The House Sparrow deprived of Protection.

IV. The whole of the County Borough of Eastbourne is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Eastbourne.

Avocet, Blue-throat, Chough, Spotted Crane, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Golden-eyed Duck, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenshank, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hoopoe, Glossy Ibis, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Ringed Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redpole, Dusky Redshank, Spotted Sandpiper, Wood Sandpiper, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Spoonbill, Temminck's Stint, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the County Borough of Eastbourne.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Eastbourne:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Blue-throat, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Spotted Crane, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover, Wood Sandpiper, Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Wood-

pecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.
