BY THE COUNSELLORS OF STATE. A PROCLAMATION

Directing that certain Gold and Silver Coins of the United States of America shall cease to be Legal Tender in the Colony of the Bahamas.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas by a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the third day of February, 1898, certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied with the modifications specified in the Proclamation to His Majesty's Colony of the Bahamas:

And whereas it is provided by the said Proclamation that any coins coined in a foreign country which, at the date of the promulgation of the said Proclamation, were by law current and a legal tender in any Colony or Possession to which the said Proclamation extended should, until by Proclamation otherwise directed, continue to be so current and a legal tender at the same rate and up to the same amount as heretofore:

And whereas under the provisions so applied His Majesty may by Proclamation regulate any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within the present prerogative of the Crown which are not provided for by the Coinage Act, 1870, and may revoke or alter any Proclamation previously made:

And whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the nineteenth day of August, 1853, it was provided that throughout the whole of His Majesty's West India Colonies certain gold coins of the United States mentioned in the Proclamation should circulate and be received in payment as being of the full value and equi-

valent to current money of the United Kingdom at the rates mentioned in the Proclamation:

And whereas by a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the ninth day of March, 1854, it was provided that the pro-. visions of the said Proclamation dated the nineteenth day of August, 1853, should extend to certain other gold coins of the United States not specified in that Proclamation:

And whereas by a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the first day of March, 1864, it was provided that certain silver coins of the United States should circulate and be received in payment as being of the full value and equivalent to current money of the United Kingdom at the rates mentioned in the Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the said gold and silver coins of the United States mentioned in the said recited Proclamations of the nineteenth day of August, 1853, the ninth day of March, 1854, and the first day of March, 1864, should no longer be legal tender in His

Majesty's Colony of the Bahamas; NOW THEREFORE We, the said Prince Arthur of Connaught, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and Lord President of the Council. being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said gold and silver coins of the United States shall, as from the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve, cease to be current or legal tender in His Majesty's Colony of the Bahamas.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission, dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirtyfirst and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the second day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Englishcombe, in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath

and Wells.
"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Englishcombe is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Honourable Harcourt, Baron Derwent, (hereinafter called 'the said Lord Derwent').

"And whereas the said Lord Derwent is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Englishcombe now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Bath and Wells.

" And whereas the Right Reverend George Wyndham now Bishop of Bath and Wells, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has executed this scheme as hereinafter men-

" And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Englishcombe which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in

the parish of Englishcombe.
"Now therefore with the consent of the said Lord Derwent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Englishcombe, now vested in him the said Lord; Derwent as aforesaid, shall be transferred to: the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised, by the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

'And whereas the said scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, do hereby, by and with the advice of, His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the said scheme, and do order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts, and do further direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells.

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, Barnacre, situate within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Garstang, in the county of Lancaster and in the discesse of Manchester:

and in the diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, and of the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, both in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such

new parishes and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, and of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Barnacre, situate as aforesaid.

"New, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, as such Bishop, and also as the patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, and with the consent of the Reverend John Wilson Pedder, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, as the patron (in right of his vicarage) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, and also as the patron (in his private capacity) of the said vicarage of the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and

sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, and of the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints, Barnacre, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Barnacre.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Barnacre, comprising: -All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Garstang, of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, and of the parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Peter, Scorton, in the said county and diocese, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Preston and Lancaster Line of the London and North Western Railway across the road leading from Crossey Gate to Gubberford Bridge, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing at Ray Lane the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, from the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town) for a distance of two miles and eleven chains or thereabouts to the centre of Calder Bridge, which carries the said line of railway across the River Calder, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the middle of the River Calder (thereby crossing at Sandholme Mill Bridge boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Helen, Garstang, otherwise Church Town, from the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale), for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footbridge which carries the footpath connecting Butt Hill Lane and Sullom Side Lane across the Sandholme Mill Race, and extending thence first northward to the middle of the said footbridge, and then first north-ward, then westward, then north-westward, then north-eastward, and then again northwestward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets Sullom Side Lane, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of Sullom Side Lane for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction

with Strickens Lane, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Strickens Lane for a distance of one mile and forty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction opposite Moor House with the roadway leading past Carter Houses and the eastern side of Burns Farm House, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of sixty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eidsforth Lane, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Calder Vale, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along such boundary for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter, Scorton, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Garstang, and extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Higher Lane and the middle of the road leading from Crossey Gate to Gubberford Bridge) for a distance of one mile and thirtythree chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Preston and Lancaster Line of the London and North Western Railway across the last mentioned road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for the Home Depart-ment proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make Orders under the Factory and Workshop Act,

(1) applying the provisions of section 116 (relating to particulars of work or wages to be given to piece workers), with modifications, to factories and workshops in which the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, and any work incidental thereto, is carried on, and to out-workers employed in such processes, and the occupiers and contractors by whom they are employed. This Order re-enacts the existing Order of the 15th November, 1909, so far as regards the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, with (a) such modifications as are necessary to extend the Order to out-workers employed on work (e.g., wrapping) incidental to the manufacture of chocolates or sweets, and (b) certain other modifications in paragraphs (1) (a) and 3 of the Order;

(2) applying the provisions of section 107 (relating to lists of out-workers), section 108 (relating to employment in unwholesome premises), and section 110 (relating to the prohibition of home work in places where there is infectious disease) to the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, and any work inci-

dental thereto.
