Chancery of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Downing Street, October 20th, 1911.

Sir Francis John Stephens Hopwood, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., and Sir Charles Prestwood Lucas, K.C.M.G., C.B., having ceased to be Members of the Colonial Office, have resigned the offices of Secretary and Registrar respectively of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; and the King, as Sovereign and Chief of the said Most Distinguished Order, has been pleased to direct that those offices shall in future be held ex-officio by the Permanent Under Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Senior Assistant Under Secretary of State for the Colonies respectively.
