COUNTY POLICE ACT, 1839.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this notice, to make the following rules:—

County Constabulary Reserve Force.

- 1. The rules made by the Right Hon. H. C. E. Childers on the 12th April, 1886, for County Constabulary shall not apply to such constables as may be appointed to act only on special occasions as a reserve for the ordinary force.
- 2. A constable appointed for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned must be of good health and character, and fitted to perform the duties of the office. He shall be attested in the same manner as other members of the force.
- 3. He may be paid a yearly retaining fee or allowance of such an amount as may be

fixed by the Standing Joint Committee, and in addition a special allowance to be fixed by the Standing Joint Committee not less than 5s. for every day on which he performs police duty. The special day allowance may be fixed so as to vary according as his services are required for the prevention or suppression of rioting or other serious disturbance of the peace, or for less exacting duties.

4. He shall, after enrolment, be subject to the instructions of the Superintendent of the Division in which he is resident or such other officer as the Chief Constable may direct, and shall notify to him any change of residence. If the Standing Joint Committee or the Chief Constable so directs, his appointment and the payment of the retaining fee may be conditional on his residing at a specified place or

within a specified area.

5. When called out for active duty or for parade he may be supplied with the uniform and accoutrements usually issued to other constables, and shall in any case wear an armlet or other badge to show that he belongs to the Constabulary.

If he is in receipt of a pension under the Police Act, 1890, the pension shall not be suspended in whole or in part under section 13 of the Act upon his appointment as a member

of the Police Reserve.

7. All reasonable expenses incurred by him when called out for parade or for police duty shall be repaid to him on the same scale as to other members of the force.

8. Nothing in these rules shall prevent a constable appointed as hereinbefore mentioned from engaging in any employment for hire or gain except when he is called out for active



Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house situate in the borough of Royal Leamington Spa, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that borough, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the

Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there

detained until they are slaughtered.

(5.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any troat, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any prémises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Royal Leamington Spa, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. A licence under this Order authorising movement of swine to any premises shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against

the Act of 1894.

- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the person using the same for such purpose, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:
- "Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and eleven.

SOMERSET AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The Somerset and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Division of Scheduled District into Two Zones.

- 2.—(1.) The Schedule District described in the Schedule to the principal Order (herein-after referred to as "the Scheduled District") shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the two Zones described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I and Zone II) to which the following provisions of this Order shall apply; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise—
 - (i.) movement of animals into or out of the area comprising the parishes of Tintinhull, Ash, Stoke-sub-Hamdon, and Martock, or along, over, or across any highway or thoroughfare or drove therein; or
 - (ii.) movement of animals out of the Scheduled District except where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

(3.) For the purposes of this Order, animals shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone or into or out of the area comprising the parishes hereinbefore specified in any case where they are moved through such Zone or any of such parishes by railway from a place outside such Zone or any of such parishes to another place outside such Zone or any of such parishes without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Zone or any of such parishes, as the case may be.

Movement by Railway into Scheduled District for Immediate Slaughter.

3. An animal may be moved by railway from outside the Scheduled District to a railway station in such District not being situate in the area comprising the parishes of Tintinhull, Ash, Stoke-sub-Hamdon, and Martock, and thence to the nearest available slaughter-house situate in such District, if the animal, while being moved from the railway station to the slaughter-house, is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

Movement into Zones I and II or within Zone II for Immediate Slaughter.

- 4. An animal may also be moved from premises situate either outside the Scheduled District or within Zone II to a slaughter-house situate in Zone II, or from premises situate in Zone II to a slaughter-house in Zone I, subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i.) The animal shall be accompanied during the movement in the Scheduled District by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Order.

(ii.) The animal shall before the movement in the Scheduled District is commenced be marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow A about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Restriction on Issue of Movement Licences.

- 5. A Movement Licence under the preceding Articles shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement
 - (i.) is necessary or expedient; and

(ii.) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare or drove within the area comprising the parishes of Tintinhull, Ash, Stoke-sub-Hamdon, and Martock.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

6. Where the movement authorised under this Order is from outside the Scheduled District, the licence shall, except as herein otherwise expressly provided, be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate. In every other case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate.

Prohibition of Markets, etc., of Animals in Scheduled District.

7. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises situate in the Scheduled District.

General Provisions as to Licences.

8.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(2.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(3.) A copy of a licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the place of destination specified in the licence in any case in which that place is situate in another District.

(4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

General Provisions as to Movement.

9. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the slaughter-house specified in the Licence, where they shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

10. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or

which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-and-

mouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

11. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than foot-and-mouth disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

12.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

Offences.

13.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

14. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases

of Animals Act, 1894.
"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats,

and swine. "Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and eleven.

An animal may be moved from premises in Zone I., not being situate in the area comprising the parishes of Tintinhull, Ash, Stoke-sub-Hamdon, and Martock, to a slaughter-house in such Zone (not being in any of the aforesaid parishes), subject to the conditions as to licences, marking and movement set forth in Article 4 of the Somerset and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Crder of 1911 (No. 2).

Movement within Zone II.

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority, where he considers the movement to be necessary or expedient, may by Licence authorise the movement of an animal from

premises situate in Zone II. to other premises in the same Zone, and the animal may be

moved accordingly.

(2.) The movement authorised by a Licence under this Article may be movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, and in any such case the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence." 
