ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH NOVEMBER 1911.)

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 8).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone II.

1. The provisions of the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders Nos. 1-7 which relate to Zone II shall cease to operate, and the Scheduled District for the purposes of those Orders shall comprise only Zone I as described in the Schedule to the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 5).

Movement within Zone I.

2. An animal may be moved from any premises in Zone I to any other premises in that zone if accompanied during the movement by

a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector or officer of the Board.

Movement out of Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.

3. An animal may be moved out of Zone I by road direct to a slaughter-house if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Somerset, subject to and in accordance with the following conditions, namely:—

(i.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall be granted only in respect of an animal which immediately before the issue of the Licence has been examined by a veterinary surgeon, and been certified by him to be free from any symptoms of foot-and-mouth disease;

(ii.) Before the movement is commenced the animal shall be marked by, and at the expense of, the owner, in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep, with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title and Construction.

5. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 8), and shall be read with the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).
