# TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

The Imperial Ottoman Government has communicated to His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople the following List of Articles which it will deem to be contraband of war during the hostilities between Turkey and Italy. This Notice should, however, be read in conjunction with that which appeared in the London Gazette of the 17th instant:—

- 1. Arms of all kinds, including arms for sporting purposes, and their distinctive component parts.
  - 2. Projectiles, charges, and cartridges of all

kinds and their distinctive component parts, shot, screwplates.

- 3. Powder and explosives specially prepared for use in war, saltpetre, sulphate of potash, muriate of potash, sulphur.
  - 4. Gun mountings, limber boxes, limbers.
- 5. Waggons, iron machines employed in warfare as well as tools and implements and their distinctive component parts.
- 6. Clothing and equipment of a distinctively military character, military harness of all kinds, saddle, draught, and pack animals suitable for use in war.
- 7. Articles of camp equipment and their distinctive component parts.
- 8. Cuirasses and armour plates of copper, iron and other materials.
- 9. Warships, including boats, and their distinctive component parts of such a nature that they can only be used on a vessel of war.
- 10. Implements and apparatus designed exclusively for the manufacture of munitions of war, for the manufacture or repair of arms, or war material for use on land or sea.
- 11. Animals and beasts of all sorts, meat, preserved meat, ships' biscuit, cereals, all kinds of preserves, and foodstuffs.
  - 11 (bis). Cereals (conditional).
- · 12. Forage and grain suitable for feeding animals.
- 13. Clothing, fabrics for clothing, boots and shoes suitable for use in war.
  - 14. Gold and silver in coin or bullion.
- 15. Bank notes, cheques, and other paper money.
- 16. Vehicles of all kinds available for use in war and their component parts.
- 17. Vessels, craft, and boats of all kinds, as well as material for ship building.
- 18. Floating docks, parts of docks and their component parts, cables, sails, tar, propellers and screws ("hélices et vis"), wheels of all kinds, cylinders, bolts, winches, plates for repairing boilers, hydraulic and other cement, resin, pitch, zinc, hemp, and (?) corner plates ("cornières").
- 19. Railway material, engines and rolling stock, material for telegraphs, wireless telegraphs, telephones and insulators.
- 20. Balloons and flying machines and their distinctive component parts, together with accessories and articles recognizable as intended for use in connection with balloons and flying machines.
- 21. Fuel, material for lighting and burning, naphtha, sulphuric acid.
- 22. Powder and explosives not specially prepared for use in war.
- 23. Barbed wire, and implements for fixing and cutting the same.
  - 24. Horseshoes and shoeing material.
- 25. Harness and saddlery, field glasses, telescopes, chronometers and other nautical instruments
- 26. Round iron bars of  $\frac{3}{4}$  or  $\frac{5}{8}$  of an inch, rivets, all pieces of iron of a thickness exceeding  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an inch.
- 27. Provisions pickled and salted in vinegar, oil, etc.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 18th October, from His Majesty's Consul at Rouen, stating that, in accordance with instructions received by the Health Authorities at that port, the

quarantine inspection hitherto in force on vessels arriving from the Baltic has been discontinued.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, October 23, 1911. H. 13192.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 10th October, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions, relative to vessels (other than pilgrim ships) bound from India and the Far East to ports in the Ottoman Empire, were taken at a meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health held on the 3rd October:—

1. Ordinary vessels (not pilgrim ships) coming from India, under good sanitary conditions, will on their arrival be put into quarantine—to be passed at one of the Lazarettos of the Empire—for as many days as may be necessary to complete a period of ten days, calculated from the date of departure from the last Indian port of call. These vessels will be disinfected, and the regulations with regard to rat destruction, defined in Circular 180, will be applied.

2. Ordinary vessels which may have completed, during the voyage, the period of ten days calculated from the date of departure from the last Indian port of call will, on their arrival under good sanitary conditions, be subjected to a medical visit, disinfection, and also to the regulations concerning rat destruction.

In the event of the medical inspection being favourable, these vessels will obtain free pratique immediately after disinfection.

3. Only vessels that carry a properly certified medical officer can benefit by the above decisions; vessels having no medical officer on board will be subjected to the measures enumerated above, and also be subjected to a further 24 hours' observation.

4. The operation of rat destruction on board will not interfere or delay the admittance of vessels to free pratique, as this operation can be performed whilst vessels are undergoing quarantine or after free pratique has been given. In no case, however, will a vessel be permitted to ship a new cargo until the operation of rat destruction has been carried out.

5. Ordinary vessels coming from the Far East having foul bills of health will be subjected to the measures indicated above; should they, however, possess clean bills of health, free pratique will be given after a favourable medical visit.

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 6).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

### Further alteration of Zone III.

1. The Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 5) and the Orders referred to therein as "the existing Orders" shall be read and have effect as if the Zone described in the Schedule hereto were substituted for Zone III to which the aforesaid Orders apply.

### Movement into and within Zone II.

- 2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from outside the Scheduled District or from premises situate in Zones II or III to premises in Zone II, if accompanied during the movement in the Scheduled District by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with the provisions at present governing the movement of animals into and within Zone III.
- (2.) Nothing in this Article or in the abovementioned Orders shall be construed as authorising the movement of an animal out of Zone II.
- (3.) Article 4 of the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3) and Article 5 of the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 5) are hereby revoked.
- (4.) Article 7 of the first-mentioned Order shall be read as if the reference therein to Zone II were omitted.

# Movement into or within Zone I for immediate Slaughter.

3. An animal may be moved from any premises to a slaughter-house in Zone I subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The animal shall be accompanied during the movement in the Scheduled District by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3) relating to Movement Licences.

(ii.) The animal shall before the movement in the Scheduled District is commenced be marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep, with the following composition,

namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

#### Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and eleven.

### Short Title and Construction.

5. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 6), and shall be read with the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).
