

3. Measures increased against Caiffa to 24 hours' observation and disinfection.

4. Arrivals and departures to or from Constantinople and Marmora Ports to have medical visit only.

On the 19th October the Board of Health decided to impose a medical visit at the first Ottoman port of call on all arrivals from Beyrouth, where cholera has made its appearance.

On the 21st October the Board decided to suppress the medical visit which has been in force on arrivals from the ports of Zougouldak, Kilimli, Cozlou, and Erigli (Black Sea).

On the 23rd October the Board decided to suppress the medical visit imposed on arrivals from Fatza (Black Sea).

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 28th October, from His Majesty's Consul at Christiania, transmitting the following translation of a Circular, dated the 27th October, issued by the Norwegian Government, relating to places infected with cholera and plague:—

The following are to be regarded as infected with cholera until further notice:—The Provinces of Cagliari in Sardinia and Bari in Italy.

The town of Marseilles, the Russian Governments of Samara and Kherson, with the towns of Odessa and Nicolaieff, the towns of Novorossisk and Baku, and the Italian towns of Leghorn and Syracuse are struck off the list of places infected with cholera.
