PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Smallburgh, situate in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich, for the patronage of the benefice of the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham, situate in the said county of Norfolk and in the said

diocese of Norwich, and the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Catfield, also situate in the said county of Norfolk and in the said diocese of Norwich.

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Smallburgh is vested in the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his Bishoprick.

“ And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice (being a vicarage) of the remaining three parts of Felmingham aforesaid is vested in the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his said Bishoprick.

“ And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham and one undivided moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Catfield are vested for an estate in fee simple, free from incumbrances in Charles Maurice Jickling, of Smallburgh, in the said county of Norfolk, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army.

“ And whereas the remaining moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Catfield is vested in the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his said Bishoprick.

“ And whereas the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and the said Charles Maurice Jickling
