FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make Orders under the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901:

(1) applying the provisions of section 116 (relating to particulars of work or wages to be given to piece workers), with modifications, to factories and workshops in which the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, and any work incidental thereto, is carried on, and to out-workers employed in such processes, and the occupiers and contractors by whom they are employed. This Order re-enacts the existing Order of the 15th November, 1909, so far as regards the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, with (a) such modifications as are necessary to extend the Order to out-workers employed on work (e.g., wrapping) incidental to the manufacture of chocolates or sweets, and (b) certain other modifications in paragraphs (1) (a) and 3 of the Order;

(2) applying the provisions of section 107 (relating to lists of out-workers), section 108 (relating to employment in unwholesome premises), and section 110 (relating to the prohibition of home work in places where there is infectious disease) to the manufacture of chocolates or sweetmeats, and any work incidental thereto.
