound to any place within the district of the Sanitary Authority, and certified as aforesaid, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and the Regulations shall apply, to any ship certified as aforesaid which, in pursuance of the Regulations or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinbefore mentioned, and to any such ship so certified which shall be on its way thither for the purpose of being so moored.

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:---

"Modification of Order.

1. The Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Division of Scheduled District into Three Zones.

- 2. The Scheduled District described in the Schedule to the principal Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District") shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the three zones described in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone No. I, Zone No. II, and Zone No. III) to which the following provisions of this Order shall apply; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise—
 - (i.) movement of animals into or out of Zone No. I or along, over or across any high-
 - way or thoroughfare therein; or
 (ii.) movement of animals out of the Scheduled District except where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District; or
 - (iii.) the holding of any market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals on any premises situate within the Scheduled District.
- Movement by Railway from outside Scheduled District for immediate Slaughter in Zones II and III.
- 3. An animal may be moved by railway from outside the Scheduled District to a railway station in such District and thence to the nearest available slaughter-house situate either in Zone No. II or Zone No. III, subject to the following conditions:
 - (i.) The animal, while being moved from the railway station to the slaughter-house, shall be accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate, and shall, as far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved.

 (ii.) The animal shall be moved to the

slaughter-house specified in the licence by the route therein described, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

Movement into Zones Nos. II and III or within Zone No. III for Immediate Slaughter.

- 4. An animal may also be moved from premises situate either outside the Scheduled District or within Zone No. III to a slaughterhouse situate in Zone No. III, or from premises situate in Zone No. III to a slaughter-house in Zone No. II, subject to the following con-
 - (i.) The animal shall be accompanied during the movement by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate.

(ii.) The animal shall before the movement is commenced be marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner follow-

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(iii.) The animal shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, where it shall be detained until it is slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- 5. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising-
 - (i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-andmouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Provisions as to Farms on Borders of Zones.

6. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the zone, and where the farm extends to two zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner zone.

Granting of Licences.

7.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(2:) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is

granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(3.) A copy of a Licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughter-house specified in the licence in any case in which the slaughter-house is situate in

another district.

(4.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the said movement.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

 Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Name and Addresses.

- 10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

12. In this Order—
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"The Board" means the Board of Agri-

culture and Fisheries.

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats,

and swine.
"Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title.

 This Order may be cited as the Somerset (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER of 1911 No. 2), and shall be read with the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911.
