The KING was pleased, on Tuesday, the 10th instant, at Buckingham Palace, to present to James Moulder and Jack Hewitt the Albert Medals of the Second Class conferred upon them by His Majesty for gallantry in saving or endeavouring to save life, as detailed below:—

JAMES MOULDER.

On the 12th July last, Mr. Petty, aged 72, a manufacturer of fireworks, was at work in one of the sheds of his factory at Barton Moss, near Manchester, charging bombs, when an explosion occurred, followed a few moments later by a second and more violent explosion. As a result of the explosions the shed was partially wrecked and set on fire, while Mr. Petty was hurled to the ground and pinned down among the burning débris. His son, who was approaching the shed at the time, was

caught and knocked down by the second explosion. Mr. James Moulder, a farmer, was working in a field about one hundred and fifty yards away, and, on hearing the first explosion, ran towards the shed. He had covered about forty yards when the second explosion occurred, and he saw Mr. Petty's son knocked down, but, regardless of the risk of further explosions, he ran on, and, entering the burning shed, brought Mr. Petty out from amongst the mass of burning wreckage and exploding fireworks to a place of safety.

JACK HEWITT.

On the evening of May 11th last a boy friend of Hewitt's, named Drury, aged nine, was playing on the quay by the side of the River Ouse at Goole, when he overbalanced and fell into ten feet of water. As the river at that point is as broad as the Thames at London Bridge, and a strong tide was flowing, Drury, who could not swim, was in immediate danger of being swept away and drowned. Hewitt, a lad but one year older than his companion, without a moment's hesitation, jumped into the river to his rescue, fully dressed, and, though both were carried out some yards by the tide, succeeded in seizing Drury, and after skilfully controlling his struggles and turning him over on his back, brought him in to the bank, where both were helped out.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to William Brandon and Herbert Carter

On the 23rd June, 1911, Alfred Butterfield, a workman employed by the Luton Corporation, descended a sump hole at the Luton Sewage Farm, and was overcome by foul gas which had accumulated there. William Brandon immediately went to his rescue and descended the hole, but was overcome by the gas. In spite of the serious danger disclosed by the previous attempt at rescue, Herbert Carter, decided to make the descent, and, placing a handkerchief over his mouth, was lowered by two ropes into the hole. There he found that Butterfield was dead and Brandon was unconscious. He placed a rope round Brandon, and they were both drawn to the surface. Carter then descended again, and attached a rope to the body of Butterfield.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Eastbourne) Order, 1911.

Dated 10th October, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Eastbourne, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Eastbourne) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Lapwing, Plover, Redshank and other Sand Pipers, Snipe, Wild Swan, Mallard, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of East-bourne to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Blue-throat, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Bunting, Corn Bunting (Yenon Buzzard, Snow Bunting, Yellow Common Hammer), Bustard, Chiffchaff, Corn Buzzard, Crake (Land Rail), Spotted Crake, Golden-eyed Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (both species), Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Glossy Ibis, Kestrel, Linnet (brown and green), Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redstart, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

The House Sparrow deprived of Protection.

· IV. The whole of the County Borough of Eastbourne is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Uertain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Eastbourne.

Avocet, Blue-throat, Chough, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldeneyed Duck, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenshank, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hoopoe, Glossy Ibis, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Ringed Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redpole, Dusky Redshank, Spotted Sandpiper, Wood Sandpiper, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Spoonbill, Temminck's Stint, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the County Borough of Eastbourne.

Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Eastbourne:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Blue-throat, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Rednecked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover, Wood Sandpiper, Redbacked Shrike, Spoonbill, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Wood-

pecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Goldencrested Wren, Wryneck.
