ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND NOVEMBER 1911.)

PARASITIC MANGE ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange in a horse, ass or mule.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from horses, asses and mules not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the area wherein the horse, ass or mule so affected or suspected is, who shall forthwith give information of the receipt of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) In the administrative county of London (including the city of London) the notice may be given to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) An Inspector of the Local Authority who receives information of the existence or supposed existence of parasitic mango shall forthwith report the fact to the Local Authority.

Notification of Disease by Veterinary Surgeons.

3. The Animals (Notification of Disease) Order of 1910 shall be read and have effect as if parasitic mange were included in the list of diseases to which that Order applies, and as if notice of the existence or suspected existence of parasitic mange were required by that Order to be given by a Veterinary Surgeon or Veterinary Practitioner to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article.

Detention and Treatment of Animals.

5.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass or mule which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—

(i.) The horse, ass or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention or to a knacker's yard; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority or a Veterinary Surgeon or Veterinary Practitioner employed by the owner of the animal to examine it;

(ii.) No other horse, ass or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority or a Veterinary Surgeon or Veterinary Practitioner employed by the owner of the animal to examine it;

(iii.) No horse, ass or mule shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray out of the stable, shed, field or other premises.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) Where a Notice refers to two or more diseased animals the Notice may subsequently be altered so as to refer to one or more of such animals only.

(4.) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send a copy of any Notice served under this Article to the Local Authority and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.

Cleansing and Disinfection.

6.—(1.) Any place in which a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange has been kept shall, if and when so required by an Inspector of the Local Authority, be cleansed and disinfected by, and at the expense of, the occupier of such place as follows:—

(a) The place shall be swept out, and the sweepings shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with horses, asses or mules; and

(b) The floor of the place and all other parts thereof with which such horse, ass or

mule has come in contact shall be thoroughly washed, or scrubbed, or scoured with water; then

(c) The same parts of the place shall, so far as is practicable, be disinfected in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Article.

(d) In the case of a field or other place which is not capable of being so cleansed and disinfected, it shall be sufficient if such field or place be cleansed and disinfected as far as practicable and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) Every utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, clothing, or other thing used for or about a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange shall, as soon as practicable after being so used, and before being used for any other horse, ass or mule, be cleansed by being thoroughly washed, or scrubbed, or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Article, and such cleansing and disinfection shall be carried out by, and at the expense of, the owner of the thing.

(3.) Every place or thing, or part thereof, required by this Article to be disinfected shall be thoroughly coated or washed with—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), followed by a thorough sprinkling with lime-wash; or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid, followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash.

(4.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, clothing, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with this Order, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, clothing, or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily from such person the expenses thereby incurred.

(5.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provision of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the occupier of the place, and the owner of the thing, to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose:

Prohibition to expose or move Animals affected with Parasitic Mange.

7.—(1.) It shall not be lawful for any person—

(i.) to expose a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange in a market, fair, sale-yard, or other public or private place where such animals are commonly exposed for sale;

(ii.) to place a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange in a lair or other place adjacent to or connected with a market, fair,

or sale-yard, or where such animals are commonly placed before exposure for sale;

(iii.) to send or carry, or cause to be sent or carried, a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange on a railway, canal, river, or inland navigation, or in a coasting vessel;

(iv.) to carry, lead, or drive, or cause to be carried, led, or driven, a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange on a highway or thoroughfare, except with the written authority of an Inspector of a Local Authority;

(v.) to place or keep a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange on common or uninclosed land, or in a field or place insufficiently fenced, or in a field adjoining a highway unless that field is so fenced or situate that any horse, ass or mule therein cannot in any manner come in contact with any horse, ass or mule passing along that highway or grazing on the sides thereof;

(vi.) to graze a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange on pasture being on the sides of a highway; or

(vii.) being the owner or person in charge of a horse, ass or mule affected with parasitic mange, to allow it to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof, or on common or uninclosed land, or in a field or place insufficiently fenced.

(2.) Where a horse, ass or mule is exposed or otherwise dealt with in contravention of this Article, an Inspector of the Local Authority or other officer appointed by them in that behalf may seize it and remove it, or cause it to be removed, to some convenient and isolated place, to be there isolated and treated by the Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of this Order; or, on the application of the owner or person in charge of the animal, the Inspector or officer may authorise its removal with a view to its detention and treatment, and the removal of the animal by or under the authority of the Inspector or officer shall not constitute a contravention of this Article.

(3.) The Local Authority may recover the expenses of the execution by them or by their Inspector or other officer of the provisions of this Article from the owner of the horse, ass or mule seized.

Weekly Returns as to Disease.

8. When, as the result of the veterinary inquiry prescribed by Article 4 of this Order, parasitic mange is found to exist, the Local Authority of the District shall cause a return thereof to be made forthwith to the Board, on a form provided by the Board, with all particulars therein required, and shall continue so to cause a return thereof to be made on the Saturday of every week until all the diseased animals have been accounted for as killed, died or recovered.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

9. Horses, asses and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of

the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

10. Nothing in this Order applies to horses, asses or mules which are the property of the Crown, or are in stables of military barracks or camps and under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or to horses, asses or mules in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a horse, ass or mule is moved in contravention of the restrictions imposed by any Notice under this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, without lawful authority or excuse, proof whereof shall lie on him,—

(i.) does anything in contravention of this Order; or

(ii.) where required by this Order to keep an animal separate as far as practicable, or to give notice of disease with all practicable speed, fails to do so; or

(iii.) fails to do anything which by this Order he is required to do;

he shall, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

12. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

13.—(1.) Any Order of the Board relating to parasitic mange of horses, asses or mules, in force at the date of commencement of this Order, shall thereupon be revoked, and any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any such revoked Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall affect the

operation of a Notice served under any Order hereby revoked, or the power to withdraw such Notice.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the PARASITIC MANGE ORDER OF 1911.

Extent.

14. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this twenty-second day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve.

3. No horse, ass or mule shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray out of the premises specified in this Notice.

NORTH KILLINGHOLME PIER.

(Construction of Pier or Jetty in the River Humber; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Deviation; Tolls, &c.; Power to Dredge; Management of Pier; Piermaster, Officers, &c.; Bye-laws; Agreements with the Admiralty, Board of Trade, and Humber Conservancy Board; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts; Others Powers and Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act for all or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Yorkshire Transport Company, Limited, a Company proposed to be registered under that name, under the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, or a Company to be incorporated by the intended Act, either alone or jointly with the Yorkshire Boring Company, Limited (hereinafter collectively called and included in the expression "the Company"), to make and maintain in the Parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, and on the foreshore and bed of the River Humber adjoining thereto, the pier and works hereinafter described, or part thereof, with all necessary and convenient sidings, roads, approaches, landing places, steps, slips, embankments, cranes, hoists, lifts, pontoons,

A pier or jetty wholly situated in the parish of North Killingholme, in the rural district of Glanford Brigg, commencing at a point on high-water mark 390 yards or thereabouts, measured in a north-westerly direction from the outer end of the jetty at North Killingholme Haven, in the occupation of Messrs. G. and T. Earle Limited, and 380 yards or thereabouts, measured in a northerly direction from the north-west corner of the New Inn, adjoining the said Haven, extending thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 317 yards or thereabouts, and thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 200 yards or thereabouts, so as to form an L shaped pier-head, and terminating at a point distant 753 yards or thereabouts measured in a north by easterly direction from the north-west corner of the said New Inn, and 680 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-by-westerly direction from the said jetty at North Killingholme Haven.

To empower the Company to demand, take and recover tolls, rates, dues and charges upon vessels and persons using the proposed pier and upon animals, goods, merchandise and things shipped, unshipped or transhipped at the proposed pier, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates, dues and charges.

5. To authorize the Company to reclaim, raise or alter the level of any lands acquired by the Company below high water mark, and to dredge, deepen, scour, cleanse, alter and improve the bed, shores and channel of the River Humber on the site of or adjoining or near to the proposed pier, and for the purpose of obtaining, preserving or improving the access thereto, and to use, appropriate, sell and dispose of any materials so dredged, and to purchase, hire, provide and maintain all necessary dredging and other machines, engines, tug boats, barges, hoppers, craft, machinery and appliances necessary or expedient for or in relation to the said purposes or any of them.

6. To make provision for the management, use, regulation and protection of the proposed pier, the regulation and control of vessels resorting thereto, and the lying of vessels in, along, at or near to the proposed pier, and for appointing and dismissing and regulating the powers and duties of pier-master, meters, weighers and other officers, and to prescribe and define the limits within which such provision shall be in force and the powers of such pier-master and other officers shall be exercised.

7. To authorize the Company to make, alter and rescind bye-laws for the management, use and protection of the proposed pier and for the regulation and control of persons, vessels, animals, vehicles and goods of every description using and resorting to or brought to the same, and for any other purposes of the intended Act, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach of any such bye-laws.

8. To exempt the Company from the provisions of section 33 of the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, and any other provisions relating to the user of piers by the public.

9. To empower the Company to lease for such period and on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the intended Act the whole or any part of the Undertaking, and the tolls, rates, dues and charges authorized to be levied and recovered in respect thereof.

10. To authorize the Company on the one hand and the Admiralty, the Board of Trade and the Humber Conservancy Board or any of them on the other hand, to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements for and in relation to all or any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer on the Company and such bodies all necessary powers for that purpose.

11. The intended Act will vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would interfere with its objects, and incorporate, with or without variation and modifications, all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, the Companies Clauses Act, 1863, the Lands Clauses Acts, the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, and any Acts amending those Acts, and it will so far as may be necessary or expedient for the purposes thereof repeal, alter and amend the provisions of the Humber Conservancy Acts, 1852 to 1907 (particularly section 9 of the Humber Conservancy Act, 1899, and section 6 of the Humber Conservancy Act, 1905), and of any other Acts which may be affected by or interfere with the objects of the intended Act.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December next for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") by the Porthcawl Improvements Syndicate Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Promoters"), pursuant to the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, and the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, Amendment Act, and any other Acts enabling them in that behalf for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say):—

(Provisional Order.)

(Construction of Tramways in Borough of Portsmouth; Gauge; Power to Corporation to Work Tramways; Use of Electrical or other Mechanical Power and Works in connection therewith; Tolls, Rates and Charges; Borrowing of Money; and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth (hereinafter called "the Cor-

Tramway No. 2.—Commencing in Goldsmith-avenue by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 11 yards or thereabouts west of the western side of Milton-road, thence passing into and along Eastney-road to and terminating in Highland-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 30 yards or thereabouts west of the west side of Cromwell-road.

Tramway No. 2 will be a double line

throughout, except at the following places, where it will be interlacing line and single line respectively, viz. :—

In Eastney-road—

(a) Interlacing line between a point 42 yards or thereabouts south of the southern side of Bransbury-road and a point 3 yards or thereabouts south of the northern side of Reginald-road.

In Highland-road—

(b) Single line between a point 8 yards or thereabouts west of the west side of Cromwell-road and the termination of the tramway.

Tramway No. 3.—Commencing in St. Helen's-parade by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 162 yards or thereabouts south of the southern side of Granada-road, thence passing into and along Festing-road to and terminating in Highland-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 19 yards or thereabouts west of the western side of Festing-road.

Tramway No. 3 will be a double line throughout, except at the following places, where it will be single line and interlacing line respectively, viz. :—

In St. Helen's-parade—

(a) Single line between the commencement of the tramway and a point 122 yards or thereabouts south of the south side of Granada-road.

In Festing-road—

(b) Interlacing line between a point 65 yards or thereabouts north of the north side of Eastern-parade, and a point 5 yards or thereabouts south of the south side of South-road.

(c) Interlacing line between a point 15 yards or thereabouts north of the north side of South-road and a point 3 yards or thereabouts north of the south side of Festing-grove.

(d) Interlacing line between points respectively 100 yards and 145 yards or thereabouts north of the north side of Festing-grove.

Tramway No. 3a (double line).—Commencing in Festing-road by a junction with Tramway No. 3 in that road at a point 18 yards or thereabouts south of the southern side of Highland-road, and terminating in Highland-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 18 yards or thereabouts east of the eastern side of Festing-road.

At the following places it is proposed to lay the tramways so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches shall intervene between the outside of the footpath on the side of the roads or streets herein-after mentioned and the nearest rail of the tramway :—

Tramway No. 1—

(a) In Commercial-road on the west side between points respectively 62 feet and 97 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Rudmore-road.

(b) In Twyford-avenue, on the east side between a point 120 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Rudmore-road and a point 12 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Mills-road.

(c) In Twyford-avenue on the east side from St. Marks-road to Knox-road.

(d) In Twyford-avenue on the east side

between a point 62 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Newcomen-road and a point 73 feet or thereabouts south of the northern side of Wilson-road.

(e) In Twyford-avenue on the east side between points respectively opposite Gruneisen-road and 83 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Gruneisen-road.

(f) In Twyford-avenue on the east side between points respectively 110 feet or thereabouts south of and opposite the southern side of Tipnor-lane.

(g) In Northern-parade on the northern side between a point opposite the northern side of North End-grove and the termination of the tramway.

Tramway No. 2—

(a) In Eastney-road on the east side between points respectively 198 feet and 80 feet or thereabouts north of the northern side of Dunbar-road.

(b) In Eastney-road on the east side between Glasgow-road and a point 90 feet or thereabouts south of the southern side thereof.

(c) In Eastney-road on the east side between points respectively 22 feet and 107 feet or thereabouts south of the southern side of Bransbury-road.

(Construction of Tramways; Gauge; Motive Power; Power to Corporation to Work any Tramways belonging to them, and to Levy Tolls, Rates and Charges; Borrowing of Money; Further Provisions as to Existing Tramways; Repeal, Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of West Hartlepool (hereinafter called "the Corporation") intend to apply to the Board of Trade, on or before the 23rd day of December, 1911, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order"), to be con-

firmed by Parliament for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Corporation to construct and maintain in the borough and parish of West Hartlepool, in the county of Durham, the tramways hereinafter described, with all necessary and proper rails, plates, sleepers, channels, junctions, turntables, turnouts, crossings, passing-places, engines, motors, carriages, carriage houses, sheds, buildings, works and conveniences connected therewith respectively, namely:—

Tramway No. 1, commencing in Church-street by a junction with the existing tramway in that street at a point 0.75 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from a point in that street opposite the west side of Lynn-street, thence proceeding into and along Lynn-street and Nelson-street, and terminating in Nelson-street at a point opposite the junction of the north side of Nelson-street with the west side of Mainsforth-terrace.

Tramway No. 1 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In Lynn-street from a point opposite the south side of John-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

Tramway No. 2 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In Musgrave-street from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 2.73 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(a) In Elwick-road from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 2.73 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(b) In Elwick-road from a point 0.4 chain or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from a point opposite the east side of Lansdowne-road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

Tramway No. 5 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In Elwick-road from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 4·14 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction.

(b) In Elwick-road from a point 2·75 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Elwick-road and Waldon-street for a distance of 1·86 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction.

Tramway No. 6, commencing in York-road by a junction with the intended Tramway No. 3 at a point 0·75 chain or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of York-road and Park-road, thence proceeding along York-road in a northerly direction to and terminating in Victoria-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 1 chain east of the intersection of the centre lines of York-road and Victoria-road.

Tramway No. 6 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In York-road from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 2·93 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction.

(b) In York-road from a point 0·65 chain or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of York-road and South-road for a distance

of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction.

Tramway No. 7 (double line throughout), commencing in Victoria-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 0·5 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the west side of Stockton-street, thence proceeding in an easterly direction along Upper Church-street and the south side of Church-square to and terminating in Church-street by a junction with the existing tramway in that street at a point opposite the east side of Scarborough-street.

Tramway No. 7A (double line throughout), commencing in Stockton-street by a junction with the existing tramway in that street at a point 1·35 chains or thereabouts south of the intersection of the centre lines of Stockton-street and Victoria-road, thence proceeding into and terminating in Upper Church-street by a junction with the intended Tramway No. 7 at a point 1·15 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Upper Church-street and Stockton-street.

Tramway No. 7B, commencing in Clarence-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 1·2 chains or thereabouts south of the intersection of the centre lines of Clarence-road and Middleton-road, thence proceeding into and terminating in Middleton-road at a point 1·1 chains or thereabouts west of the intersection of the centre lines of Clarence-road and Middleton-road.

Tramway No. 8, commencing in Middleton-road at a point 0·8 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the west side of Clarence-road by a junction with the intended Tramway No. 7B, thence proceeding along Middleton-road, Hart-lane, Serpentine-road and Wooler-road to and terminating in Grange-road by a junction with the existing tramway in that road at a point 0·75 chain or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and Grange-road.

Tramway No. 8 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In Middleton-road from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(b) In Middleton-road from a point 0·75 chain or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Middleton-road and Dale-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(c) In Hart-lane from a point 0·5 chain or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-lane and Hopps-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(d) In Hart-lane from a point 0·5 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-lane and Duke-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(e) From a point in Hart-lane 1·2 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direc-

tion from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-lane and Tunstall-avenue to a point in Serpentine-road 3.15 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-westerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Serpentine-road and Thornhill-gardens.

(f) In Wooler-road from a point 1 chain or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and North-drive, for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

(g) In Wooler-road from a point 2.8 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and Elm-grove for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

Tramway No. 9, commencing in Hart-lane by a junction with the intended Tramway No. 8 at a point 0.5 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-lane and Hart-road, thence proceeding into and along Hart-road and terminating in that road by a junction with the intended Tramway No. 7 at a point opposite the south-west corner of the police station.

Tramway No. 9 will be laid as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified, where it will be laid as a double line:—

(a) In Hart-road from a point 0.6 chain or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Hart-lane for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction.

(b) In Hart-road from a point 3.80 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Young-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction.

(c) From a point in Hart-road 1.36 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Middleton Grange-lane to the point of termination of the tramway in Upper Church-street.

In the following instances the tramways will be so laid that, for a distance of 30 feet or upwards, a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the foot-path on the sides of the streets or roads hereinafter mentioned and the nearest rail of the tramway:—

Tramway No. 1.—

(a) In Lynn-street on both sides from the south side of John-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

(b) In Lynn-street on both sides from the south side of Surtees-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

(c) In Lynn-street on the westerly side from a point opposite the intersection of the centre lines of Lynn-street and Lambton-street to the north side of Musgrave-street, and on the easterly side from the south side of Lambton-street to the north side of Musgrave-street.

(d) In Lynn-street on the westerly side from the south side of Musgrave-street to a

point 1.7 chains or thereabouts south of the south side of Musgrave-street.

(e) In Lynn-street on the easterly side from the south side of Musgrave-street to a point 0.4 chain or thereabouts south of the south side of Catherine-street.

(f) In Lynn-street on both sides from a point 0.75 chain or thereabouts south of the south side of Dundas-street to a point 0.5 chain or thereabouts south of the south side of Garibaldi-street.

(g) In Nelson-street on both sides for the whole length of that street.

Tramway No. 1A.—

In Lynn-street on the westerly side and in Musgrave-street on the northerly side for the whole length of the tramway.

Tramway No. 2.—

(a) In Musgrave-street on both sides— from the junction of the north side of Musgrave-street with the westerly side of Lynn-street for a distance of 2.6 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(b) In Musgrave-street on both sides from a point 0.5 chain or thereabouts measured in a easterly direction from the east side of Tower-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(c) In Musgrave-street on both sides from a point 2.2 chains or thereabouts east of the easterly side of Stockton-street to the easterly side of Stockton-street.

Tramway No. 3A.—

On the westerly side of York-road and the northerly side of Elwick-road for the whole distance of the tramway.

Tramway No. 4.—

(a) In Elwick-road on both sides from the junction of that road with York-road to a point 0.6 chain or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the west side of Caroline-street.

(b) In Elwick-road on both sides from a point .35 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the east side of Lansdowne-road to a point 2 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the west side of Lansdowne-road.

(c) In Elwick-road on both sides from the west side of Burn Valley-road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(d) In Elwick-road on both sides from a point 7 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction from the west side of Eldon-grove for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(e) In Elwick-road on both sides from a point 7.1 chains or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Elwick-road and Queensberry-avenue for a distance of 3 chains measured in a north-westerly direction.

(f) In Elwick-road and Wooler-road on both sides from a point in Elwick-road 2.2 chains or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Elwick-road and Park-road to a point in Wooler-road 1.75 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of

the centre lines of Wooler-road and The Grove.

(g) In Wooler-road on both sides from a point 8.4 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and The Grove for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction.

Tramway No. 5.—

In Elwick-road on both sides from the east side of York-road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction.

Tramway No. 6.—

(a) In York-road on both sides from the north side of Park-road to the south side of Roker-street.

(b) In York-road on the west side from the north side of South-road for a distance of 1.7 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction.

(c) In York-road on the east side from a point 0.45 chain or thereabouts south of the south side of South-road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction.

Tramway No. 8.—

(a) In Middleton-road on both sides from the commencement of the tramway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(b) In Middleton-road on both sides from a point 0.75 chain or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Middleton-road and Dale-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a westerly direction.

(c) In Hart-lane on both sides from the west side of Hopps-street to the east side of Blake-street.

(d) In Hart-lane on the north side from the west side of Jesmond-road to the east side of Park-square.

(e) In Hart-lane on the south side from a point 0.3 chain west of the west side of Duke-street to the east side of Weldeck-road.

(f) In Hart-lane on the north side from a point opposite the east side of Weldeck-road to a point 3 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the east side of Thornhill-gardens.

(g) In Serpentine-road, on the southerly side from a point 2.0 chains west of the west side of Tunstall-avenue for a distance of 5.5 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-westerly direction.

(h) In Serpentine-road on the north-westerly side from the south-west of Thornhill-gardens for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-westerly direction.

(i) In Wooler-road on both sides from a point 1 chain or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and North-drive for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

(j) In Wooler-road on both sides from a point 2.8 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Wooler-road and Elm-grove for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction.

Tramway No. 9.—

(a) In Hart-road on both sides from a

point 0.6 chain or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Hart-lane for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction.

(b) In Hart-road, on both sides, from a point 3.80 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Young-street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction.

(c) In Hart-road, on the north-easterly side, from a point 1.36 chains or thereabouts measured in a south-easterly direction from the intersection of the centre lines of Hart-road and Middleton Grange-lane to the south-easterly corner of Clarence-road.

(d) In Hart-road, on the south-westerly side, from the southern side of Lucan-street to the north-westerly side of Victoria-road.

Where in any of the foregoing descriptions a point is described as opposite a side of a street it shall be taken (unless otherwise stated) to be opposite the line of the buildings or, if there is a forecourt wall or railing, the line of the forecourt wall or railing, on the side referred to of the street.

2. The intended tramways are proposed to be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches or such other gauge as may be determined, and it is not intended to run thereon carriages and trucks adapted to run on railways.

3. To empower the Corporation for all or any of the purposes of the Order to stop, break up, alter, remove and interfere with, temporarily or permanently, public and private streets, roads, highways, tramways, bridges, rivers, streams, watercourses, footways, sewers, drains, gas and water mains, electric lighting mains or boxes, pipes, tubes, and telegraph, telephone and other apparatus.

4. To empower the Corporation to make from time to time such crossings, passing places, sidings, loops, junctions, and other works in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient for the working of the tramways or for forming junctions or communications with the tramways or light railways of any other authority, company or person; to take up and remove from time to time any of the tramways or any part thereof, and to relay the same in such part of the road as the Corporation think fit; to lay down double in lieu of single or interlacing lines, and single in lieu of double or interlacing lines, or interlacing lines in lieu of double or single lines, and from time to time when, by reason of the execution of any work in or the alteration of any road in which any tramway is or shall be laid, it is necessary or expedient so to do, to alter, remove, or discontinue all or any of such tramway, and to make and lay down in the same or any adjacent road a substituted tramway or substituted tramways.

5. To provide that so much of Section 34 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as limits the extent of any carriages used on any tramway beyond the outer edge of the wheels of such carriages, shall not apply to carriages used on the said intended tramways.

6. To empower the Corporation from time to time to work any tramways for the time being belonging to them by animal power, and by any mechanical power (including in that

expression electric and any other motive power not being animal power), and partly by one power and partly by another, and for that purpose to erect, place, make, and maintain works, engines, machinery, dynamos and apparatus for the production, storage and supply of electricity or other power, and to lay down, erect, construct and maintain above, upon and below the surface of the ground, and to attach to houses and buildings, mains, wires, pipes, conductors, cables, ropes, posts, brackets, boxes, apparatus and things necessary or proper for the transmission of electricity or other power, and the working of the tramways, or any of them, by electricity or other power.

7. To empower the Corporation to work any tramways for the time being belonging to them, and to place and run carriages thereon, and to demand and take tolls in respect of the use of such carriages.

8. To authorize the Corporation or other the person or persons working the said tramways to levy tolls, rates and charges for the use thereof, by carriages passing along the same, and the conveyance of passengers, goods, minerals, animals, merchandise and other traffic upon the same, to alter existing tolls, rates and charges, and to confer exemptions from tolls, rates and charges.

9. To empower the Corporation and any other corporation, authority, company or person to enter into and fulfil contracts or agreements with reference to the construction, maintenance, running over user leasing sale or purchase of or interchange of traffic upon the tramways of the Corporation or of such other corporation, company, or person, and to confirm any such contract or agreement which may be entered into prior to the confirmation of the Order.

10. To enable the Corporation for all or any of the purposes of the intended tramways and works to appropriate any lands already belonging to them, to acquire or appropriate lands and houses, and to take easements over lands and houses, and to erect and hold offices, waiting-rooms, buildings and other conveniences on any such lands.

11. To empower the Corporation to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Order, to charge the moneys so raised or borrowed, and the interest thereon, on the borough fund and borough rate of the borough, and on the properties and revenues of the Corporation, and to empower the Corporation to apply any of their funds to any of the purposes of the Order.

12. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights and privileges.

13. To incorporate with the Order, with or without amendments, all or some of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Lands Clauses Acts.

14. To extend and apply to the proposed tramways all or some of the provisions of the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1883, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1883, the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1884, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1884, the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1888, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1888, the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1895,

and the Hartlepool Electric Tramways Order, 1895, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1895, the West Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1898, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1898, the West Hartlepool Light Railways Order, 1897, and the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Deviation, &c.) Order, 1901, and any other Act or Order relating to the existing tramways or light railways in the borough, or to repeal all or any part of such Orders or Acts, and to apply to such existing tramways or light railways all or some of the provisions of the Order.
