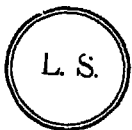
Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 18th October, 1911.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Ardwick Sub-district of Chorlton Registration District should be divided into four Sub-districts, to be formed as far as possible of entire Wards of Manchester City and County Borough, in the following manner, viz.:—(a) A Sub-district to be called and known as Ardwick Sub-district, and to consist of the whole of Ardwick Ward and all that part of Longsight Ward situated in Chorlton Registration District; (b) a Sub-district to be called and known as Openshaw Sub-district, and to consist of Openshaw and St. Mark's Wards; (c) a Sub-district to be

called and known as Rusholme Sub-district, and to consist of the whole of Levenshulme North and Levenshulme South Wards, and the part of Rusholme Ward situated in Ardwick Sub-district, as hitherto constituted; and (d) a Sub-district to be called and known as Gorton Sub-district, and to consist of Gorton North and Gorton South Wards;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 18th October, 1911.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—
