HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission, dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required.

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His

late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following (that is to say):—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate in the parish of Ilkeston, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston,

situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Ilkeston, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District

Chapelry of Saint John, Ilkeston.'
"And with the like consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical .Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Charles Mollan Williams, Člerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Ilkeston, shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint John, Ilkeston, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Charles Mollan Williams, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, Ilkeston, being:—All that part of the parish of Ilkeston, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell, which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Trowell, in the county of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Southwell, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west, and upon the south, by an imaginary line com-mencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Trowell from the said parish of Ilkeston at a point in the middle of the River Erewash due east of the centre of the bridge which crosses the Erewash Canal at the southern end of Soughclose Lock, and extending from the said point in a straight line due west for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the centre of the said bridge, and extending thence first westward along the middle of such bridge and then first westward and then northwestward along the middle of Green's Lane for a distance in all of twenty-six chains and a half

or thereabouts to the junction of Green's Lane with Park Road, and extending thence first north-westward, and then south-westward along the middle of Park Road for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Nottingham Road on the eastern side of White Lion Square, and extending thence westward across White Lion Square for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the junction of Derby Road with Stanton Road, and extending thence generally southward along the middle of Stanton Road for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Little Hallam Lane, and extending thence first eastward and then northeastward along the middle of Little Hallam Lane for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading into Corporation Road near its junction with Thurman Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Corporation Road, and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Corporation Road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hadley Street, and extending thence south-eastward first along the middle of Hadley Street and then in a straight line in continuation thereof (thereby crossing the Erewash Canal) for a distance in all of sixteen chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Erewash, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Ilkeston from the said parish of Trowell."

And whereas the said representation has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the Authority of the said

Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the said representation, and do order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts, and do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission, dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required.

And whereas by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service.

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto.

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain regulations were made by Order in Council, dated the 23rd of June, 1904, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Dover.

And whereas it appears expedient to repeal the said Order in Council and regulations, and to substitute therefor this Order and the regulations and rules contained in the First and Second Schedules hereto respectively.

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, do hereby, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, and so far as regards the Rules contained in the Second Schedule hereto, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

# PRELIMINARY.

- 1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.
- 2. On this Order taking effect the said Order of the 23rd June, 1904, shall cease to operate, and in lieu of the regulations thereby made the regulations and rules set forth in the First and Second Schedules to this Order are hereby made and shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Dover.
- 3. In this Order, and in the Schedules hereto, unless the context shall otherwise re-

quire, the terms "vessel" and "master" shall have the same meaning as in the said Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, and the term "the Dockyard Port" shall mean the Dockyard Port of Dover as described in paragraph 4 hereof.

#### DESCRIPTION OF LIMITS.

4. For the purposes of the said Act and of this Order and of the Schedules hereto the terms "Dockyard Port of Dover," "Admiralty Harbour" and "Commercial Harbour" shall be defined as follows:—

#### Dockyard Port of Dover.

The term "Dockyard Port of Dover" shall mean all the waters, bays and creeks so far as the tide flows lying between the lines drawn as follows:—

On the east a line drawn south true through a point on the shore at high-water mark situated 400 yards N. 57° E. true, from the root of the Eastern Arm.

On the west a line drawn south true through a point on the shore at high-water mark situated 400 yards S. 77° W. true, from the root of the Admiralty pier.

On the south a line drawn east and west, true, through a point situated 870 yards S., true, from the flagstaff in Archeliffe Fort.

# Admiralty Harbour.

The term "Admiralty Harbour" shall mean that portion of the Dockyard Port which is enclosed by the Eastern Arm, Detached Mole and Prince of Wales' Pier, and by lines joining their extremities.

#### Commercial Harbour.

The term "Commercial Harbour" shall mean that portion of the Dockyard Port which is enclosed by the Admiralty Pier, Admiralty Pier Extension and Prince of Wales' Pier, and by a line joining the extremities of the last two mentioned piers.

#### DELINEATION OF LIMITS.

5. On the chart accompanying this Order are drawn all the limits of the Dockyard Port, the Admiralty Harbour, and the Commercial Harbour respectively.

# PENALTIES.

6. Any infringement of the regulations contained in the First Schedule hereto shall render the person infringing liable to the penalty prescribed in clause 12 of the said Schedule.

#### LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the authority of the Harbour Board for Dover under the Acts of Parliament relating to them.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

# Regulations.

1. The Admiralty Harbour shall, subject to the provisions of Clause 4 of this Schedule, be for the exclusive use of His Majesty's ships, and no merchant or other private vessel shall, without permission from the King's Harbour Master, anchor or lie in it.

- 2. No merchant or other private vessel shall, without licence in writing from the King's Harbour Master, be moored or fastened to any Government moorings, buoys, piles or vessels in the Dockyard Port.
- 3. The berths alongside the Admiralty Pier Extension eastward of the position of the old head of that pier are to be cleared whenever required for His Majesty's Service.
- 4. A fairway will be kept through the Admiralty Harbour for vessels passing between the Eastern Entrance of the Admiralty Harbour and the Commercial Harbour.
- 5. Moorings for His Majesty's ships, mark buoys, and other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations may be placed by the King's Harbour Master in such positions as he may from time to time consider the requirements of His Majesty's Service demand.
- 6. No person shall lay moorings for private vessels in the Dockyard Port without the permission in writing of the King's Harbour Master, and all such moorings shall be in such positions as the King's Harbour Master shall deem fit, and shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.
- 7. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master or other person having the charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Senior Naval Officer, or to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.
- 8. No merchant or other private vessel shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the buoys marking the channels or shoals in the Dockyard Port.
- 9. No vessel other than His Majesty's ships shall use the Eastern Entrance to the Admiralty Harbour between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, without the special authority of the King's Harbour Master.
- 10. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ashes, rubbish, dust, filth of any description, nor refuse from any quarry, mine; or pit, nor any other matters solid or liquid whatsoever shall be unladen, cast or allowed to fall into the waters of the Dockyard Port except in such places as may be appointed by the King's Harbour Master, or upon the banks or any portion of the shore of the said Dockyard Port where the same may be liable to be washed into the waters of the said Dockyard Port by rain, tide or otherwise.
- 11. No vessel shall anchor in the approach to the Eastern or Western Entrance to the Admiralty Harbour in such a position as to obstruct the free passage of any vessel through either of these entrances.
- 12. The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which this Order relates shall observe and cause to be observed the said regulations in this Schedule as far as they relate

to his vessel, and if any master or other person acts in any respect in contravention of any of the said regulations, or fails to observe or to cause the same to be observed, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten pounds.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

#### Rules.

- 1. When any seagoing steamship, steam vessel towing, steam dredger or steam hopper, within the limits of the Dockyard Port (excluding the Commercial Harbour) shall, by reason of the crowded nature of the anchorage or from other cause, find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of a sailing vessel, or of a boat under oars or sail or steam or other mechanical power, she shall signify the same to the sailing vessel or boat by four short blasts of the steam whistle, blown in rapid succession, when the sailing vessel or boat shall keep out of the way of the other vessel; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.
- When one of His Majesty's ships or any other vessel in charge of His Majesty's officers intends to pass in or out of the Admiralty Harbour through the Eastern Entrance, she shall hoist the Union Flag superior to Commercial Flag J (blue white blue horizontal) at the foremast-head, and all other of His Majesty's ships present in the port shall hoist the Pilot Jack superior to Commercial Flag J as a general warning, and the same signal shall also be hoisted on the flagstaff on the Eastern Breakwater for the same purpose: and all other vessels under way in the harbour or in the approach to the Eastern Entrance outside the harbour shall keep out of the way of the said ship flying the Union Flag superior to Commercial Flag J; provided always that the said ship shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.
- 3. Outgoing steamers shall have priority of passage through the Eastern Entrance to the Admiralty Harbour over incoming steamers, and incoming steamers shall not approach the Eastern Entrance to the Admiralty Harbour within a distance of half-a-mile until it shall have been ascertained that no vessel is coming out.
- When one of His Majesty's ships or any other vessel in charge of His Majesty's officers intends to pass in or out of the Admiralty Harbour through the Western Entrance she shall hoist the Union Flag at the fore mast-head, and all other of His Majesty's ships present in the port shall hoist the Pilot Jack as a general warning. The Union Flag shall not, however, be so hoisted when other vessels are using or are about to use the Western Entrance as indicated by signal at the Commercial Harbour Master's flagstaff, except in cases of emergency, when priority of passage shall be given to His Majesty's ships or other vessels in charge of His Majesty's officers. All other vessels, under way in the Harbour or in the approach to the Western Entrance outside the Harbour, shall keep out of the way of the said ship flying the Union Flag; provided always that the said ship shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

5. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port, so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused which, in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master, it is necessary to mark, such vessel or wreck will be indicated by the following marks or lights, exhibited from the wreck itself or from a wreck-marking craft.

By Day:—Three balls on a yard 20 feet above the sea, two placed vertically at one end and one at the other, the single ball being on the side nearer the wreck.

By Night:—Three white fixed lights similarly arranged, but not the ordinary riding lights.

If the obstruction is not considered by the King's Harbour Master of sufficient importance to be marked both by day and night, a green buoy only will be used, with the word "wreck" on it in white letters.

6. The speed of all merchant and private vessels inside the Admiralty Harbour is not to exceed six knots.

Note.—The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which the rules in this Schedule relate must observe and cause to be observed the provisions of these rules as far as they relate to his vessel, and any such master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of a misdemeanour.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF RUGBY SCHOOL having, on the 14th day of December, 1911, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto, repealing Statutes XVIII to XXIV inclusive of the existing Statutes of the said School, and substituting others in their place:

The said Statute has this day been laid before His Majesty in Council, and is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Rugby School on the 14th day of December, 1911.

In place of Statutes XVIII to XXIV inclusive of the School, which are repealed, insert the following:—

# The Scholars.

#### XVIII.

An examination shall be held once a year for the election of Scholars by competition, and shall be conducted by examiners to be named

or approved by the Governing Body in such subjects and in such manner as shall be determined by Regulation.

#### XIX.

All boys, whether already in the School or not, who shall have testimonials of good character, and shall be fully 12 years old on the 1st of January and not more than 15 on the 1st of July in the year in which the examination is held, shall be eligible for Scholarships: provided that one of the Scholarships founded in memory of the late G. C. Benn shall always be held by a Day Boy possessing the qualifications for a Minor Foundationership, if there be any such candidate who, in the opinion of the Headmaster, attains to the requisite standard.

#### XX.

The number of Scholars in the School at one time shall not be less than forty; and after the examination above-mentioned a sufficient number of candidates shall be elected to fill all vacancies that may have occurred, provided always that no candidate shall be elected who does not, in the opinion of the examiners, attain to the required standard.

#### XXI.

The parents or guardians of any Scholar may be required to state the date at which they intend to remove him from the School and shall be bound to adhere to the date so stated; and if such date is not later than the end of the current term, or if a Scholar will, under the Regulations, be compelled to leave the School at the end of the current term, a candidate may be elected to the prospective vacancy: provided that the candidate so elected shall not receive the emoluments of his Scholarship until the vacancy has actually occurred.

# XXII.

No Scholarship shall be of the value of less than £40 a year nor of more than £100 a year; and subject to these limits the values of the Scholarships shall be such as the Governing Body may by Regulation determine. No Scholarship, other than a Benn Scholarship, shall be tenable together with a Foundationership.

# XXIII.

The Governing Body shall apply to the provision of Scholarships the proceeds of all endowments appropriated to that purpose: but all sums over and above those derived from such endowments which may be required for the maintenance of Scholarships shall be provided in such manner as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine.

#### XXIV.

At least twenty of the Scholars in the School at one time shall hold Scholarships awarded for proficiency in Classics. The other Scholarships may be awarded for proficiency in such subjects as the Governing Body may from time to time determine. But no Scholarship shall be awarded to a Candidate who does not, in the opinion of the Examiners, show a sufficient

knowledge of the other subjects studied in the School besides that to which the Scholarship is assigned.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the 10th day of November, 1911, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Lord President of the Council, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of South Weald, in the county of Essex, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in the Civil Parish of South Weald aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that, except as thereinafter provided, burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

South Weald.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Peter, South Weald; and in so much of the Churchyard as is not reserved for the burial of members of the Tower family. Provided that—

- (a) In the vault beneath the said church belonging to the Neave family, burials may be allowed subject to the conditions following, that is to say:—
  - (i) That the interior of the said vault, in preparation for or immediately after any burial therein, shall be thoroughly and effectually ventilated by suitable and sufficient means in direct communication with the external air beyond the walls of the church;
  - (ii) That, as soon as conveniently may be after the deposit of a coffin in the said

- vault, the coffin shall be wholly and permanently enclosed by means of stone flagging properly jointed in cement, or brickwork in cement, and otherwise in such manner as effectually to prevent the escape of any noxious gas from the interior of the enclosure so formed.
- (b) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.
- (c) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
- (d) In the said portion of the churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial-place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
