WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Northumberland) Order, 1911.

Dated 27th November, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Northumberland, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Northumberland) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Northumberland for all birds (except the Black-headed Gull) specially protected by the schedule to the Act of 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, so as to be

(a) Between the last day of February and the first day of September in each year for the Dotterel; Guillemot (Marrot, Murres, Scout or Willock), Gull (except the Black-headed Gull and the Black-backed Gull), Oyster Catcher, Puffin (Coulterneb, Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Tern (Sea Swallow); and

(b) Between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year for the American Quail (Colin), Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Curlew (Whaup), Dunlin (Ox-bird, Ploverpage, Purre, Sea Lark), Eider Duck, Fulmar, Gannet (Solan Goose), Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Loon (Diver), Mallard, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Owl, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Pochard (Dunbird), Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodpecker:

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-

tection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Northumberland:—

Eider Duck, Owl (all species), Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

The Gull protected on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull (all species) on Sundays and on Christmas Day and Good Friday is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Northumberland:—

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Northumberland:—

Cuckoo, Curlew, Dotterel (all species), Eider Duck, Sheld Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Guillemot, Gull (except Black-backed Gull and Black-headed Gull), Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Mallard, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Golden Plover, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Raven, Razorbill, Redshank, Sandpiper, Snipe (all species), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow (all-species), Woodcock, Woodpecker, Wren (all species).

Repeal of Former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 17th November, 1906, is hereby repealed.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Leeds Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1909, swine may be moved from any premises to which that Order applies to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition either to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse or back to the premises whence

they were moved to the exhibition. The swine must be accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Leeds and subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) The swine shall, except while being moved by railway, be conveyed in a float, cart, or van, and by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not exposed at the exhibition.
- (ii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
- (iii.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughter-house shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (iv.) The licence may be in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and if it authorises movement to premises outside the city of Leeds, a copy of it shall be sent by the Inspector grant-

ing it to the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate.
