GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

Information having been received that an infectious or contagious disease, dangerous to mankind, to wit bubonic plague, exists in the port of Mazagan and in the Dukkala province, Morocco, it is hereby declared that the port of Mazagan and the Dukkala province, Morocco,

are infected places, within the meaning of Article 1 of the Regulations made under the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, 1908, republished by Government Notice No. 207 of the 13th July, 1911, and amended by Government Notices No. 224 of the 29th July, 1911; No. 252 of the 22nd August, 1911; No. 294 of the 28th September, 1911; and No. 316 of the 13th October, 1911.
