ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH OCTOBER 1911.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
 virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
 them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
 to 1911, and of every other power enabling
 them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby
 ordered, as follows:

No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be
 moved along, over or across any drove in Zone
 I as defined by the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth
 Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 5), whether it is a
 highway or thoroughfare or not, except with a
 Movement Licence under an Order of the
 Board or permission in writing granted by an
 Inspector of the Board or of the Local
 Authority of the District.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH OCTOBER 1911.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
 virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
 them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
 to 1911, and of every other power enabling
 them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby
 ordered, as follows:

The restrictions on movement of swine im-
 posed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of
 Movement) Order of 1908 shall not apply to
 the movement of swine from the sale mentioned
 in the Schedule hereto to any premises (not
 being a Swine-Fever Infected Place) situate in
 either of the administrative counties of Norfolk
 and East and West Suffolk or in the county
 boroughs of Norwich or Ipswich if the swine
 are accompanied by a licence in the Form F
 set forth in the First Schedule to the said
 Order granted by an Inspector of the Local
 Authority of the county of Norfolk and the
 following conditions are complied with:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place
 of destination specified in the licence and
 not elsewhere and shall be there detained and
 kept separate from all other swine for
 twenty-eight days, unless they are slaugh-
 tered on such premises before the expiration
 of that period, or are moved under and in
 accordance with the conditions of a licence in
 the Form C set forth in the said First
 Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughter-
 house in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the
 nearest available route and without unneces-
 sary delay, and during the movement shall,
 so far as is practicable, be kept separate from
 all swine not being moved with a licence
 under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement
 the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at
 or sent by post to, the nearest police-station
 in the same District by the person in charge
 of the swine at the time of completing such
 movement.

A licence under this Order shall for the pur-
 poses of the above-mentioned Order be treated
 as a licence under that Order.
