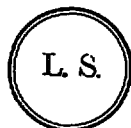

*Gloucestershire.*—An Area comprising the parishes of Frocester, Leonard Stanley, King’s Stanley, Rodborough Thrupp, Chalford, Bisley-with-Lypiat, Stroud (includ-

ing its detached part), Uplands, Whiteshill, Pitchcombe, Randwick, Cainscross, Stonehouse, and Eastington, in the administrative county of Gloucester (26 September, 1911).

*Huntingdonshire.*—An Area in the administrative county of Huntingdon, comprising the petty sessional divisions of Hurstingstone (except the parishes of Abbots Ripton and Kings Ripton, but including the borough of St. Ives) and Ramsey (except its detached part) (11 December, 1911).

*Isle of Ely.*—An Area in the administrative county of the Isle of Ely, comprising the petty sessional division of Ely (excepting the parishes of Witcham—including its detached part—Witcham Gravel, Wentworth, Grunty Fen, Thetford, Strettham, Wilburton, Haddenham, Sutton, and Mepal) (24 October, 1911).

*Kent.*—An Area in the administrative county of Kent comprising the petty sessional division of Faversham (excluding its detached parts, but including the detached part of the petty sessional division of Sittingbourne wholly surrounded by the petty sessional division of Faversham), and the borough of Faversham (21 December, 1911).

*Lincolnshire, Parts of Holland.*—An Area in the administrative county of the Parts of Holland Division of Lincolnshire comprising
