ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

METROPOLITAN ASYLUM DISTRICT.

Reception of Mentally Defective Persons.

To the Board of Management of the Metropolitan Asylum District;

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions comprised within the said District;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 15th day of May, 1867, the Poor Law Board ordered that certain Unions and Parishes therein mentioned should be combined into a district, to be termed the Metropolitan Asylum District (hereinafter referred to as "the District"), for the reception and relief of certain classes of poor persons chargeable to some union or parish within the district, and that a Board of Management (hereinafter referred to as "the

Metropolitan Asylum Managers") should be constituted for the district;

And whereas by an Order dated the 2nd day of April, 1897 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1897"), We, the Local Government Board, directed that the poor persons chargeable to some union or parish in the district for whose reception and relief the district should be deemed to be formed should include among other classes of poor persons so chargeable a class described in paragraph (d) of the Order of 1897 as consisting of children who, by reason of defect of intellect or physical infirmity, cannot properly be trained in association with children in ordinary schools;

And whereas it is expedient that the classes of poor persons chargeable to some union or parish in the district for whose reception and relief the district should be deemed to be formed should include the class of poor persons hereinafter mentioned, and that the Order of 1897, to the extent hereinafter mentioned, should be rescinded:

Provided that any such poor person, on admission into an asylum belonging to the Metropolitan Asylum Managers, shall not exceed twenty-one years of age.

Article II.—So much of the Order of 1897 as relates to persons of defective intellect is hereby rescinded.

Article III.—This Order may be cited as the Metropolitan Asylums (Mentally Defective Persons) Order, 1911.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

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Authorised Scale of Charges for Notices and Advertisements.

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
