#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Middlesex) Order, 1911.

Dated 5th December, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex, I hereby make the following Order:—

# Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Middlesex) Order, 1911."

#### Birds.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Middlesex so as to be between the last day of January and the 1st day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Middlesex to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species

were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Middlesex:—Blackheaded Bunting, Corn Bunting, Yellow Bunting (or Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Great White Egret, Little Egret, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Common Heron, Night Heron, Purple Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl, Redstart, Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker (or Yaffle), Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

# All Birds Protected on Sundays in Certain Parishes.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in the following parishes in the Administrative County of Middlesex:—Acton, Ashford, Bedfont, Old Brentford, Chiswick, Cowley, Cranford, West Drayton, Ealing, Edgware, Edmonton, Enfield, Feltham, Finchley, Friern Barnet, Greenford, Hampton, Hampton Wick, Hanwell, Hanworth, Harefield, Harlington, Harmondsworth, Harrow-on-the-Hill, Harrow Weald, Hayes, Hendon, Heston, Hillington East, Hillington West, Hornsey, Ickenham, Isleworth, Kingsbury, Laleham, Littleton, Northolt, Norwood, Perivale, Pinner, Ruislip, Southgate, South Shepperton, Staines, Great Stanmore, Little Stanmore, Stanwell, Sunbury, Teddington, Tottenham, Twickenham, Twyford Abbey, Uxbridge, Wealdstone, Wembley, Willesden, Wood Green, Yiewsley.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Middlesex:—Blackheaded Bunting, Corn Bunting, Yellow Bunting (or Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiff-

chaff, Coot, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl, Redstart, Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker (or Yaffle), Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of two Despatches, dated the 25th and 27th November respectively, from His Majesty's Consul-General at Trieste, transmitting the following translations of two Circulars, dated the 16th September and the 7th November, issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting arrivals from Italy and Turkey:—

- (1) With a view of preventing the introduction of cholera, by a Decree dated September the 6th, 1911, the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance (B.L.T.V. 182 and 183), have prohibited the importation and transit of the following goods from the Italian provinces of Avellino, Alexandria, Caltrinsetta, Campobusso, Catania, Genoa, Leghorn, Messina and Trapani (the ports of these provinces included), and from Turkey in Europe:—
- 1. Soiled body linen and worn clothing (personal effects), old bedding (used bed feathers).

Should these articles be sent as passengers' luggage or owing to change of domicile, they are subjected on crossing the frontier to the special sanitary restrictions in force.

- 2. Rags.—The following are excepted from this prohibition:—
  - (a) Rags that are sent as goods pressed in iron-hooped bales.
  - (b) New waste from spinning, weaving, cloth, bleaching, artificial wool, shoddy, and paper waste.

The transit of goods and articles mentioned under numbers 1 and 2 is allowed, provided that they be packed in such a manner as to exclude all possible handling during transit. Disinfection will take place for articles considered infected by the sanitary authority.

This ordinance enters into force from the date on which this Circular is issued.

(2) In continuation of the Circular dated September the 16th, 1911, No. 23902, it is hereby made known that by ordinance of October the 23rd, 1911, of the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance (B.L.T. No. 207), with a view of preventing the introduction of cholera the importation and transit of the following articles from the Italian provinces of Aquila, Bari, Bergamo, Chieti, Cosenza, Foggia, Girgenti, Lecce, Massa, Pesaro, Roma, Rovigo, Siracusa, Venezia (the ports of these provinces

included) are prohibited and respectively limited:—

1. Soiled body linen, old and worn clothing (personal effects), old bedding (used bed feathers).

If these articles are forwarded as travelling luggage or in consequence of change of domicile, on crossing the frontier they are subject to the special sanitary prescriptions in force.

- 2. Rags.—The following are excluded from that prohibition:—
  - (a) Rags sent as goods pressed in iron-hooped bales for trade.
  - (b) New waste from spinning, weaving, cloth, bleaching, artificial wool, shoddy, and new paper waste.

The transit of the goods and articles mentioned under numbers 1 and 2 is allowed, provided that they be packed in such a manner as to exclude all possible handling during the voyage. Disinfection will take place for those articles considered by the sanitary authority as infected.

This ordinance enters into force from the date on which this Circular is issued.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), we, the Mersey Power Company Limited, Colonial House, Water Street, Liverpool, Public Electrical Supply Company, hereby give you notice that we propose to carry out the works described below at Weston in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy:

To lay cables in the bed of the River Wesver between Weston Marsh Lock and Frodsham Bridge, in the line shown on the site plan, for the purpose of conveying Electrical Energy from the Weston Point Power Station of the company to the districts of Frodsham and Helsby.

Three cables are proposed in all—two power cables, and one telephone cable. The cables will be paper insulated lead sheathed and

double wire armoured.

They will be laid on the bed of the river, and allowed to sink until a solid foundation is reached.

No interference with the tidal waters is anticipated.

It is proposed to commence the work on or after 15th January next.

SOMERSET AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare or drove within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled. District where they are moved through such district by railway from a place outside such district to another place outside such district without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such district.

#### Local Authority to Enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

3. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. This Order may be cited as the Somerser AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) Order of 1911.
