PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Prime Minister. Lord President. Lord Privy Seal. Lord Chamberlain.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominious specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded at Bangkok on the 4th day of March, 1911, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King

of Siam, for the Extradition of Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Siam, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should under certain circumstance's be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: Arthur Peel, Esquire, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Bangkok, etc.

And His Majesty the King of Siam: H.R.H. Prince Devawongse Varoprakar, His

Minister for Foreign Affairs, etc.,
Who, having communicated to each other
their respective full powers, found in good
and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following articles:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other persons over whom
