WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded at Bangkok on the 4th day of March, 1911, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King

of Siam, for the Extradition of Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Siam, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should under certain circumstances be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: Arthur Peel, Esquire, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Bangkok, etc.

And His Majesty the King of Siam: H.R.H. Prince Devawongse Varoprakar, His Minister for Foreign Affairs, etc.,

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other persons over whom

they respectively exercise jurisdiction who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 2.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt, or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Malicious wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted or intended for counterfeiting coin.
6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered.
7. Embezzlement or larceny.
8. Malicious injury to property, by explosives or otherwise, if the offence be indictable.
9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
12. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member or public officer of any company made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
14. Rape.
15. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of puberty, according to the laws of the respective countries.
16. Indecent assault.
17. Procuring miscarriage, administering drugs, or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
18. Abduction.
19. Child stealing.
20. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
22. Burglary or housebreaking.
23. Arson.
24. Robbery with violence.
25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.
26. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort.
27. Piracy by law of nations.
28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
29. Assaults on board ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life, or do grievous bodily harm.
30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
31. Dealing in slaves in such a manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition is to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both contracting parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which according to the law of both of the contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 3.

Either Government may, at its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Siam, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Siam or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of Siam, should be under examination for any crime in the territory of Siam or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 5.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is deemed by the Party on whom the demand is made to be one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 6.

A person surrendered can in no case be detained or tried in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 7.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition for extradition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a copy of the judgment passed on the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sen-

tenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE 8.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive. The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

ARTICLE 9.

When either of the contracting Parties considers the case urgent it may apply for the provisional arrest of the criminal and the safe keeping of any objects relating to the offence.

Such request will be granted, provided the existence of a sentence or warrant of arrest is proved, and the nature of the offence of which the fugitive is accused is clearly stated.

The warrant of arrest to which this Article refers should be issued by the competent authorities of the country applying for extradition. The accused shall on arrest be sent as speedily as possible before a competent Magistrate:

ARTICLE 10.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.
3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for

trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. The fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

ARTICLE 12.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE 13.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 14.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered, at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE 15.

The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered and his conveyance till placed on board the ship; they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

ARTICLE 16.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any such Colony or foreign possession may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a consular officer of Siam.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the laws of such Colonies or foreign possessions will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governors or chief authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Siam who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be,

and so far as the laws of such Colonies or foreign possessions will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 17.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London, as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at Bangkok, the fourth day of March, 1911, in the 129th Year of "Ratanakosindr."

And whereas the ratifications of the above Treaty were exchanged at London on the 1st day of August, 1911;

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 24th day of November, 1911, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Siam under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 4th March, 1911.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I. of chapter 155 of "The Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906," and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

part of the north by the said township of Cleadon, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon a small part of the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the south-eastern corner of the said township of Cleadon where the boundary which divides that township from the said township of Whitburn diverges northward from following the northern side of Moorlane, and extending thence first southward and then eastward along the middle of Moorlane for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Blue House, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to the middle of the gateway leading into the premises attached to the said house, and extending thence first eastward and then southward along the line of fences in continuation of the line of the eastern side of the said roadway for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to a point on the northern side of the stream called Cut Throat Dene, and continuing thence southward in the same direction and in a straight line to a point in the middle of the said stream upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Whitburn from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth."

hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. "Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Chadderton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid, and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of

any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:

TEMPORARY ORDER: Relief to Able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families.

WANDSWORTH UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Wandsworth and Clapham Union (now known as the Wandsworth Union), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

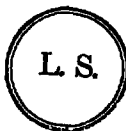
ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the workhouse, shall not be absent from the workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the Thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

Reception and Relief of Metropolitan Casual
Paupers.

THE METROPOLITAN CASUAL
PAUPERS ORDER, 1911.

To the Board of Management of the
Metropolitan Asylum District:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the
several Poor Law Unions comprised in
the said District:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Metropolitan
Poor Act, 1867, Asylums to be supported and
managed according to the provisions of that
Act may be provided for the reception and
relief of the sick, insane, or infirm, or other
class or classes of the poor chargeable in Unions
and Parishes in the Metropolis;

And whereas in pursuance of section 6 of
that Act the Poor Law Board by their Order
dated the 15th day of May, 1867, directed that
the Unions and Parishes mentioned in that
Order should be combined into a district, to
be termed the Metropolitan Asylum District
(hereinafter referred to as "the Asylum Dis-
trict") for the reception and relief of the
several classes of poor persons mentioned in the
Order, chargeable to some Union or Parish
within the Asylum District, and that a Board
of Management (hereinafter referred to as
"the Managers") should be constituted for
the Asylum District;

And whereas section 10 of the Pauper In-
mates Discharge and Regulation Act, 1871,
provides that where any district thereafter
formed by the Local Government Board for the
relief of the casual poor or any other class or
classes under section 6 of the Metropolitan
Poor Act, 1867, is conterminous with any dis-
trict previously formed under the same section
for the relief of some other class or classes, the
Board may by Order direct that the managers
of any such last-mentioned district shall be
the managers also of all or any of the districts
conterminous with it which may be subse-
quently formed, and the expenses of providing
any asylum for the reception and relief of the
casual poor under section 5 of the Metropolitan
Poor Act, 1867, and the maintenance of such
poor therein, shall be repayable in like manner
as expenses for the provision of wards for the
same class of poor under section 69 of the said
Act;

And whereas it is expedient to form for the
relief of the casual poor a district which shall
be conterminous with the Asylum District;

And whereas various buildings have been set
apart and provided with the approval of Us,
the Local Government Board, or Our pre-
decessors, as casual wards for the purposes of
the Metropolitan Houseless Poor Acts, 1864
and 1865, and the said buildings are in use as
Workhouses of the several Poor Law Unions
in the Metropolis;

And whereas it is expedient that further pro-
vision should be made in the matter as herein-
after set forth:

NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local
Government Board, in pursuance of the powers
given to Us by the Metropolitan Poor Act,
1867, the Pauper Inmates Discharge and Regu-

lation Act, 1871, and of every other power
enabling Us in that behalf, hereby Order and
Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—This Order shall come into
operation from and after the Thirty-first day of
March, One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

ARTICLE II.—In this Order—

The expression "casual pauper" means
any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying
for or receiving relief;

The expression "casual ward" means any
ward or wards, building, or premises set
apart or provided for the reception, relief or
employment of casual paupers by the Board
of Guardians of any Poor Law Union situate
within the Metropolis;

The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies as
it applies to an Act of Parliament.

ARTICLE III.—A district conterminous with
the Asylum District shall be formed under sec-
tion 6 of the Metropolitan Poor Act, 1867, for
the relief of the casual poor (hereinafter re-
ferred to as "the District"), and the Managers
of the Asylum District shall be the Managers
of the District.

ARTICLE IV.—(1) Subject to such conditions
and regulations as We may hereafter by Order
prescribe, the casual wards to be specified in
the Schedule to such Order, together with all
separate entrances thereto, and the yards and
outbuildings usually occupied or used in con-
nection therewith, respectively, shall, with such
alterations and additions as We may from time
to time declare to be necessary, be used for the
asylum or asylums for the casual poor and shall
be for the common use of the District.

(2) Subject to any special terms or conditions
which may be agreed upon with Our consent,—

(a) all the officers and servants of the
Guardians of any such Poor Law Union as
aforesaid who at the date when this Order
comes into operation are solely employed in
connection with the relief of the casual poor
in such Poor Law Union shall become the
officers and servants of the Managers, but
shall hold their offices by the same tenure as
at that date, and shall receive not less salary
than they were at that date receiving.

(b) the Managers may arrange with the
Board of Guardians of any such Poor Law
Union as aforesaid for the joint employment
by the Managers and the Board of Guardians
of any of their respective officers and ser-
vants. Pending the completion of any such
arrangement, the officers and servants who
do not become officers and servants of the
Managers by virtue of this Order shall be
deemed to remain in the employment in
which they are engaged immediately prior to
the date when this Order comes into opera-
tion.

ARTICLE V.—Subject to the provisions of
any statute, order, or regulation which has been
or may hereafter be passed or made, Our Order
dated the eighteenth day of December, one
thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, pre-
scribing Regulations with respect to casual
paupers shall apply and have effect in the Dis-
trict as if in that Order references were made
to the asylums instead of to casual wards and
as if the Managers and the appropriate officers
of the Managers were referred to instead of
the Guardians and the Master and Matron of
the Workhouse respectively.

ARTICLE VI.—Every casual pauper who may become an inmate of an asylum shall be deemed to have been sent to the asylum from the Parish in which his application for relief was made or, if no application for relief was made by him, from the Parish from which he was in fact removed into the asylum.

ARTICLE VII.—In the event of any difference arising between the Managers and the Guardians of any Poor Law Union in reference to any matter provided for in this Order the difference shall be settled as We may determine.

ARTICLE VIII.—This Order may be cited as the Metropolitan Casual Paupers Order, 1911.

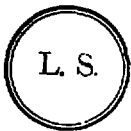

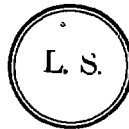

3. GILLINGHAM PIER (PROVISIONAL ORDER).

(Application for Provisional Order for Power to Construct a Pier, Jetty, Pavilion, and Other Works at Gillingham, in the County of Kent; Tolls and Charges for Use of Pier, &c.; Bye-laws, &c.; Powers to Dredge; Incorporation, Amendment, and Repeal of Acts; and for Other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861, and the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act, and any other Acts enabling them in that behalf application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December next by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Gillingham, in the County of Kent (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following, among other purposes (that is to say):—

To empower the Corporation to construct and maintain the works hereinafter described, or some part or parts thereof (that is to say):—

(1.) A pier, jetty, pavilion and approaches thereto in the River Medway,

commencing at a point on the right bank of the said river about 10 feet east of the causeway known as Commodore Hard, in the Borough of Gillingham, in the County of Kent, and running parallel to it, and measured in a north north-easterly direction for the distance of 800 feet or thereabouts from the shore end of the said causeway, and thence terminating, together with all proper landing stages, landing places, lamps, lamp posts, electric light apparatus, gas and water pipes, tramways, rails, roads, foot-paths, sheds, offices, toll-houses, toll gates or bars, cranes, hydraulic lifts, buoys, moorings, sewers, drains, and other works and conveniences connected therewith.

(2.) To erect, construct, alter, and maintain upon the said pier and works, or the approaches thereto, or upon any lands held by them in connection with the pier undertaking, saloons, pavilions, assembly, concert, waiting, refreshment, reading and other rooms, shops, bazaars, kiosks, shelters, automatic machines, aquaria, lavatories, swimming and other baths, and conveniences with suitable approaches thereto.

(3.) To deviate in constructing the pier and works, or any of them, laterally or vertically, as shewn on the plans and sections hereinafter mentioned.

(4.) To cross, alter, stop up, temporarily or permanently or otherwise interfere with foreshores, roads, streets, passages, sewers, drains, watercourses, water and other pipes and apparatus which it may be necessary or expedient to interfere with in the construction of the intended works, or any of them.

(5.) To purchase, take on lease, or otherwise acquire by agreement or licence, the lands, foreshore, groins, houses, or hereditaments necessary for the purposes of the said pier, pavilion, jetty, works and buildings, and the approaches thereto.

(6.) To demand, levy, take and recover tolls, rates, rents, dues and charges upon or in respect of the use of the said pier, jetty, pavilion, and works from all persons and in respect of all vessels using same, and upon or from passengers, animals and luggage landed or embarked or disembarked at or from the said pier, jetty and landing stages, and from persons using the said pier as a promenade or for purposes of recreation, and to make charges for admission to the pavilion and other buildings on the pier or jetty, and from time to time to alter such tolls, rates, rents, dues and charges, to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from such tolls, rates, rents, dues and charges, to compound and agree with any person or persons with respect to the payment of such tolls, rates, rents, dues and charges, and to confer, vary or extinguish other rights and privileges.

(7.) To deepen, dredge, scour and excavate any portion of the foreshore so far as may be necessary to secure a sufficient waterway and approach to the said pier, jetty, landing stages, and works for vessels using the same, and to remove any clay, rock, sand, mud or other material.

(8.) To provide for lights for the protection of navigation and otherwise in connection with the works to be authorized by the Order.

(9.) To make bye-laws, rules and regulations for the management, use, and protection of the said pier, jetty, pavilion, works and property, and the control and regulation of vessels, persons, animals, goods and vehicles using the same and the approaches thereto, and the conduct of the officers and servants, and to impose penalties for the breach or non-observance of any such bye-laws, rules and regulations, and of any provisions of the Order, and to appoint and remove pier-masters, toll-takers, and other officers and servants, and to define the limits within which the powers of such pier-masters, toll-takers, officers, and servants may be exercised.

(10.) To close the proposed pier on special occasions, and to make such special and increased charges on those occasions as they may think fit.

(11.) To vary or extinguish all or any other rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights and privileges.

(12.) To enable the Corporation to light the pier, jetty, pavilion, and other works and buildings, and to supply gas or electricity thereto, either for lighting or power purposes, or to enter into and carry into effect agreements with regard to the lighting of the pier, jetty, pavilion, and other works and buildings, and for the supply of power thereto.

(13.) To incorporate with the Order the provisions, or some of the provisions of the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, the Harbours, Docks, and Pier Clauses Acts, 1847, and the Lands Clauses Acts, and to confer upon the Corporation the powers and facilities contained in the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 and the General Pier and Harbour 1861 Amendment Act, and such other powers and provisions as may be deemed expedient.

(14.) To alter, amend, repeal or vary, or to incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Gillingham Pier Order, 1869, confirmed by the Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation Act, 1869.

(15.) To authorize the Corporation to apply to the purposes of the Order or any of them any funds, moneys, rates, rents, pier or other tolls now belonging to them, or which they have power to raise or levy, and to raise additional funds, by mortgage or otherwise, on the security of the undertaking, and the lands and property of the Corporation, and on the security of the tolls, rates, dues, and charges leviable under the said Order of 1869 and the Order, or by mortgage of the borough fund and borough rate, or by bond or by way of annuity, or by debenture stock charged on the rates and revenues of the Corporation, or by all or any of the aforesaid means, and to attach to any such mortgages and securities such priorities or preference as may be necessary, or as the Corporation may deem expedient, and to make such other provisions for effectively securing the payment and repayment of all interest and of all principal sums borrowed on the before mentioned securities as may be deemed expedient, or as the Order may define.

And notice is hereby also given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant plans and sections of the proposed works, and a copy of this notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Kent at his office at Sessions House, Maidstone, at the Custom House at Rochester, in the said county of Kent, and at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London, S.W.

All companies, corporations, bodies, or persons desirous of making any representation to the Board of Trade, or of bringing before that Board any objections respecting the application for the Order, may do so by letter addressed to the Assistant Secretary of the Harbour Department of the said Board on or before the 20th day of January next, and a copy of such objections must at the same time

be sent to the undersigned Solicitor or Parliamentary Agents for the Order, and in forwarding the objections to the Board of Trade the objectors or their agents should state that this has been done.

Printed copies of the draft of the Provisional Order will be furnished by the undersigned at their offices as under mentioned to all persons applying for the same, on or after the 23rd day of December next, at the price of 1s. each.
