PRIFYSGOL CYMRU. UNIVERSITY OF WALES.

Amended Regulations for the Appointment of Representatives on the University Court by Head Teachers of Public Intermediate and Elementary Schools.

HEREAS by Royal Charter dated the 30th day of November, 1893, constituting the University of Wales, it is provided that the University Court shall comprise (amongst other persons)-

Three persons appointed by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate Schools in Wales and the county of Monmouth (which county is in the said Charter, and hereafter in these presents included in the term "Wales"), all of which said three persons so appointed shall be Head Teachers of, and one at least of whom shall be a Head Mistress of, one of such Public Intermediate Schools, and

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Three persons appointed by the Head Teachers of the Public Elementary Schools in Wales, all of which said three persons so appointed shall be Head Teachers of, and one at least of whom shall be a Head Mistress of, one of such Public Elementary Schools;

And it is further provided that the mode and manner in which the appointment of members of the Court by the Head Teachers of Public Schools in Wales shall be made, shall be as from time to time determined by the Lord President of the Privy Council by writing under his hand.

And whereas the Lord President of the Privy Council, in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in him by virtue of the said Royal Charter, did on the 19th day of February, 1894, make certain Regulations for the appointment of representatives on the University Court of the said University by Head Teachers of Public Schools in Wales.

And whereas Clause 2 of the said Regulations was amended in one particular on the 26th day of October, 1896.

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Regulations so amended as aforesaid and to substitute other Regulations in their place:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of the said Charter, I do hereby revoke the said Regulations made on the 19th day of February, 1894, and amended on the 26th day of October, 1896, and do order that the following Regulations be substituted in their place:

- 1. For the purpose of the appointment of members of the Court by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate Schools and of Public Elementary Schools respectively, an election shall from time to time be held in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.
- 2. Every candidate for election as a member of the Court must be nominated in writing for election by not less than three persons entitled to vote at the election, and no person shall be nominated for election unless his assent to be so nominated has been previously obtained. No person shall nominate for election more persons than there are members to be appointed.

Nomination papers shall be obtainable from the University Registry, and shall be in the form marked A in the Appendix to these Regulations, or to the like effect.

- .. 3. Every Head Teacher of a Public Intermediate School or of a Public Elementary School, as the case may be, shall be entitled at any election to vote for as many candidates as there are members to be appointed..
- 4. The returning officer twelve weeks before the expiration of the term of office of the persons appointed in pursuance of an election to be members of the Court, and in the case of the occurrence of any casual vacancy arising from the death or resignation of any person so appointed, as soon as conveniently may be after the occurrence of the vacancy, shall cause a notice to be published stating that an election is about to be held, and specifying the day on or before which, and the manner in which candidates for election must be nominated. The notice shall be published in two or more newspapers circulating in Wales, and shall be in the form marked B in the Appendix to these Regulations or to the like effect.

Provided that, in the case of a casual vacancy through death or resignation occurring within six months before the expiration of the term of office of the persons appointed in pursuance of any such election to be members of the Court, an election shall not be held to fill such vacancy except on a requisition in writing addressed to the returning officer and signed in the case of the Intermediate Schools by not less than ten, and in the case of the Elementary Schools by not less than fifty, of the teachers entitled to vote at the election.

- 5. If the number of duly qualified candidates duly nominated does not exceed the number of persons to be appointed members of the Court, the persons so nominated shall be deemed to have been duly appointed as members of the Court.
- 6. If the number of duly qualified candidates duly nominated exceeds the number of persons to be appointed members of the Court, the returning officer shall, within fifteen days after the last day for the return of nomination papers, and at least seven days before the day on or before which it is declared in the voting paper that voting papers must be returned, cause a voting paper to be forwarded by post or otherwise to each person entitled to vote at the election, but the election shall not be rendered void by reason of the omission of the returning officer to cause a voting paper to be forwarded in any particular case or cases, and any person entitled to vote who has not received a voting paper may, on application to the returning officer, obtain from him a voting paper.
- 7. Every voting paper shall be in the form marked C in the Appendix to these Regulations, or to the like effect, and shall contain the names of all the duly qualified candidates who have been duly nominated for election, and the names of the schools and the departments of which they are respectively Head Teachers.

A voter desiring to vote shall do so by putting a mark against the name or names of one or more of the candidates named in the voting

paper (not exceeding the number to be appointed) and shall sign the voting paper and append to his signature the name of the school, and the department thereof, of which he is Head Teacher, and shall return the voting paper by post or otherwise to the returning officer at such place and by such time as shall be stated thereon. The votes shall not be given except upon the voting papers provided by the returning officer, and every voting paper in respect of which any requirement of these Regulations has not been complied with, or which is not received at the appointed place on or before the appointed day, shall be invalid.

- 8. The returning officer, immediately after the day on or before which voting papers are required to be returned, shall cause the validity of the votes to be ascertained in such manner as he may think necessary, and shall cause such of the votes as are found to be valid, and to have been duly returned, to be counted, and the number of such votes given for each person to be ascertained. The decision of the returning officer on any question touching the validity of a voting paper or vote shall be final.
- 9. In any case where the number of duly qualified candidates duly nominated has exceeded the number of persons to be appointed as members of the Court, the candidate or candidates to the number to be elected who has or have received the greatest number of votes shall be deemed to be appointed by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate or Elementary Schools (as the case may be) to be a member or members of the Court, and shall be so certified in writing to the Court by the returning officer; but for the purposes of this Regulation, a person whose appointment would cause a contravention of the requirement that one at least of the persons representing the Head Teachers of those schools must be a Head Mistress of one of them, shall not be deemed to have been a candidate at the election.
- 10. If by reason of an equal number of votes being given to two or more persons the question arises which of them is to be certified as a member of the Court, the returning officer shall settle the question by lot, and the person certified by him shall be deemed to be duly appointed by the Head Teachers entitled to vote at the election.
- 11. The returning officer shall forthwith give notice of their appointment to all persons deemed to have been appointed members of the Court under these Regulations.
- 12. A person appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office only till the date on which the term of office of the person in whose place he is appointed would have expired, and the appointment of a person appointed to fill the place of a person retiring on the expiration of his term of office shall be deemed to date from that expiration.
- 13. The returning officer shall be the Chancellor of the University or any person appointed by the Court in lieu of the Chancellor.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND JANUARY 1912.)

SOMERSET AND DORSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911. (No. 6.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

#### Modification of Existing Orders.

1. The Somerset and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911, and the Somer-

set and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 (No. 2), (No. 3), (No. 4), and (No. 5), all of which Orders are hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are hereby modified in manner hereinafter appear-

#### Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone III.

2. The provisions of the existing Orders which relate to the Zone III described in the Schedule to the Somerset and Dorset (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 4) shall cease to operate, and the scheduled district shall comprise only the Zones I and II described in the Schedule to that Order.

#### Movement into or Within Zone II.

3. The restrictions imposed by the existing Orders on the movement of animals shall cease to apply to the movement of animals to premises in Zone II from any premises in that Zone or from any premises outside the scheduled district.

#### Holding of Markets and Sales in Zone II.

- 4. (1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter, and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this
- (2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order, and examine the animals exposed thereat.

#### Movement Within Zone I or to Slaughterhouses in Zone II.

- 5. (1.) An Inspector of Authority, where he considers the movement to be necessary or expedient, may by licence authorise the movement of an animal from premises in Zone I to other premises in the same Zone, and the animal may be moved accordingly: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be construed as authorising movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place.
- (2.) The movement authorised by a licence under the preceding paragraph of this Article may be movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, and in any such case the licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence." Such a licence shall be retained by the person to whom it is granted, and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, by a notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then
- (3.) An animal may be moved from premises in Zone I (not forming nart of a foot-andmouth disease infected place) to a slaughter-house in Zone II, subject to the conditions as regards licences, marking and movement, set forth in Article 4 of the Somerset and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 2), and any animal so moved to a slaughter-

house shall be there detained until it is slaughtered.

#### Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of January, nineteen hundred and twelve.

#### Short Title and Construction.

7. This Order may be cited as the Somerset and Dorset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 6), and shall be read with the existing Orders.
